


WESTON JOINS THE WORLD OF

Driver Licenses and Identification Cards

Information of Interest

COMING TO SEE US? BRING ALL YOU NEED:

Florida residents wishing to obtain a new driver license or identification card, legally change their name prior to their renewal date, or immediately replace a lost or stolen license or ID card, need to come prepared with the proper documentation.

The time you and others will spend completing a transaction at the first office visit is directly related to providing the required proper documentation. The complete list of acceptable documents is available online at www.GatherGoGet.com.



Here is a summary of the requirements:

- 1) <u>Identification</u> A certified U.S. birth certificate (hospital birth certificates are not accepted); a valid U.S. passport; a consular Report of Birth Abroad; a certificate of Naturalization (Form N-550 or N-570); or a certificate of Citizenship (Form N-560 or N-561).
- 2) Social Security Number Card, W-2 form, paycheck or any 1099 form.
- 3) <u>Residential Address</u> Two (2) items mailed to you that contain your address. Acceptable is a mortgage statement, voter ID card, a utility bill or a car insurance policy.

Anyone who has changed their name must bring marriage certificates, court orders or divorce decrees to connect the name on the primary identification to the name of the customer and the name in which the license or ID card will be issued. - Determine <u>when</u> they will need to visit a driver license or tax collector's office.
- Create a personalized checklist detailing documents they will need.
- Obtain contact information showing where to get required documents.
- Browse a list of driver license offices in their local area.

<u>AN APPOINTMENT SAVES TIME!</u> All customers who must visit to renew, replace, or file a change of address to their driver license or identification card, are urged to secure an appointment prior to their visit. Connect via Internet at http://www.flhsmv.gov/oasis for an appointment to greatly reduce the length of the visit. Also link to the on-line pre-application and complete it before coming to one of our offices.

BSO Fire Rescue Joins Forces with National Fire Protection Association to Promote:

Smoke Alarms: A Sound You Can Live With

The Broward Sheriff Fire Rescue once again has joined forces with the nonprofit National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) to promote this year's theme *Smoke Alarms: A Sound You Can Live With.* This year's campaign focuses on newer smoke alarm recommendations to keep homes fire-safe.

Many homes do not have working smoke alarms, not enough smoke alarms, or alarms that are outdated and should be replaced. Broward Sheriff Fire Marshal Charles Raiken said, "We want our residents to understand that they should have a working smoke alarm in every bedroom, every living area and on every level of a home." They should also be reminded that "if a smoke alarm is more than 10 years old, it needs to be replaced," he said.

Smoke alarms can mean the difference between life and death in a fire. NFPA statistics show that working smoke alarms cut the chance of dying in a fire nearly in half. But they must be working properly to do so. Many homes have smoke alarms that aren't working or maintained properly, usually because of missing, disconnected or dead batteries. Roughly two-thirds of all home fire deaths result from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

SMOKE ALARM TIPS FROM BROWARD SHERIFF FIRE RESCUE AND THE NFPA:

- Test smoke alarms at least once a month using the test button, and make sure everyone in your home knows their sound.
- If an alarm "chirps," warning the battery is low, replace the battery right away.
- Replace all smoke alarms, including alarms that use 10-year batteries and hardwired alarms, when they're 10 years old (or sooner) if they do not respond properly when tested.
- Never remove or disable a smoke alarm.

Reminder: Turn clocks back one hour on the first Sunday in November (November 7th) and replace batteries in smoke alarms at the same time.





Broward County's 365 Food Drive Benefits Harvest Drive for Thanksgiving

As the year comes to an end, there is a real push to provide food for as many people as possible for the holidays.

Between now and November 18, all food collections will benefit the **2010 Harvest Drive**, which is now celebrating 18 years of helping Broward families.

As in the previous 17 years, "Children Helping Children" remains the theme of the Harvest Drive. The children throughout Broward County Schools continue to be the focal point of the activities and most students will be assisting in food collection efforts. More than 90 schools participating have their own method of raising awareness and collecting the non-perishables from this year's needs list.

The Harvest Drive has a Thanksgiving Day goal to provide for 1,500 families, approximately 6,000 individuals, with a complete Thanksgiving dinner plus a week's worth of groceries.

All non-perishable food donations are welcomed with a special emphasis on holiday foods suitable for Thanksgiving meals, such as canned vegetables, canned sweet potatoes, canned gravy, canned cranberries, canned fruit and canned soup.
