#### GENERAL RELEASE AND PROGRAM CONDITIONS

The undersigned Participant and Parent/Guardian understands that the Program may involve physical action as well as contact with other individuals attending the Program; and that certain activities may take place outdoors. The undersigned understands that food or drink may be provided to Participant while attending the Program. The undersigned understands and agrees that Participant may be transported by car, van or bus to off site locations by City or City's contract agents. The undersigned represents that Participant does not have any behavioral or psychological problems or medical or physical limitations, which are not specifically described herein.

The undersigned understands that because of the nature of some activities, there is a potential for accidental injury. The undersigned recognizes these risks and desires that Participant be permitted to participate in the Program, and, as a material inducement to allow Participant's involvement in the Program, the undersigned hereby releases and agrees to hold harmless the City of Weston and its officers, employees, agents, servants, representatives and volunteers (collectively referred to as "City") from and against any and all manner of actions, causes of action, liabilities, controversies, agreements, promises, damages, rights, injuries, judgments, claims and demands of any nature whatsoever at law or in equity, that Participant or the undersigned may have now or in the future, for or by reason of Participant's involvement in the Program, including, without limitation, claims or liabilities associated with Participant's injuries during said Program.

The undersigned voluntarily assumes the risk of any loss, injury or damage to person or property, which in any way arises out of such participation.

The undersigned agrees to save, defend, indemnify and hold City harmless from and against any and all manner of actions, causes of action, liabilities, controversies, agreements, promises, damages, injuries, rights, judgments, claims and demands of any nature whatsoever at law or in equity, that are or may be asserted, entered or claimed against City or any of its constituents, by any person or entity or by reason of the Participant's acts, negligence, willful misconduct or omissions to act, while attending the Program or participating in any activities as part of the Program.

Further, the undersigned **WAIVES ANY CLAIM** against City arising from such participation, including any claim for negligence and does **COVENANT NOT TO SUE** the City or its contract agents relating to such participation. This indemnification and hold harmless shall continue notwithstanding any negligence or comparative negligence on the part of the City relating to such action, damage or claim.

In case of emergency, City is authorized to seek medical treatment and transportation for Participant from such physicians, hospitals and ambulance services as may be chosen by it in its reasonable discretion. The undersigned acknowledges that City has no obligation to seek such treatment or transportation. The undersigned understands that he/she is responsible for furnishing Participant's insurance in case of injury. The undersigned accepts full financial responsibility for payment of any and all such medical services.

The undersigned agrees that this Release Form shall be binding on the undersigned's heirs, successors and assigns. Any provision in this General Release that is prohibited or unenforceable under Florida or Federal law shall be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition without invalidating the remaining provisions hereof.

Put aside items that cannot be placed into the trash or put out for bulk pickup, and bring them to the annual FREE **Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Collection** event and they will be recycled or disposed of properly without harming the environment.



On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>May 15</u>, <u>2011</u>, simply drop off your household hazardous waste and electronics items at the **Weston Public Works Services Center** (2599 South Post Road) from **8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** 

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) refers to used or leftover contents of consumer products that contain chemicals with one of the four characteristics: *Toxic, Ignitable, Corrosive, or Reactive* as defined by the Environmental Protection Agency.



What items are being accepted? Oil and latex paints and thinners, used motor oil, auto fluids and gasoline solvents, pesticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals, drain cleaners, tires, mercury, rechargeable & automobile batteries and electronics such as computers and televisions will be accepted.

### RESIDENTS & BUSINESS OWNERS REMEMBER TO SIGN UP FOR CODERED

Telephone Communication Service for Emergency Notifications

With the start of hurricane season right around the corner (June 1<sup>st</sup>), now is the perfect time to sign up for **CodeRED**.

<u>WHAT IT IS</u>: CodeRED is an ultra high-speed telephone communication service for emergency notifications. This system allows the City to send critical communications, to all or targeted areas within the City, in an emergency situation that requires immediate action.

Capable of dialing the entire City within minutes, **CodeRED** delivers a recorded message from the City Manager's office describing the emergency situation and any instructions for immediate or future action. The calling number will display as **866-419-5000**, and to hear the last message delivered, simply dial the number back. If you opt-in for text message and/or email alerts, those will also be sent.

**ALREADY SIGNED UP?** To opt for the text message and/or email alerts, or to add or change a phone number including cell phones, please **REVISIT** the **CodeRED** registration page and enter your information.

**PRIVACY**: Your contact information remains private and used for critical communications.

THIS SYSTEM WILL ONLY BE USED FOR EMERGENCY AND LIFE SAFETY PURPOSES SUCH AS: Drinking water contamination, extended utility outages, evacuation notice and route, missing person, fires, floods, bomb threat, hostage situation, chemical spill or gas leak, and other incidents where rapid and accurate notification is essential for life safety.





### WESTON STUDENTS RECEIVE EXCEPTIONAL FCAT SCORES

According to the Florida Department of Education, most students in Weston schools scored at or above grade level on the FCAT writing exam - even with tougher grading criteria imposed this year. The exam, which measures proficiency in writing, is given to students in grades 4, 8 and 10. Congratulations to students and teachers!



- At COUNTRY ISLES ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, with 162 students taking the test in grade 4, officials said 90% scored at or above grade level
- At **EAGLE POINT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**, with 184 students taking the test in grade 4, officials said 94% scored at or above grade level
- At **EVERGLADES ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**, with 177 students taking the test in grade 4, officials said 98% scored at or above grade level
- At **GATOR RUN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**, with 222 students taking the test in grade 4, officials said 91% scored at or above grade level
- At IMAGINE CHARTER SCHOOL AT WESTON, with 130 students taking the test in grade 4, officials said 99% scored at or above grade level
- At INDIAN TRACE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, with 107 students taking the test in grade 4, officials said 93% scored at or above grade level
- At **MANATEE BAY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**, with 228 students taking the test in grade 4, officials said 92% scored at or above grade level
- At **FALCON COVE MIDDLE SCHOOL**, with 827 students taking the test in grade 8, officials said 93% scored at or above grade level
- At **TEQUESTA TRACE MIDDLE SCHOOL**, with 565 students taking the test in grade 8, officials said 85% scored at or above grade level
- At CYPRESS BAY HIGH SCHOOL, with 1070 students taking the test in grade 10, officials said 88% scored at or above grade level

PET THERAPY MENTORING PROGRAM, GATOR RUN ELEMENTARY

Congratulations to Bella, a Cavalier King Charles Spaniel therapy dog, and her owner, Jane Nichols, who are among select honorees that will be recognized for their volunteer work benefitting children with varying exceptionalities. The recognition ceremony will spotlight Bella and other members of the community that have dedicated time and effort to expanding educational opportunities for students.

The volunteering Weston duo will be honored along with eight other adult volunteers participating in seven school programs, at the **Broward County Public Schools Community Involvement Awards, Wednesday, May 11, 2011.** The awards program will be held at Parker Playhouse, 707 Northeast 8th St., Fort Lauderdale, from 9 - 11:30 a.m.



In August 2009, Jane Nichols visited Gator Run Elementary School and asked if she could be allowed to volunteer with her therapy dog, a King Charles Cavalier named Bella. Bella is trained and certified as a therapeutic pet and Nichols has obtained the training necessary to offer their combined services to children. This innovative and effective mentoring program utilizes one-on-one mentoring support along with pet therapy and focuses on children in need of language development, confidence building and specialized interventions. The program was implemented last school year with three children of varying needs. The exceptionalities and needs of the children included a child with Down's Syndrome and child diagnosed with Selective Mutism.

### DO YOUR PART DURING AIR QUALITY AWARENESS MONTH

The month of May is Air Quality Awareness Month and the Broward County Air Quality Program is committed to protecting, restoring and enhancing the air quality in Broward County for the health and enjoyment of residents and visitors. Each person has an effect on the air we breathe by making choices about our daily activities. As residents, we have the responsibility for protecting and preserving the air quality throughout the entire year.

The following actions are tips you can do at home, work and on the road to reduce the impacts of climate change and protect our quality of air...

- Use Less Hot Water Wash only full loads in your washing machine and take shorter showers. The water heater is a large user of energy in most homes and 90% of the energy used to wash clothes is from heating the water.
- Adjust Your Thermostat Cool your home at 78 degrees or warmer with the thermostat fan set to "auto". Raise your temperature to 82 degrees or warmer when you're away from home.
- **Unplug Unused Electronics** When electronic devices are turned off but still plugged in, they continue to use energy.
- Inflate Your Tires Keep the tires on your car properly inflated and check the tires monthly.
- Change Your Car's Air Filter Check your car's air filter monthly and change it when needed.
- Use Recycled Paper & Print on Both Sides Be sure to purchase 100% post-consumer recycled paper.
- **Program Copy Machines** Have them enter sleep and shut-down modes after a selected time.
- **Use Power Strips** Plug all electronics into power strips and turn them off each night to save more energy.
