



BSO OFFERS FREE HOME WATCH PROGRAM

Traveling this summer? The Broward Sheriff's Office offers a **FREE Home Watch Program** in all of its patrol areas in Weston. A deputy, CSA (Community Service Aid) or C.O.P. (Citizens on Patrol) volunteer will check on your home daily for signs of break-in or suspicious activity while you are out of town.

To sign up for this FREE service visit www.sheriff.org/homewatch to download the form. You must provide the dates and times your home will be unoccupied with a contact phone number of a trusted neighbor or local relative. If you have any questions, just contact the Weston BSO district office at 954-389-2010.

When you're away from home for extended periods, be sure to take the following precautions:

- Let trusted friends and neighbors know that you'll be away.
- Make your home appear occupied. Attach timers to lights and television sets and set them to turn on and off at different times.
- Have your newspaper and mail held, or picked up by a friend or neighbor.
- Disconnect automatic garage door openers.
- Open some of the drapes or blinds on your windows. During daytime hours, it gives the appearance that someone is home, and during the evening, lights inside the house are more visible.

- **Have a copy of all student school records, PRIOR** to hurricane season. To accomplish this, go to the Broward County Schools web site at <https://www.browardschools.com/virtualcounselor>

Here you can register as a parent to view and print your child's school records from kindergarten through high school. Keep one copy in a secure location and another copy with you if you evacuate. For private schools, contact the school for record copies.

Many families across Broward County have had to turn to public assistance programs for the first time in their lives. Many local homeless shelters are at capacity and the need is greater than ever.

Christmas In July provides homeless children, from infants to age 19, with a fun-filled day away from homelessness along with new clothing, socks, shoes and underwear. School aged children also received school supplies for the upcoming school year. This is all made possible through the generosity of Broward County residents and County employees.

Collection boxes are located at selected County facilities and at all Broward County Libraries through Friday, July 9.

The Weston Branch Library is located at 4205 Bonaventure Boulevard, hours are Mon. – Wed.: 10am-8pm and Thur. – Sat.: 10am-6pm.

Please remember that **only NEW items** should be donated.

The following is a list of suggested items for donation:

- Pants/slacks/shorts
- Skirts/dresses
- Shirts/blouses
- Shoes and socks
- Undergarments
- Diapers/wipes/baby clothing
- School supplies
- Books

These items can be for a girl or boy ranging in age from infants to 19 years.

The number of children helped by Christmas In July has grown annually. Since its inception in 2002, Christmas In July has served more than 6,000 children in Broward County.

OIL SPILL VOLUNTEER LINE Broward County Lining Up Volunteer Base

In advance of a need for volunteers, should Broward County beaches begin to see contamination by oil from the Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill, the county has initiated pre-registration of volunteers.

You will be asked to leave your name, phone number and email address.

If and when a volunteer response is needed, volunteers will not be in any direct contact with oil-contaminated materials due to health and safety concerns.

Currently there is no oil in our area and there are no advisories or precautions against travel, fishing, diving or water recreation in South Florida, and hopefully it will remain this way. **But as with any disaster, preparedness is key...**

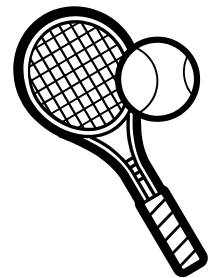


Weston Tennis Center SUMMER CAMP 2010

Weston Tennis Center Summer Camp (ages 5-17) is a day program that covers the entire spectrum of tennis development, from basic instruction to the experienced tournament player wanting to sharpen their skills. Sound strokes, proper movement, and play strategies are covered in a logical progression of instruction and drill.

A Typical Tennis Summer Camp Day:

9:00am-10:30am	On court tennis instruction (drilling)
10:30am-11:00am	Cool down/ Water break
11:00am-12:00pm	On court tennis instruction (drilling)
12:00pm-1:00pm	POOL
1:00-1:30pm	Lunch on the patio
1:30pm-3pm	Games and supervised match play



*The Weston Tennis Center is also offering **after hours care** (3pm-5pm) and **early drop off care** (8:00am-9:00am).*

How are the campers grouped for tennis instruction?

Campers are placed with students of similar age and abilities for all on-court instruction.

What should I bring to camp?

Camp essentials include sport clothing, tennis shoes, a hat, swimsuit, towel, and plenty of waterproof sunscreen. Bring your own water bottle. Don't have a racquet? No problem, loaners are available during your participation in the camp.

What happens if it's raining?

Rain or shine – camp plays on. On rainy days trivia games, hand tennis, video analysis of pro players and movies keep camp goers occupied.
