

# CONSTRUCTION PROJECT ACCELERATION LANE AT EAGLE POINT ELEMENTARY

The City will begin construction of an acceleration lane at Eagle Point Elementary School on **June 11**, **2012**. The project area is located on Indian Trace, just north of the exit from the school parking lot. The lane will extend from the school parking lot, north to the entrance of San Remo at San Remo Drive.

The construction of the acceleration lane is in response to traffic congestion during school drop-off and pick-up times. The addition of the lane will ease traffic coming out of the school to San Remo.

Effects on Eagle Point Elementary School:

- School will be out for the summer; however staff will still be present.
- One lane of traffic will be closed directly in front of the school
- Ingress and Egress will NOT be affected
- Work will take place in the swale and sidewalk area which will be closed

This project is anticipated to be completed prior to the start of the 2012-2012 school year.

# BEFORE THE STORM

### **DEVELOP A PLAN**

### **HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series**



#### STEP 1 Hold a family meeting

Discuss the hazards of hurricanes. Encourage children to talk and explain some of the things you'll be doing to keep everyone safe.

#### STEP 2 Discuss the need to evacuate

Determine if you live in an evacuation zone and, if so, where you will go if needed.

#### STEP 3 Ensure your assets are protected

Inventory your home possessions and record items of value. Review your insurance policies.

#### STEP 4 Assess your home for vulnerable areas

Do a walk-through of your home to evaluate your roof, windows, garage door, landscaping, etc. and determine what actions you will take.

#### STEP 5 Make a plan to protect your vehicles

Decide where you will store your vehicle(s) and check the insurance policy.

#### STEP 6 Secure your home

Decide what to do to take to protect your home and your property before the storm (shutters, generator, tree-trimming).

#### STEP 7 Special medical needs or need extra assistance

Discuss anyone's special needs in an emergency because of a medical condition, or being elderly or disabled. Make arrangements for those needs.

#### STEP 8 Make a plan for your pets

Determine your pet's needs and make a plan in case you have to evacuate.

#### STEP 9 Gather your supplies

Determine your family's food, water and medical needs and assemble your hurricane kit according to those needs.

#### STEP 10 Notify others of your plan

Let family or friends know what your hurricane plan is so they can check on you in the aftermath of the storm. Establish an out-of-town contact.

## Getting Ready for Summer Drowning Prevention Information



More than a third of people planning to swim, boat or fish this summer cannot swim well. The survey of more than 1,000 adults, taken earlier this spring, found that 78 percent of households are planning at least one water-related recreational activity this summer. However, 37 percent describe their swimming skills as fair, lacking or non-existent – with 13 percent unable to swim at all.

Drowning is the number one cause of death for children ages one to four in Broward County. If you could prevent your child's death, would you?

- NEVER leave children unsupervised in or around a body of water. Children can drown in as little as two inches of water in less than one minute.
- Install a self-closing gate around the pool.
- Alarm every door leading to water to alert you if a child has gone outside.
- Teach children water and swimming skills.
- During pool parties or beach gatherings, designate an adult to watch the children.
- Remove any toys that may attract children to the pool area.
- Install a pool cover to securely cover the water area.
- Install a poolside, cordless phone.
- Keep lifesaving equipment a pole, life preserver and rope in the pool area.
- Children with long hair should clip it back or wear a cap in the pool.
- Avoid keeping water in buckets or other large containers when toddlers are home.
- Don't rely on flotation devices to protect your children in the water.
- If a child is missing, check all water bodies and/or pools and call 9-1-1.


# ONCE IN A LIFETIME EXPERIENCE JUNE 5, 2012 – VENUS TRANSIT

**NEXT OPPORTUNITY: 105 YEARS** 

As the sun is about to set on June 5<sup>th</sup>, the planet Venus will make a rare and spectacular appearance. From earth, it will appear as it travels across the face of the sun, appearing as a small, dark circle, backlit by the bright sun. Venus actually passes between Earth and the Sun every 583.9 days, but rarely crosses directly in front of the sun. The next time this phenomenon is expected to occur will be in December of 2117.

The Broward College Buehler Planetarium and Observatory located nearby in Davie, will **host a special series of events on June 5**<sup>th</sup> to watch Venus under safe viewing conditions. Watching the Sun without specially filtered lenses can result in permanent vision damage or blindness.

The evening's activities start at 4:45pm in the Definiti Theater with a special presentation on the Venus transit phenomenon. From there, guests move outdoors at 5:30pm to the observatory, where multiple telescopes will stand ready for observing. The actual transit begins at 6:04pm and continues through 7pm for the Broward College observation location. The original special presentation will be repeated in the theater from 7:15pm-8pm. There will be night sky observing at the Buehler Observatory from 8-10pm.



The presentations in the theater are \$4 each but the outdoor sessions at the observatory are free.



The Broward College Buehler Planetarium is a state of the art facility with a 40 foot dome, using a Definiti fulldome video system. Visitors are welcomed to enjoy this immersive experience and explore the universe and more. Public shows are scheduled every week with affordable pricing options (\$4-\$6)

**General Information:** Planetarium and Observatory is available to the general public. Show times generally run about 1 hour in length and shows are geared towards the time of year.

**The Broward College Observatory** will let you see stars, planets, nebulae and the Moon with unparalleled detail through our telescopes, weather permitting. Night observing is available after


