



Weston ranks No. 1 in Nationwide Housing Market According to Bloomberg Businessweek Survey

Weston residents have yet another reason to smile. The recent Bloomberg Businessweek survey of 1,000 largest cities nationwide landed Weston, FL in the top spot for largest gains in home values. In an economy where values are continuing to drop at record levels, Weston has seen a 15.1 percent increase from February 2009 to August 2011.

Posted below is the summary on Businessweek.com and a link to the complete article. In the article, a real estate agent interviewed for thoughts on Weston's success, credited the meticulous landscaping.

Weston's City leaders however credit their "stay the course" philosophy. This philosophy was enacted to stabilize the tax rate, minimize the use of reserves and maintain, even during lean economic times, the City infrastructure and service levels, to keep Weston as one of the most desirable municipalities in the region. From April 2008 to April 2011, the population grew about 5 percent, estimates the University of Florida Bureau of Economics & Business Research. In 2006 Businessweek.com ranked Weston one of "The Best Affordable Suburbs" in the U.S. The median home value in the city was \$280,000 in August, according to the Zillow Home Value Index, and as of Aug. 31, the median sale price was \$335,000.

Rotary Club of Weston CERT Graduates Community Emergency Response Team

The most recent *Community* **Emergency** Response Team (CERT) training program was initiated in partnership with the Rotary Club of Weston. first of training 8 sessions began in July 2011 Fire Chief Harris with Bouchillon as the lead instructor and Rotarian Larry Herman as club CERT leader. The team completed 24 hours οf training in the areas of building construction, fire suppression, first aid.



terrorism response, disaster psychology and disaster preparedness.

The program culminated with the graduation of 24 members who were recognized by the City Commission and presented with their certificates of completion at the October 17, 2011 City Commission meeting. CERT was a perfect fit for the Rotarians who pledge to provide service to others.

The Weston program has been in existence since 2006 and graduates will join current Weston CERT team members. **CERT** educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their community and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

People who go through CERT training have a better understanding of the potential threats to their home, workplace and community and can take the right steps to lessen the effects of these hazards on themselves, their homes or workplace.

If a disaster happens that overwhelms local response capability, CERT members can apply their training to give critical support to their family, loved ones, neighbors or associates in their immediate area until help arrives. CERT members can also assist with non-emergency projects that improve the safety of the community.

TRICK OR TREATING SAFETY TIPS



Keep your Halloween celebrations hauntingly happy with these safety tips:

- An adult should always accompany children as they trick-or-treat.
- Plan and discuss the route children will take, and their return time, and make sure they stick to it.
- **Costumes** should be made of flame retardant material. If they are home-made, make sure and use either a fire retardant spray or fabric that has been treated with fire retardant.
- If your child is wearing a mask, make sure that the eye holes are big enough to see not only in front but peripherally as well. You may have to cut them open further yourself. If so, use some black or gray grease paint around the eye socket to cover skin.
- Have children carry flashlights or glow sticks for easier visibility, or place reflective tape on their costume.
- Ensure children stop only at houses that are well-lit, and teach them NEVER to enter the home of a stranger.
- Insist that treats be brought home for inspection before anything is eaten. Don't let children eat anything that is unwrapped or seems unusual. When in doubt, throw it out.
- Pin a slip of paper to the costumes of younger children listing the child's name, address and telephone number in the event the child is separated from the group with which they are traveling.
- Turn on your home's exterior lights and remove any objects from your walkway that may be a hazard to trick-or-treaters. Place jack-o-lanterns out-of-reach so children won't burn themselves or their costumes. Tell your neighbors to do the same.
- If possible, send children trick-or-treating before dark.
- Be aware of suspicious activity. Report any concerns to BSO at 954-765-4321.





HALLOWEEN IS A SCARY TIME FOR PETS

The best treat you can give your pet on Halloween is a safe spot in the house, away from all of the excitement and spooky spirit of the day

Spooky sounds and creepy costumes are not only scary to little kids, but to your pet as well. The best advice is to keep pets safe and calm inside the home and out of view of trick-or-treaters.

Dogs and cats should not be left outside, in the yard or near the front or back doors. Groups of children can scare pets, causing them to escape from the yard, break their leash or run out of the house. A pet running loose may fall victim to possible abuse by misguided individuals. In addition, a dog or cat may inadvertently bite or scratch a child out of fear of a scary, unfamiliar costume.

Instead, confine pets away from the front door in a separate room, complete with their favorite bed and toys. Pets, especially dogs, are easily excited or threatened by strangers and can easily slip out the door.



Another important warning is not to share any candy with pets, especially chocolate. In some cases the dog will even get in the candy bag and 'help themselves.' Either way, it is very dangerous for a dog or cat. Candy is toxic to animals and can cause vomiting, restlessness, heart disturbances and even death. Tell children not to share their candy with any animal. If you suspect your pet has eaten chocolate or other candy that causes discomfort, consult your veterinarian immediately.

Important Halloween Safety Tips for Pets

- 1. **DO** keep your pet inside your home in a safe, quiet room during trick-or-treat time or house parties.
- 2. **DO NOT** leave your cat and dog outside when children are trick-or-treating in the neighborhood.
- 3. **DO** keep your pet away from the front or back

doors during trick-or-treating hours.

- 4. **DO NOT** feed your pet any candy -- especially chocolate -- and do not leave candy where a pet will be able reach it.
- 5. **DO** make sure that your pet dog or cat is wearing their Broward County pet license on their collar. This will ensure that your pet will be returned to you if he/she does get out during Halloween festivities.





Fire Prevention Month Activities Abound

ATTENTION RESIDENTS OF BONAVENTURE

MONEY AND WATER SAVING INCENTIVES PROGRAM

For residents residing in the Bonaventure Development District, you are eligible to participate in the Broward Water Conservation Incentives Program.

Under this program, 1,700 rebates will be issued for up to \$100 toward the purchase of a high-efficiency toilet. Take advantage of the rebate - along with the program's other water-conserving freebies - and your household water savings could reach 30,000 gallons annually.

Rebates must be pre-approved, are limited in quantity, and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. You must be replacing a toilet that currently uses more than 1.6 gallons per flush and replace it with a High-Efficiency toilet. To find out how many gallons per flush your current toilets use, you may find that information stamped on the space between the toilet seat and the tank or inside the tank itself.

Only one rebate per qualifying household will be authorized. Other restrictions apply. You may also be able to receive a water-conserving showerhead and faucet aerators, too. If you use pre-rinse spray valves in your business, a new one could be yours for free if you qualify.

There will be a limit of 1 kitchen faucet aerator, 2 shower heads and 2 bathroom sink faucet aerators per household. Each household can receive a \$100 rebate for a high efficiency toilet while supplies last.

The program does not apply to residents in the Indian Trace Development District as the majority of homes were built after the Energy Policy Act went into effect and homes were constructed with toilets that utilized 1.6 gallons per flush or less.


BROWARD COUNTY OFFERS CONSTRUCTION CAREER DAYS


