## Christmas Tree Curbside Collection – Trees are Recycled

Residential Christmas tree curbside collection begins Monday, January 3<sup>rd</sup>. The last collection day will be on Saturday, January 29<sup>th</sup>.

Place tree curbside and not obstructing regular garbage cart collection. Be sure to remove all ornaments and lights.



## One more use for that Christmas tree... It's also a delicious SPICE

The needles can be dried and mixed into a powder that makes a light, citrus-y and very aromatic spice. Sprinkle that powder into cookie dough, add some to rice as you cook it, or even rub it on chicken before roasting. Small spruce branches can also be used to add flavor. The next time you steam spinach or other greens, throw one in at the very last minute to give a light aroma and a lemony feel to the dish. Or, after cooking steak in a pan, flavor the cooking butter with a fistful of spruce needles.

Spruce and fir are useful in many other dishes as well. Fresh fish, salted for a day and covered in fresh needles, absorbs the forest aroma and emerald color into its flesh. Needles work especially well in oils and vinegars.

#### **Spruce Butter**

7 ounces butter

3 ½tablespoons pine needles

Sprig of lemon thyme.

- 1. Mix in a blender for eight minutes until soft and green.
- 2. Pass through a chinois sieve (<u>sieve</u> with an extremely fine mesh)

#### **Spruce Vinegar**

- 3 ½ ounces pine needles
- 3 ½ ounces apple vinegar.
- 1. Briefly mix in blender.
- 2. Place in a sealed container overnight.
- 3. Pass through a chinois sieve.

#### **Spruce Oil**

- 3 ½ ounces pine needles
- 3-4 tablespoons finely chopped parsley
- 1 ¼ cups neutral oil.
- 1. Blanch needles for four minutes, then dry.
- 2. Mix all ingredients in a blender until they reach 160 degrees.
- 3. Pass through a chinois sieve.

## PET'S NEED LICENSES TOO

Broward County law requires both dogs and cats to wear an official Broward County pet license.

"Indoor" animals are not exempt from Broward County's Pet License requirement. Every day, Broward County Animal Care receives "indoor" animals that have slipped out an open door or window, escaped through weak or loose screening and become lost, injured, or even killed by vehicles. The easiest way for you to be reunited with your pet is to ensure he is wearing a Broward County Pet License.



**To acquire a license**: your pet must be at least four months old, and have a current rabies vaccination. Your animal should receive its first rabies vaccination and first pet license at four months of age. After that, licenses and rabies vaccinations must be renewed annually (three year renewal option also available). Animals that have a tattoo or microchip identification are still required to have a Broward County Pet License.

#### Types of Licenses:

- You can purchase either a one-year Broward County Pet License or a three-year Broward County Pet License. You can also purchase either a one-year or threeyear rabies vaccination.
- One-year licenses are valid for one year <u>from the date of the rabies vaccination</u>, and three-year licenses are valid for three years <u>from the date of the rabies</u> vaccination.

### How and Where to get a pet license:

There are several options available:

- Veterinary office
- Pet Supermarkets in Broward County (one-year licenses only)
- Broward County Animal Care locations
- Renewal of licenses is available on-line.



**DOG PARKS** – use of County or City Dog Parks require that all dogs have proof of current rabies vaccination and license.





Note that some veterinarians charge an additional handling fee to cover administrative costs. License fees are used to feed and care for animals at the shelters, and \$2.00 from each license issued is directed to the SPOT (Stop Pet Overpopulation Together) program, which promotes responsible pet ownership through spaying and neutering.
