



Deputy Pallotto hosts the Weston University Police Services Academy that gives students, ages 12-16, the opportunity to explore law enforcement services on an in-depth basis with hands-on exercises.

She is also responsible for providing security surveys to homeowners and business owners, attending homeowner association meetings, participating in career days at the 10 public and 5 private schools located in the City of Weston, and much more!



Deputy Pallotto is credited with coordinating the 2010 Relay for Life fundraisers for the Broward Sheriff's Office City of Weston district, organizing the Special Olympics Torch Run for Broward County, and formulating a softball tournament and raffle that raised over \$3,000 benefitting the American Cancer Society.

The Weston FC (Football Club) is a Nike Premier Soccer Program operating as a nonprofit organization, a part of the Weston Sports Alliance, providing competitive programming for the elite travel player between the ages of 8 and 19. The Pre-Academy program trains four days a week at the Weston Regional Park.

This talented team of 18 boys first won the semi-final game on Saturday, May 21 in Auburndale, Florida, a 3-1 decisive victory over rival West Pines United. On Sunday, the Weston FC boys won the championship in a impressive 6-2 score over its state rival FC Sarasota.

The team will now go on to attend the U.S. Youth Soccer Southern Regional Championships on June 16 in Nashville, Tennessee.

The winner of that event will advance to the U.S. Youth Soccer National Championship in late July.



The Pre-Academy program was started in 2009 by Weston FC and trains in preparation of joining the United States Soccer Federation Academy Program.

District-wide Water Conditions

Rainfall in May has been below average in much of the South Florida Water Management District's 16-county region, adding to a rainfall deficit that has grown since October. Persistent rainfall in the upcoming wet season is needed to replenish groundwater, canal and lake levels. Meteorologists have predicted drought conditions will extend into the beginning of the wet season.

Increased Danger of Wildfires

A wildfire, ignited by a lightning strike on April 26th spread across more than 36,000 acres of the heart of Big Cypress National Preserve sending smoke across south Florida.



Smoke from wildfires can cause **dangerous driving conditions**, closing down roadways, and can **aggravate health problems**. Anyone looking for information on current air quality for those with sensitive health concerns cam call 954-519-1260. For notification by email when the Air Quality Index falls into the "moderate" or "unhealthy for sensitive groups" categories should register for EnviroFlash, at www.broward.org/pollutionprevention and click on the "Air Quality" button.

PRECAUTIONS:

- Exercise extreme caution with any outdoor activities that involve sparks. Special care should be taken when grilling or building campfires, and cigarette butts should be disposed of properly.
- Those operating harvesting and mowing equipment should be cautious as sparks from these types of equipment can spark fires with such tinder-dry vegetation and grass.
- Be careful not to park any vehicles over dry vegetation or grass.

Here you can register as a parent to view and print your child's school records from kindergarten through high school.

Keep one copy in a secure location and another copy with you if you evacuate. For private schools, contact the school for record copies.


