



# FREE RESIDENTIAL BULK TRASH PICK-UP

Wednesday, July 27<sup>th</sup>; Thursday, July 28<sup>th</sup>; Friday, July 29<sup>th</sup>; or \*Saturday, July 30th

Bulk trash will be picked up <u>only</u> on your regularly scheduled collection day. Bulk trash must be placed curbside by 7 a.m. For residences with dumpster service, place items alongside dumpster. \*Indicates pick-up for multi-family units (condominiums & apartment complexes).

Occasionally bulk trash is not collected on its regularly scheduled collection day due to heavy volume, if this occurs it will be collected the following day.

## Bulk items include, but are not limited to:

Furniture / Mattresses / Carpets / Large and Small Appliances: dishwashers, laundry machines, and stoves; and other large household items.

Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.

**NOTE:** Mirrors, glass, glass tabletops, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container to facilitate safe collection. Larger glass items such as table tops, shower doors, windows should be placed separately from the rest of the bulk pickup.

Bulk items **DO NOT** include contractor-generated material, or vegetative waste (landscape materials) or household hazardous waste (HHW).

# VOTE FOR REGIONAL PARK IN WESTON IN THE "AMERICA'S FAVORITE PARK" CONTEST

Weston Parks and Recreation Director, Don Decker, recently registered the Regional Park at Weston in the **Coca-Cola Live Positively "America's Favorite Park" Contest.** America Is Your Park is a program that encourages people of all ages to get active in the park this summer. In the process, people can vote for their favorite national, state or local park to win a recreation grant up to \$100,000 from the Coca-Cola Live Positively initiative.

Winners (established by total number of votes) are eligible for 3 cash grants of \$100,000, \$50,000, and \$25,000. That grant money can be used unconditionally to make improvements within the park.


There are several ways to vote: 1) vote online 2) by "Checking In" via Facebook; 3) by uploading photos of the park; or beginning August 10th, uploading videos of the park. Voting is restricted to people ages 13 and over.

#### THE VOTING HAS BEGUN!

Once the voting ends on September 6, 2011, the votes will be tallied and verified.
 Winning parks will be notified, and the winners will be announced publicly by mid-September.

- You can vote as many times as you'd like on LivePositively.com or you can upload photos and/or video content up to 20 times per day for your favorite park.
- The easiest way to find the park is to type-in Weston, FL in the "Search for a Park" field. The singular red map marker will appear: click on the marker, then VOTE.

Give all clicks a minute as the site is a little slow currently.

#### Paradise Cove Features include:

Crazy Creek is a 410-foot-long tube ride with interactive play elements along a curved route.

Parrot's Point water playground, for ages 5 and under, is a 12-inch-deep pool that includes two waterslides and many interactive play elements.

Sharky's Lagoon water playground, for all ages, is an 18-inch-deep pool that includes three waterslides that are 83 feet, 98 feet, and 125 feet long, and many interactive play elements.

 $H_2$ Whoa! has two 450-foot water slides (must be able to swim and be at least 42 inches tall to ride).





# CELL PHONES HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

Cellular phones can be our best ally during a hurricane. Yet, because wireless calls travel over airwaves to another phone, like radios, they can be obstructed by bad weather. Residents can maximize their wireless service during an emergency situation by being prepared and following a few simple tips.

- Program all of your emergency contact numbers in your cell phone, including the police department, fire station, hospital and family members.
- Make sure everyone who needs your wireless number has it.
- Have a family communications plan in place. Designate someone out of the area as a central contact, and be sure all family members know who to contact if they become separated.
- Keep your wireless phone and back-up batteries charged at all times. Have an alternate plan to recharge your batteries in case of power outages. For example, you can charge with a car charger, or use a disposable cell phone battery.
- Keep extra phones and accessories in a sealed plastic bag to avoid water damage.
- If your cellular phone has a camera, utilize that feature to take and store photos of your property before and after the storm.

In addition to your household phone, make sure your cellular phone is enrolled in **CodeRED**. CodeRED is a system used by the City of Weston that allows you to receive critical in case of an emergency situation that requires immediate action. You can even opt for text message and/or email alerts to be sent straight to your cell phone! # FPL's POWER TRACKER

Online Map Providing Near Real-Time Power Outage Information www.FPLmaps.com

FPL's Power Tracker is an online, interactive map that shows the location of any current power outages across FPL's service territory. Customers can enter a street address, city or ZIP code to view outage and restoration information for their area.

In addition to showing the location of outages, Power Tracker provides detailed restoration

information, including:

- Outage report time
- Estimated time of restoration
- Number of customers affected
- Status of the outage
- Cause of the outage

Power Tracker also includes an FPL Reliability Performance indicator (displaying the percent of customer accounts with power systemwide) and a link that allows customers to report an outage online.

Note: Power Tracker does not track or reflect flickers or brief power interruptions.


#### How do I use the Power Tracker?

- Power Tracker is available at <a href="https://www.FPLmaps.com">www.FPLmaps.com</a>
- To see outage information for a particular area, enter a street address, city or ZIP code in the search box.
  - o Entering an address zooms the map to the neighborhood level.
- Outages are indicated by triangle icons of varying colors, which indicate scale.
- Click on one of the outage icons to open an information box that reveals details about the outage.
- To reset the map, click on the "Start Over" link.

During an outage at your home or place of business, you can access the Power Tracker map via a battery-powered laptop, a smart phone or Internet device (such as an iPhone, Android or iPad), through a friend or from a computer at different location.

## How do I see outages in my area?

Enter your street address to see any outages in your neighborhood or enter your city or ZIP code to see any outages in your area. From any point on the map, you can use the zoom tool to see outages in smaller or larger geographical areas.
