DEPUTY KARI PALLOTTOGOLD MEDALS TO ADD TO AWARDS WALL



While we're not sure where Deputy Pallotto displays all of the awards she has received over the years, what we do know is that she has to make room for even more. Kari won three gold and one silver medal in swimming events at the 2012 Florida Police and Fire Games, setting a new record in the 25 meter race.

The Florida Police and Fire Games were established in 1985. They are open to Florida law enforcement, firefighters, and military personnel (active duty, reserves, National Guard and retirees from all military

branches). More than 2,600 competitors representing agencies from around the state competed in over 45 Olympic-style sporting events. Held each year in the third full week of June, this year's events took place at venues on the Treasure Coast in Indian River, Martin, Okeechobee and St. Lucie counties. The games will be held in Fort Lauderdale in 2013.

Deputy Pallotto serves as the Crime Prevention Practitioner for the City of Weston. She is a 12 year law enforcement veteran and has served in the Weston District for the last eight years. Over the past 12 months Deputy Pallotto was nominated for the Community Policing Officer of the Year Award in 2011, presented the Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award by the Broward County Chiefs of Police Association, and the Officer of the Year for Community Policing just this month by the ASIS Fort Lauderdale Chapter. Kari has numerous other awards and has consistently won medals each year in the Police Olympics. *Congratulations!*

INDEPENDENCE DAY THE HISTORY AND MEANING BEHIND THE NATION'S BIRTHDAY



Independence Day, commonly known as the Fourth of July, is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776.

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the Thirteen Colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution

of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a committee of five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4.

John Adams had written to his wife Abigail shortly after the Declaration had been approved:

"The second day of July 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more."

Though a couple days off, John Adams had correctly guessed how our Independence day is celebrated around the country. Firework displays, festivals, barbecue's and many other fine American traditions help us to ring in yet another year of American Independence.

FOURTH OF JULY PET SAFETY

Pet owners are advised to be cautious during holiday activities



The upcoming Fourth of July holiday is marked by all kinds of celebrations, activities and food that can be fun for your family, but Broward County Animal Care and Adoption offers some important tips to ensure that the Fourth of July is also a safe holiday for your pet.

The bottom line, says Dr. Johnston, is to have a safe and fun holiday weekend and summer. "It's natural to want to include your pet in activities, but the best celebration will be one where your pet is on its normal routine, away from all of the noise and festivities so that they remain healthy, happy and safe."

Top Five July 4th Safety Tips for Pets:

- 1. Keep your pet inside the house away from fireworks and loud noises. Do not leave them out in the yard.
- 2. Keep your pet safely away from hot grills, charcoal and lighter fluid. Sunscreen, insect repellant, citronella candles and oil are also harmful to your pet.

- 3. Do not feed your pet "people food" or alcohol.
- 4. If your pet ingests a poisonous substance, contact your local veterinarian right away or the Animal Poison Control Center at 1-888-426-4435. The center is open 24/7.
- 5. Make sure your dog or cat has a Broward County Pet Registration Tag and that it wears this identification at all times. It is the easiest way to ensure your pet will be reunited with you if it becomes lost.

CHLORINATION WATER TREATMENT

July 2 - July 20, 2012

The City of Sunrise maintains the highest quality standards to provide clean, safe drinking water to its customers, which includes the City of Weston. From **July 2 through July 20**, the Utilities Department will use chlorine in its drinking water treatment system to provide additional protection against bacteria.

What is Chlorination Water Treatment?

This temporary treatment of the water system is common practice for water suppliers that use a chlorine treatment method. This periodic program is mandated by the Broward County Health Department.

This procedure does not cause any adverse health effects. However, some individuals may notice a slight change in the taste, odor or color of the water during this time.

FLOOD WATER FACTS

ANYWHERE IT CAN RAIN, IT CAN FLOOD

South Florida has two seasons: wet and dry. We are now in the 5-month stretch of wet weather that brings 70 percent of our yearly rainfall. However, this time of year also brings short periods of intense rainfall when flooding can occur. Only Flood Insurance will pay for damage caused by water so check your policy updates. Historically one-in-five claims come from areas considered moderate-to-low risk.

Some facts on rainfall amounts and flooding:

4 - 6 inches of rainfall in 24 hoursWater remains standing in yards, swales and ditches, but the crowns of roads remain passable

7 -10 inches of rainfall in **72**-hours
Roads, as well as swales, ditches and yards flood, but buildings usually remain dry.

10–20 inches of rainfall in **72** hours Many houses and businesses can be expected to flood.

Weston's water bodies and canals were designed to hold and move stormwater. Stormwater is excess rain runoff that is removed from our properties and streets by going down into catch basins and prevents flooding.

A catch basin is a part of a storm drain or sewer system which is designed to trap debris so that it cannot enter the drainage pipes. Catch basins are a large scale version of the traps used in home drains to accomplish a similar function. Unobstructed water flow through these drains and water bodies, especially during storm events, is essential to prevent flooding.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP -

- Keep catch basins free of trash, debris or other obstructions which will inhibit water from being able to flow into it and cause flooding. NEVER remove the grate, this protects people and pets from falling into the drain and keeps large amounts of debris out of the system which would increase the chance of flooding.
- Maintain swale areas in good condition. Don't change the shape of swales or obstruct the path of water flow.
- Swales hold water for 24-36 hours. They are designed to hold water and filter it through into the ground. Mosquitoes do not breed until water ponds for over 72 hours.
- Don't deposit yard waste, grass clippings or debris in waterways, and do not sweep into catch basins.

REMINDER FOR THOSE IN A GATED COMMUNITY: Roadways and their drainage systems within private communities are owned and maintained by the community's maintenance association, not the City of Weston.

FLOOD WATERS RISING HOW TO KEEP FROM DROWNING YOUR CAR



No matter how familiar you might be with the road, never drive through standing water – at any depth – as it could cause serious

damage to your vehicle. Potential damage could include the risk of flooding its engine, warping brake rotors, disabling power steering and causing a short in the electrical components of the car.



Each can cost thousands of dollars to repair and may not be covered by your auto insurance. (A flooded vehicle falls under comprehensive coverage, which you may not be required to carry.)

During Tropical storms or other severe weather it is basic common sense that if you don't need to be on the road, stay put and wait it out. The depth of standing water can be deceiving and might be deeper than you think.

THREE FLOOD FAST FACTS:



- 1. As little as one foot of water can "float" most vehicles.
- 2. Two feet of rushing water can sweep away most vehicles including SUVs and Pick-ups.



3. Repair costs for damage caused by driving through standing water can range from several hundred to several thousand dollars.

FLORIDA TOLL ROADS IMPLEMENT RATE INCREASE



Get ready to pay more money if you drive Florida's Turnpike, Alligator Alley, Sawgrass Expressway and other toll roads. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) implemented toll rate indexing on all of its toll roads and bridges on Sunday, June 24th.

Tolls went up by a quarter at most locations for both cash and SunPass customers. Alligator Alley drivers will see a bigger increase. SunPass customers have not had a toll rate increase since the program began in 1999. **SunPass customers will always enjoy the lowest toll rate on any facility.**

At main turnpike plazas like Cypress Creek in Broward County tolls will go from 75 cents to \$1.00 for drivers with SunPass and \$1.00 to \$1.25 for cash customers. On Alligator Alley, motorists will pay \$2.75 with SunPass and \$3.00 with cash.

WHY: Revenue from the hike will be leveraged over 30 years to finance about \$1.8 billion in projects. That will allow the turnpike to accelerate plans to convert the turnpike and the Sawgrass Expressway to all-electronic tolling, improve the Golden Glades interchange and widen the turnpike between Homestead and Kendall Drive in south Miami-Dade County.
