FIRE PREVENTION WEEK 2011 OCTOBER 9 - 15, 2011

Fire Prevention Week was established to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire, the tragic 1871 conflagration that killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures and burned more than 2,000 acres. The fire began on October 8, but continued into and did most of its damage on October 9, 1871.

According to popular legend, the fire broke out after a cow - belonging to Mrs. Catherine O'Leary - kicked over a lamp, setting first the barn, then the whole city on fire. Chances are you've heard some version of this story yourself; people have been blaming the Great Chicago Fire on the cow and Mrs. O'Leary, for more than 130 years.



This year's theme according to National Fire Protection Association is, "It's Fire Prevention Week. Protect your Family from Fire!" This year, the campaign is centered around keeping individuals, families, and communities safer from fire.

Throughout the month of October, Life Safety Educators with the Broward Sheriff's Office will be conducting various events at Weston area schools in conjunction with onduty fire fighters. Additionally, the Halloween Safety Expo on Friday, October 28th will offer equipment demonstrations and an opportunity for attendees to speak with the fire fighters that work each day to keep our community safe.

BROWARD COUNTY LAUNCHES THE CONSERVATION AND CLIMATE CHANGE (C3) CHALLENGE FOR ALL BROWARD SCHOOLS

The Broward County Pollution Prevention, Remediation and Air Quality Division in partnership with the Broward County School Board, is launching its third annual <u>Conservation and Climate Change (C3) Challenge</u>, an educational competition intended to engage students, teachers, school administrators, staff and parents in practical actions to reduce their carbon footprint at school and at home.

Through improved energy efficiency, reduced consumption, increased recycling and changes in transportation behaviors, participants will learn how simple actions, taken together, can create a climate of change. Schools can use the <u>C3 Challenge Toolkit</u> to learn how to take the Challenge and use the educational activities to teach students, parents and school administrators about the role we all play in climate protection. All educational activities in the Toolkit are aligned with the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards and can be downloaded at no cost at <u>broward.org/pollutionprevention</u>.

THERE ARE TWO EASY STEPS TO ENTER THE CHALLENGE

Step 1: Take the Challenge -- School Registration and Team Building

- Register your school by e-mailing <u>airoutreach@broward.org</u>.
- Teachers and students use the Conservation and Climate Change Challenge Toolkit.

Step 2: Teacher Pledge Drive and Share Your Story

- Teachers submit the online <u>Teacher Pledge</u> by February 3, 2012.
- Each school MUST submit a "Share Your Story" article to <u>airoutreach@broward.org</u> by February 10, 2012, to be eligible.

The schools with the highest score (percentage of teachers participating, share your story submittal, and on-site evaluation) wins! Three winning schools will be selected (elementary, middle and high).

The purpose of these meetings is to discuss a transportation study that encompasses high-quality, high-capacity transit service on an east-west axis in central Broward County to connect the developing western side of the county to the highly dense coastal area. These meetings are necessary to aid in project development and will serve to: 1) present the results for alignments and vehicles (transit technologies) and 2) to obtain feedback from stakeholders and the public in regard to the proposed options.

The study is being conducted in partnership with Florida Department of Transportation, Broward County Transit, Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization and South Florida Regional Transportation Authority. FREE DOWNLOADABLE BOOKS NOW AVAILABLE AT THE AIRPORT

The Broward County Library and the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport have partnered to offer Airport visitors the opportunity to download free books from Broward County Library. Visitors to the Airport can now access thousands of <u>free downloadable books</u> via quick response (QR) codes, displayed on LCD screens in the Airport's baggage claim area.

The screens allow airport visitors to access 15,000 free book titles by scanning the QR code with their smart phone or e-Book reader. It is not necessary to have a County Library card to access the free downloadable books, and the book titles never expire.
