



WESTON UNIVERSITY CLASS 2011 HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS APPLY NOW!


Each September, juniors, seniors and select sophomores are offered entry into the Weston University program via their high school (Cypress Bay, Sagemont and Western) by submitting an essay entitled "Communities Need Leaders." The field of students is narrowed by school administration and when necessary, the City's Director of Communications to ultimately select the 20-24 students that will comprise Class 2011.

The Weston University Program, initiated by the City of Weston in 2002, is an eight month program for Weston high school students that provides participants with an opportunity to learn about state and local government; in particular, Weston's municipal government. Students spend one school day each month with city staff. Monthly program days are made up of instruction, conversations, observations and hands-on activities exposing them to the numerous City services and functions that are provided to residents.




FDOT Launches Updated I-595 Project Website

The Florida Department of Transportation has launched an updated I-595 Express Corridor Improvements Project website, www.i-595.com. The intent of the new look and layout of the website is to allow the user quicker and easier access to information and project documents. Information about the improvements, upcoming lane closures and recent news stories regarding the project are just a click away from the site's home page.

The I-595 Corridor Roadway Improvements project consists of the reconstruction of the I-595 mainline and all associated improvements to frontage roads and ramps from the I-75/Sawgrass Expressway interchange to the I-595/I-95 interchange, for a total length along I-595 of approximately 10.5 miles, and approximately 2.5 miles on Florida's Turnpike from Peters Road to Griffin Road. The design and construction cost of the project is approximately \$1.2 billion.

The website, www.i-595.com, will be continuously updated with postings of lane closures within the I-595 corridor, on crossroads and along Florida's Turnpike. Upcoming and ongoing construction activities will be addressed and links to related sites, such as I-595 Express, LLC, the concessionaire designing and building the project, will be provided.



FREE RESIDENTIAL BULK TRASH PICK-UP Mark Your Calendar...

Wednesday, October 20th; Thursday, October 21st; Friday, October 22nd; and *Saturday, October 23rd

Bulk trash will be picked up <u>only</u> on your regularly scheduled collection day. Bulk trash must be placed curbside by 7 a.m. For residences with dumpster service, place items alongside dumpster. *Indicates pick-up for multi-family units (condominiums & apartment complexes).

Occasionally bulk trash is not collected on its regularly scheduled collection day due to heavy volume, if this occurs it will be collected the following day.

THINK BEFORE YOU THROW – Consider donating before tossing

Help those in need, keep items out of the waste stream, and get a tax deduction. Several national organizations will even pick-up directly from your residence – you don't even have to wait for bulk pick-up day! There are many local, well-established charitable organizations that readily accept donated items.
