DEPUTY JOE SOLIS MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL RBI WORLD SERIES CHAMPION

When baseball fans hear the term RBI, they most often consider it to mean "runs batted in". But not BSO Deputy Joe Solis, an RBI World Series Champion.

RBI stands for Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities, and the RBI program is a Major League Baseball youth initiative designed to provide opportunities for kids to play baseball and softball, encouraging excellence and achievement in education and teaching the value of teamwork and life lessons to youths ages 5 to 18, from underserved and urban communities.



Deputy Solis is an RBI alum and 1997 World Series Champion. He was recently interviewed on-camera by Major League Baseball Productions for a special segment in celebration of the upcoming 20th Anniversary of RBI. The special will feature three alumni, which includes Deputy Solis, highlighting life after baseball and what playing in the RBI can lead to.

Deputy Solis was in the program out of Miami which he says provided him the ability to participate in a baseball league at no cost, providing excellent equipment, fields and uniforms and afforded him the ability to travel which he would not otherwise have been able to do. Joe was a member of the team that

traveled to Colorado that year for the World Series and came away with the championship. He was later drafted out of Broward Community College by the White Sox but made the decision to go into police work.

Joe mentioned that one of the other alumni that will be interviewed is now the Executive Chef at the White House. Well that individual may be cooking for the leaders of nations, but Deputy Solis is a veteran law enforcement officer providing protection for the Weston community and a role model to every child he comes into contact with. We congratulate Deputy Solis on his past and present accomplishments.

TAKE STEPS NOW TO BE PREPARED

GENERATOR SAFETY

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series

Generators are useful when temporary or remote electric power is needed, but they also can be extremely dangerous. Hazards include carbon monoxide poisoning from toxic engine exhaust, electric shock, electrocution, and fire.



Heed these important safety tips:

- When installing a permanent generator, be sure to obtain the necessary permits and have a licensed electrician do the installation.
- Use the generator according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Place portable generators outside in a well-ventilated area, NEVER inside a home including garages, basements or crawl spaces.
- You cannot see or smell carbon monoxide. If you start to feel sick, dizzy or weak while using a generator, get outside to fresh air immediately and call 9-1-1.
- Install battery-operated or plug-in carbon monoxide alarms with battery backup in your home.
- Do not refuel a generator while it is running.
- Do not store fuel indoors.
- Do not connect a portable generator directly to your house because the power you generate may flow back into power lines and cause damage or injure power workers.

Prepare, stay safe and be ready for an emergency; register for **CodeRED** to receive emergency notifications from the City of Weston.

Christmas In July Seeks New Clothing Items for Homeless Children



Donation priorities for the County's homeless children, ages infant to 18, include new socks, shoes and underwear for boys or girls, to be presented at the annual *Christmas In July* Event coordinated by Kiwanis Divisions 23 and 24 and Broward County. The event brings over 1,000 area homeless children together to enjoy a day away from the harsh reality of being homeless.

Collection boxes will be at all Broward County libraries including the Weston Branch Library, county governmental buildings, courthouses and additional locations.

The donation drive continues through July 6.

How children are selected

Each county homeless shelter or facility is contacted repeatedly to provide the name, age, gender, underwear size, clothing size, and shoe size of every single homeless child, so that the gift packages can be personalized for each child. It takes the planning committee about seven to eight months to prepare adequately for this event. Preparation includes working closely with shelters and facilities, seeking sponsorships and donations from local organizations and businesses (whether monetary or in-kind), locating a packing facility, shopping for the items, storing the goods in a central location, preparing labels with the children's names and relevant information, packing the personalized bags, transporting them to the facility, and arranging for entertainment and food for the event day. **The children only receive new items.** Santa and his helpers are on site to distribute the gifts to the children. On the event day, at the very end, families can also obtain additional items for the children in a specified grab bag area.



The 2011 event: This was a day of food, fun, and gift giving and the children were provided with new underwear, clothing, shoes, toys, games, book bags, toileteries, and school supplies. The book bags filled with supplies were sent back to the facilities for the children who were unable to attend. Additionally, Broward County Health Department coupons for free immunizations and vaccinations were provided to all kids at the event.

BROWARD COUNTY'S ANIMAL CARE CENTER NEEDS YOUR HELP

Special Volunteers Needed!

Broward County's Animal Care and Adoption is looking for volunteers to help them win the ASPCA \$100K Challenge, which begins August 1 through October 31. Volunteers will assist with events and activities at the animal shelters and off-site locations. The Shelter that save the most dogs, cats, puppies and kittens (beyond the 300 animals they already saved to qualify to compete) receives a \$100K Grant.



What is the \$100K Challenge?

The ASPCA launched a national competition in 2010 to inspire animal shelters—and those who support them—to go above and beyond to save more animals. Broward County's Animal Care is one of the 50 finalists in this competition.

The goal was to help shelters to find new ways to increase pet adoption, reunite lost pets with their families and decrease euthanasia rates nationwide. Sadly, five to seven million companion animals enter animal shelters every year, and roughly three to four million are euthanized due to a lack of space or resources.



The Challenge seeks to make a real dent in those numbers. The first year, it was a hit: Shelters engaged in a little friendly rivalry and saved thousands of animals along the way. ASPCA repeated it all over again in 2011, and this year, for the third year in a row, the Challenge is back, bigger and better than ever. 


