




8th ANNUAL CONCERT A HUGE SUCCESS



CYPRESS BAY SOCCER TEAMS TO BE RECOGNIZED



The Cypress Bay Boys Soccer Team and the Girls Soccer Team will be recognized at the April 2, 2012 City Commission meeting.

The boy's teams won the State Championship in Tampa on February 18th beating out Jacksonville-Mandarin, 4-1 in the Class 5A championship game at the University of South Florida. This is the second consecutive state championship for the Lightning and they are considered the nation's top ranked team with an undefeated 23-0-2 record.

To top off an incredible season, ESPN has announced that on April 13th they will present the team with the **National Championship** Trophy. The team has remained atop ESPN's Fab50 power rankings.

The Cypress Bay Girl's Soccer Team, also the Lightning, with just 3 seconds left in the Regional Championship, won over Lords Academy Girls Soccer.



April is proclaimed *Safe Digging Month* in the state of Florida, but residents and businesses need to ensure to **always "Call Before You Dig"**.

It's easy and it's free - and can save you and others huge problems.

A utility line is damaged by digging once every three minutes nationwide.

But that is preventable. Just make the promise: Call 8-1-1

Call before digging – even small projects like landscaping or installing a fence or mailbox.



CALL

Always call 811 two full business days before you dig. If you want to dig on a Saturday, call on Wednesday. Sunshine State One Call notifies your neighborhood utilities of your pending project or job. Note: If you are digging in only a small portion of the yard, outline that area with white spray paint.

WAIT



Wait two full business days. During that time, utility companies send their locators to mark underground lines in your yard. Paint and flags will mark underground utility lines. The colors of the marks tell what type of utility is buried.

Electric	Telephone, Cable TV Alarms	Gas
Sewer	Water (drinkable)	Reclaimed Water (irrigation)

Marks are good for 30 calendar days. Any work beyond that requires another call to 811. If locate marks are destroyed before your project is done, stop digging and call 811. Then wait two full business days.

CHECK

No marks in your yard does not always mean no utilities. Verify whether a utility has cleared your property of its line with Positive Response. To access this information call (800) 852-8057. Utility companies are automatically notified if they have not responded. *Note: Not all utility owners will locate privately owned utilities such as water and sewer lines from the meter to your house.*

DIG CAREFULLY



Buried lines are within 24 inches of the marks. Please dig carefully within that entire area. For more information, <u>click here</u>.

How deep is the utility? Some may be buried a few inches others deeper. Dig carefully to find how deep the line is buried.

Even if you think you know where an underground line is, time tends to change things. Erosion or tree roots can shift those utility lines. For more information on how utility depth changes, <u>click here</u>.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I HIT AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY?

If you damage, dislocate or nick any utility line, call the owner of that line and report the incident. For serious damages that create an emergency, call 911 and take precautions to safeguard your health and property.




Professional Theater for Kids The Ugly Duckling
