



2010 PROPERTY TAX BILLS ARE IN THE MAIL

Taxes are Due Beginning November 1st

Broward County Records, Taxes & Treasury Division will have mailed more than 400,000 property tax bills by November 1, 2010. Property taxes must be paid no later than March 31, 2011, to pay without penalty and avoid delinquency, but may be paid as early as November 1, 2010, to take advantage of discounts. A 4 percent discount applies to taxes paid in November; a 3 percent discount applies in December; a 2 percent discount in January; and a 1 percent discount in February.

The Broward County Property Appraiser's Outreach Department will be providing complimentary homestead filing workshops to assist the residents of Weston during this busy time. Monthly outreach workshops at the Weston Regional Park (20200 Saddle Club Road) will occur on the first Monday of each month.

Property owners without mortgages, or those who do not make use of an escrow arrangement, may pay their taxes in a variety of ways:

- Online Electronic Check (no fee): Visit www.broward.org/revenue and click SEARCH/PAY PROPERTY TAXES. Use the search function to locate your property record, and follow instructions for payment by automatic deduction from your bank account (U.S. bank accounts only; no foreign banks). There is no fee for this service. Taxes paid by this method will show as paid immediately.
- Online Credit Card/Debit Card (fee): Visit www.broward.org/revenue and click SEARCH/PAY PROPERTY TAXES. Use the search function to locate your property record, and follow instructions for payment by credit or debit card. There is an additional fee for this service. The Fee Schedule is posted online at www.broward.org/revenue (Resources).






- Electronic Payment from Your Bank: You may use your own bank's bill-paying service; however, note that delays in processing payments between your bank and Broward County, due to the absence of a payment coupon accompanying the payment, could result in the loss of a discount, if payment is made too close to the end of the discount period.
- Mail: Use the envelope enclosed with your tax bill or mail payment to Broward County Tax Collector, P.O. Box 29009, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33302-9009. Do not mail your payment to any other address. Be sure to include the tax coupon with your check, or there may be a delay in processing. Postmark date will be used to determine the applicable discount amount. Checks must be drawn on a U.S. bank and be in U.S. dollars. Should the check not clear for any reason, the tax payment will be canceled and a return check fee will be charged.
- In Person: There are several locations where you can make property tax payments in person.
 At Broward County Records, Taxes & Treasury Division, Tax & License Section, Governmental Center, 115 S. Andrews Ave., Room A-100, Fort Lauderdale, FL, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
 At Broward County Records, Taxes & Treasury Division, Auto Tag Section, 1800 N.W. 66th Ave., Suite 101, Plantation, FL, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. until March 31, cash or check only
 At any one of the 77 Wachovia Bank Branches in Broward County, until March 31, cash or check only. Tax coupon must accompany payment. Maximum of three tax transactions will be permitted at one time.
- Partial Payments: Current taxes may be paid in up to five partial payments. A \$10 processing fee applies to each payment. Each of the first four payments must be a minimum of \$100. No discount is allowed. The final payment must be payment in full and paid by March 31 or the balance due will be subject to penalties and interest.

WHO IS READING YOUR WATER METER? Bermex, Inc., is the contractor for meter reading in Weston

As of October 27, 2010, the contractor for meter reading service is Bermex, Inc. In addition to Weston, Bermex currently provides meter reading services to Fort Lauderdale, Deerfield Beach and Davie. Bermex field personnel are required to carry a photo ID badge and wear a complete uniform.



Water meters are important to a utility for several reasons:

- 1. They make it possible to charge customers in proportion to the amount of water they use.
- 2. They allow the system to demonstrate accountability.
- 3. They are fair for all customers because they record specific usage.
- 4. They encourage customers to conserve water (especially as compared to flat rates).
- 5. They allow a utility system to monitor the volume of finished water it puts out.
- 6. They aid in the detection of leaks and waterline breaks in the distribution system.

Reminder for Daylight Saving Time 2010 - Fall Back November 7

There are only a few days remaining until this fall's time change. On Sunday, November 7, 2010 at 2 a.m., Daylight Saving Time will end and you will need to "turn back time" by one hour. The easiest thing to do is reset all clocks on Saturday night, November 6th before going to bed.

Daylight Saving Time is four weeks longer since 2007, due to the passage of the Energy Policy Act in 2005. The Act extended Daylight Saving Time from the second Sunday of March to the first Sunday of November, with the hope that it would save on oil consumption each day through reduced use of power by businesses during daylight hours.



CHANGE YOUR CLOCK, CHANGE YOUR BATTERIES.

The City of Weston and the Broward Sheriff's Office Department of Fire Rescue urges all residents to also replace the batteries in their smoke detectors and any carbon monoxide detectors during this annual ritual.

This small action, can play a huge role in saving lives and property.

Smoke alarms — when they are in working order — cut the risk of dying in a fire in half. An average of two children in the United States, die each day in house fires, 80 percent of them in homes without <u>working</u> smoke detectors. Run-down or missing batteries are the most common cause of smoke alarm malfunction.

Volunteers are important to parks, especially when it comes to helping our natural areas clear out the garbage and invasive plants that continually plague our environment. From October through May, volunteers ages 13 and up get busy between 9 a.m. and noon, except at Deerfield Island, where the workdays are from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Volunteers are asked to have their own gloves, a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, and drinking water on hand as they tackle the weeds and trash accumulating in different areas of the county.

Volunteers are required to wear closed-toe shoes. Long pants and long sleeves are suggested. All participants must fill out a volunteer registration form prior to participating. **Volunteers ages 13-17** must have parent or guardian signature on the registration form. Proof of Broward County residency, such as a driver's license or current utility bill, is required.

As part of America Recycles Day, eco-friendly events – games, prizes, informational booths and food -- for the entire family will be held. Standard park entry fee of \$1.50 per person will be in effect; free for children age 5 and under.

time will be advertised and posted on the City calendar of events as May approaches.






WESTON MOONLIGHT MOVIES IN THE PARK presents ToothFairy
