Monday - Thursday: 8:00AM - 5:30PM


Friday: 8:00AM - 3:00PM

HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

For many of us, the holiday season is a time of family togetherness, festive decorations, great food, and a time to reflect upon all that we're thankful for. Unfortunately, the holiday season can also be a time of tragedy for many families across the country. There are more residential fires during the holiday season than during any other time of the year, and those fires statistically are more costly and more deadly.

Each year, nearly 50,000 fires occur during the holiday season. These fires claim more than 500 lives, injure over 2,000 people, and cause almost 1 billion dollars in property damage. Some simple precautions can prevent you and your family from becoming a fire casualty statistic this holiday season:

<u>Menorahs</u> - Keep your menorah away from curtains or anything that can burn. Many people display their menorahs on their window sill however this can be dangerous if the window has curtains or blinds. Keeping your menorah on a counter, below a kitchen cabinet can also be dangerous. The heat from the candles can slowly heat the wooden cabinetry, causing ignition.

 Place your menorah on a table or counter, resting on a fire retardant surface, and away from the reach of children and pets.





<u>Christmas Trees</u> - On average, one of every 22 home fires started by Christmas trees result in death. Ideally, you should purchase a flame retardant metallic or artificial tree. If you purchase a real tree, make sure the needles are green and can not be easily broken. Keep your tree stand filled with water at all times.

- Trees should be kept away from any sources of ignition (candles, portable heaters, fireplaces, etc.) and should only be placed in sturdy tree stands designed not to tip over.
- Trees that become dry, or have been up for two weeks, should be discarded.

<u>Holiday Lights</u> - Inspect your holiday lights for frayed wires, bare spots, broken sockets, and excessive kinking or wear. Do not link more than <u>three</u> light strands, unless the manufacturer's directions state it is safe to do so.

- Make sure you periodically check the wires; they should not be warm to the touch.
- Always unplug your holiday lights before leaving home or going to bed.







Candles -

Never use candles to decorate a Christmas tree! Make sure they are in stable holders and placed out of reach from children and pets.

Extinguish decorative candles before you leave the house or go to

bed.

The new line of battery operated "flameless" candles which look real, are a perfect, safe replacement for standard candles and many have built in on/off timers.

Finally, make sure that you have smoke detectors installed on every level of your home, near your kitchen, and by every bedroom. Test them every month and make sure they have fresh batteries.

Smoke detectors save lives!

Taking some very simple precautions can mean the difference between a safe and memorable holiday season and tragedy. Be together, be safe, and have a wonderful holiday season!







MEANS STOP

Just a reminder: Slowing down or "rolling" through a stop sign is nothing less than nice terminology for running a stop sign. It is illegal, and it is dangerous. Running stop signs is a major cause of traffic accidents and fatalities.

On average there are 14,000 cars involved in **fatal** automobile accidents caused by running a stop sign each year. Stop signs are primarily installed to avoid accidents and all drivers have to come to a complete halt when they approach a stop sign, only then can they proceed further.

Stop signs on streets in gated communities are legal traffic signs.

Failing to stop at a stop sign in a gated community =

traffic violation

Stop means S T O P.

Preventing Accidents At Stop Signs

Always come to a complete stop at a stop sign. Count to three after stopping and check for cars in each direction.

NOTE: During a 20 minute period while photos were taken, NOT ONE vehicle came to a full stop.



Stop sign violation = \$165.00 fine

FREE RESIDENTIAL BULK PICK-UP

SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCES:

Wednesday, January 25; Thursday, January 26; OR Friday, January 27 For single family homes, bulk trash collection will correspond with your regularly scheduled collection day (Wednesday-Friday) and all bulk trash must be placed curbside by 7 a.m. Do not block collection of your garbage cart. Your bulk collection day is your regular garbage collection day only. If items are not collected by the end of the day, they will be collected the following day, it is dependent upon the volume of items placed out by the community.

MULTI-FAMILY UNITS WITH DUMPSTER SERVICE:

Saturday, January 28

Place items alongside the community's dumpster by 7 a.m. (apartments and condominiums).

What The School Would Use the Grant Funding For:

This grant would allow us to obtain document cameras and projectors for all of our classrooms. These tools would provide teachers with the ability to use the full capabilities of the Internet to present lessons. The ability to share a piece of student writing on a document camera or to use a streaming video to bring a social studies lesson alive is common in many traditional public schools and should be available in our school as well. Once those presentation technology needs are met, any remaining funds would be used to increase the numbers of student computers to ensure sufficient access in all classrooms. Our students will be instructed and provided experience in the global world of the internet regularly rather than as an occasional opportunity.

The library also has a free mobile application that allows you to learn 80 different languages while on the go.

Coming soon BCL WOW will offer a free application that will work on all smart phones allowing the customer to search for and reserve material, renew books and find the nearest library.



The virtual library can also help your career. For those who are looking for a job, there is access to free live expert coaches for every stage of a job search. 


Saturday, December 10th, 1:30PM Santa's Holiday Revue
