Weston Public Works Drainage Technician Chris Cameron witnessed a fatal crash on September 14, 2010, on I-75 near Indian Trace while working at a city pump station. He rushed across the highway, was the first person on the scene and immediately called 9-1-1. Unable to help the driver, he attempted to turn off the ignition of the crashed vehicle by crawling into the passenger side of the vehicle. Chris then began traffic control until emergency vehicles arrived in order to prevent any further accidents.

At the September 27th City Commission meeting, Chris was honored for his heroic response which went far above the call of duty.

Be mindful that during our many downpours, drivers will slow and even stop – so be prepared and drive defensively. Arrive alive.







FIRE PREVENTION MONTH OCTOBER 2010



During the month of October, Weston's BSO Fire Rescue units will be visiting Weston area elementary schools (public and private) to teach children the importance of fire safety education.

This year's campaign includes the theme: When Fire Strikes, Get Out and Stay Out! The educational component is also designed to educate people about the importance of smoke alarms and encourages everyone to take the steps necessary to update and maintain their home smoke alarm protection.

Last year, Fire Rescue visited Weston's elementary schools (public and private) and toured over 1,800 students through fire stations or demonstrations, and held over 60 classroom training events.

BROWARD COUNTY COMMISSION VOTES TO KEEP BUS ROUTE 23


At a public hearing held on Tuesday, September 28, 2010, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners voted to keep Bus Route 23, the only public transportation route provided to the City of Weston, which runs north and south along Weston Road.

A revised service schedule, provided by Broward County Transit, will go into effect on October 31, 2010 whereby Bus Route 23 will now operate under a 60 minute frequency, weekdays only from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. In addition, a minor change to the route will occur in that it will now travel along Dykes Road instead of I-75 (revised map of Bus Route 23 as provided by Broward County Transit is attached on page 2).

The City is currently constructing 14 bus stop shelters along Weston Road (a map showing bus shelter locations is attached on page 3). The shelters are approximately 9 feet by 14 feet in size and are designed to give those waiting for the bus significant protection from South Florida's sun and rain. Each shelter is equipped with a bench, waste receptacle, bicycle rack, and lighting. The shelters are designed to blend in aesthetically with the Weston surroundings while providing a safe environment for riders with visibility through the tempered glass on the rear and sides etched with the Weston "W".





BROWARD COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT ENCOURAGES THE PUBLIC TO TAKE PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLU

The Broward County Department Health Department officials are advising the public to take precautionary measures against influenza (flu). Flu season can begin as early as October and last as late as May. Everyone 6 months and older is encouraged to get vaccinated against the flu.

The flu is a contagious disease, caused by the influenza virus, and spreads to others when infected persons cough, sneeze or talk. Individuals at high risk for flu complications include children, pregnant women, persons age 65 years and over, and persons of any age with chronic medical conditions. It is especially important for these individuals and their caretakers to get vaccinated.

Common symptoms of the flu include: Fever (usually high), headache, extreme tiredness, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea, (much more common among children than adults).

Along with getting vaccinated, these steps are very effective in preventing the spread of influenza:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Do not share eating utensils, drinking glasses, towels or other personal items.
- Stay home when you are sick, keep sick children home and check with a health care provider, as needed.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick, if possible.
- Avoid crowds and areas where people congregate and are likely to be sneezing and coughing.

Wednesday, October 20th; Thursday, October 21st; Friday, October 22nd; and *Saturday, October 23rd

Bulk trash will be picked up <u>only on your regularly scheduled</u> <u>collection day</u> of the dates above.

Bulk trash must be placed curbside by 7 a.m. For residences with dumpster service, place items alongside dumpster. *Indicates pick-up for multi-family units (condominiums & apartment complexes).

Occasionally bulk trash is not collected on its regularly scheduled collection day due to heavy volume, if this occurs it will be collected the following day.
