



SEVEN BURGLARY SUSPECTS ARRESTED OVER SEVEN DAY PERIOD

ALERT RESIDENTS HELPING POLICE

- On June 12th an alert neighbor called 9-1-1 and BSO deputies were able to apprehend a burglary suspect in the San Sebastian community who had just burglarized several vehicles. The suspect targeted UNLOCKED vehicles with items of value left inside.
- On June 14th an alert neighbor called BSO and deputies arrested two suspects in the Country Isles community who had just burglarized several vehicles. The suspects targeted UNLOCKED vehicles with items of value left inside.
- And the stories continue just like this, with both unlocked homes and vehicles...

There are two recurring themes in these police notifications:

- 1) Unlocked vehicles containing valuables; and
- 2) Alert neighbors who took the time to call the police.

CHRISTMAS IN JULY 10 YEARS OF HELPING LOCAL HOMELESS CHILDREN



For the past ten years, Broward County and Kiwanis Divisions 23 and 24 have partnered to support **Christmas In July** activities that benefit homeless children living in Broward County. New FPL Solar Energy Rebate Program Opens June 21


- High interest expected in rebates for solar water heating or PV panels -

Beginning June 21, FPL business and residential customers can apply for rebates for new installations of solar water heating or solar photovoltaic (PV) panels. PV panels collect the sun's energy and generate electricity for immediate use in the home or business.

Rebates will be available on a first-come, first-served basis, and the funding cap is likely to be reached very quickly due to growing interest in solar power generation. Approximately 1,100 of FPL's 4.5 million customers currently operate their own solar generation, and FPL operates three of the largest solar power facilities in the United States.

Those interested in the rebates should begin exploring options as soon as possible to ensure they can gather the required information before the application period opens on June 21. Rebates are not available for systems that have already been installed.

Highlights include:

- **Residential Solar Water Heating** The program will provide **\$1,000** per installed solar water heater. A solar water heater can cut a family's water heating costs by up to 85 percent, according to the Florida Solar Energy Center. FPL estimates rebates will be available for about 4,500 customers this year, depending on the size of the systems installed.
- Business Solar Water Heating Business customers will be eligible for a variable rebate based on the size of the system installed. The maximum incentive during the life of the program is \$50,000 per site. Businesses with multiple locations can receive a maximum combined rebate of up to \$150,000 per funding year. FPL estimates rebates will be available for about 50 customers this year, depending on the size of the systems installed.
- **Residential Solar PV** The program will provide an incentive of \$2 per watt based on the direct-current (DC) rating of the solar panels **up to a maximum of \$20,000**. FPL estimates rebates will be available for about 400 customers this year, depending on the size of the systems installed.





• Business Solar PV - The program will provide a variable incentive depending on the DC rating of the solar panels. The rebate will be up to \$50,000 per site during the life of the program and will be calculated as: \$2 per DC watt nameplate rating of the solar panel up to the first 10 kwh; \$1.50 per DC watt nameplate rating of the solar panel from 10 kwh up to 25 kwh and \$1 per DC watt nameplate rating of the solar panel greater than 25 kwh. Businesses with multiple locations can receive a maximum combined rebate of up to \$150,000 per funding year. FPL estimates rebates will be available for about 80 customers this year, depending on the size.

FPL will also connect the customer's solar PV systems to the electric grid through its netmetering program, which allows customers to receive a credit for the electricity they produce but don't use. For more details, visit www.FPL.com/netmetering.

Play Safe This Summer

Each year in the United States approximately 200,000 children require a trip to the emergency room due to a playground injury. With the summer break now in high gear it is important to highlight steps that can be taken to keep children safe. Weston playgrounds are regularly inspected, repaired and refurbished. But, the most effective strategy for keeping children safe is parental supervision.

City of Weston playgrounds are designed for children 2 to 12 years old. Equipment is marked with signage indicating age appropriateness. Children under 2 years old do not have the necessary upper body strength, dexterity and balance to climb safely on equipment or slide down playground slides.

Playground surfacing is an important aspect to playground safety. The poured in place rubberized surfacing found on most playgrounds can get very



hot. Even though the playgrounds are shaded children must wear the appropriate footwear to avoid potentially hot surfaces and to allow for safe footing on the equipment. Also, parents should make sure children have sunscreen to avoid excessive sun/heat exposure in addition to plenty of drinks to avoid dehydration.

ADDITIONAL PRECAUTIONS:

- Bicycle helmets should NOT be worn while on the playground. Wearing them while
 playing could lead to injuries associated with strangulation. In the same vein, proper
 clothing (no hooded clothes, no long necklaces or other jewelry) will help prevent
 injuries.
- Do not allow children to bring skateboards, rollerblades or roller skates on the playground. They are potential trip hazards and can lead to collisions between children.
- Remember this acronym: S.A.F.E.
 - S Supervision
 - A Age Appropriate
 - F Falls...are the most common form of injury. Encourage your children to play on the equipment as it was intended.
 - E Equipment...must be safe. If something doesn't look right please contact the Weston Parks and Recreation Department at 954-389-4321.

No playground can be designed to prevent all injuries. But, taking these steps will help provide a safe and enjoyable summer of playground fun.

REDUCE THE CHANCE OF BICYCLE THEFT AND INCREASE CHANCE OF ITS RETURN

WITH BSO'S BIKE TRACK SYSTEM

The Broward Sheriff's Office has developed the **BikeTrack Registration System** for Broward County Residents to help reduce the number of bicycle thefts in Broward County and to support law enforcement officers in their efforts to recover lost or stolen bicycles.



To register with BikeTrack: Complete and submit the online form at http://sheriff.org/apps/biketrack/register.cfm. Once it's been received by BSO, a deputy will review the information and call you to schedule an appointment to check the bike to verify the serial number and description.

If your bicycle is lost or stolen: Contact BSO to report theft (954) 765-4321 and advise the deputy taking your report that your bicycle is registered with BikeTrack.



Weston has over 46 miles of dedicated bike lanes within our

City, making Weston one of the premier areas in south Florida in which to bike. Bicyclists have the same rights as motorists and as such must obey all vehicular traffic laws. Weston has provided an interconnected system of safe bike lanes, multipurpose paths and shaded sidewalks for pedestrian travel throughout the City.



IS YOUR HEAD IN THE STARS?

The Fox Observatory at Markham Park Opens at Dusk Every Saturday

If you've ever paid more than passing attention to what goes on in the sky after dark, you may be interested in checking out the Fox Observatory in Broward County's Markham Park and the South Florida Amateur Astronomers Association.

This nonprofit organization has been around since 1965 and is dedicated to "bringing the universe closer to all South Floridians."

The SFAAA makes its home at Markham Park, where, every Saturday night at dusk, it opens the park's Fox Observatory to the public for free stargazing until midnight (weather permitting). The park's weekend gate admission of \$1.50 per person (children 5 and under free) will be in effect.



One of South Florida's best-kept secrets is the Fox Observatory at Markham Park located at the intersection of Weston Road and State Road 84 (16001 W. State Rd. 84).



Among the telescopic equipment at the group's disposal are a pair of 16-inch and 14-inch Schmidt-Cassegrains, a Brandon refractor, three



Dobson reflectors, and a 12-inch Newtonian. Both Schmidt-Cassegrains are fitted with imagers that offset the effects of light pollution.

If none of this makes much sense to you, don't worry. Members are there to help you learn about such gear and how it operates. They often even bring along their own 'scopes, so that on a clear night there may be as many as 15 set up in various spots around the observatory.
