The Remembrance Rescue Project now involves former FDNY Rescue 4 and Rescue 5. After extensive renovation, it allows the

Rescue vehicles to serve as mobile memorials to educate, honor and remember the events of 9/11 and all firefighters killed in the line of duty throughout the country each year.

On May 3<sup>rd</sup>, Weston Battalion Chief Hoecherl, Life Safety Educator, Pamela Gorman and the crew of Weston Engine company No. 67 were privileged to be a part of the Remembrance Rescue Project. The YMCA in Weston was one of the stops while here in Broward County for a 2-week period.

The children and adults in attendance learned not only about the events of 9/11, but about the heroes who came out of it and how that tragic event impacted the fire service.

## STROKE AWARENESS



May is Stroke Awareness Month and an excellent time to set about increasing our community's knowledge on stroke



Three of Cleveland Clinics top physicians, intent on educating our community regarding the risks and warning signs of stroke, attended the May 7, 2012 City Commission meeting to accept a proclamation designating May as Stroke Awareness Month.

Dr. Salgado emphasized that strokes are preventable. Being aware of risk factors and making lifestyle modifications and public awareness are key weapons in conquering stroke.

#### **Preventative Measures:**

While you cannot control such risk factors as age, gender, race and family history, you can modify many other risk factors.

This includes losing weight, quitting smoking, exercising regularly and increasing your consumption of fruit and vegetables and eating a healthy diet, low in sodium. Under the care of your doctor, you need to closely monitor and control high

blood pressure and diabetes and, if necessary, take medication to control atrial fibrillation (irregular heartbeat). Regular screenings for blood pressure and cholesterol are highly recommended.

The best way to lower your chances for a stroke is to understand your level of risk, then take the steps to decrease it.

### CYPRESS BAY HIGH SCHOOL

Identified as among the Most Outstanding Public Schools



U.S. News & World Report has released its 2012 Rankings of the Best High Schools in the nation. Over 22,000 public high schools were evaluated across the country, with the cream of the crop making it into the top 500 which received gold medal status. **Cypress Bay is one of those schools.** 

Three high schools in Broward made the top 500.



A three-step process was used to determine the Best High Schools. The first two steps ensured that the schools serve all of their students well, using performance on state proficiency tests as the benchmarks. For those schools that made it past the first two steps, a third step assessed the degree to which schools prepare students for college-level work. Schools with highest unrounded college readiness index values were numerically ranked nationally from No. 1 to No. 500 and were the gold medal winners.

In all, a total of 14 Broward County Public School high schools received gold, silver or bronze medals in the U.S. News & World Report 2012 national rankings.

# Love is in the air and crawling over land...

## Alligator mating season is here once again!

With our close proximity to the Everglades and almost endless bodies of water intertwined within our community, it is very likely you may see an alligator scurrying by. Most of the year alligators remain primarily out of sight. But in May and June gators become more visible as they seek a mate. This time of year you may see them cruising lakes and canals, sunning on water banks or even in a pool deck or on a driveway... At this time of year it is suggested to keep children and pets away from the water. The larger, mature male alligators are the ones most likely to be seen, but the smaller female alligators are also active after being dormant during the winter when waters are cooler. Most have no intentions of bothering you – they are just looking for love.

If you see an alligator nearby, stay calm. Feeding, harassing, or killing alligators violate State law. If an alligator appears threatening, comes close to your home, or becomes a risk for humans or pets, contact the **Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) at (866) 392-4286.** 

Only nuisance alligators can be removed and the FWC will make that determination and contact a licensed trapper. Generally, alligators may be considered a nuisance when they are at least four feet in length and pose a threat to people or their pets or property.

The City is not permitted to handle alligators for any reason. Please pay a little extra attention to your surroundings when you and your family are spending time near the water, but continue to enjoy the uniqueness of our environment.

Alligators are a part of Florida's natural environment and play an important role in the State's wetlands ecology. Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) refers to used or leftover contents of consumer products that contain chemicals with one of the four characteristics: *Toxic, Ignitable, Corrosive, or Reactive* as defined by the Environmental Protection





<u>What items are being accepted?</u> Oil and latex paints and thinners, used motor oil, auto fluids and gasoline solvents, pesticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals, drain cleaners, tires, mercury, rechargeable & automobile batteries and electronics such as computers and televisions will be accepted.

## NEW BUS SERVICE FROM BROWARD COUNTY TRANSIT 595 EXPRESS





New, 595 Express Bus Service to Start on May 29

<u>Complimentary Rides for Passengers During First Week of Service!</u>

The new 595 Express will begin service on Tuesday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, with two routes from the park-and-ride lot located at the BankAtlantic Center in Sunrise; one to downtown Miami/Brickell Avenue and the other to downtown Fort Lauderdale, both traveling along I-595.

The Miami/Brickell route will make a stop at the Fort Lauderdale Airport Tri-Rail station with an additional park-and-ride. The Fort Lauderdale route will make three morning and afternoon reverse commute trips to and from Sawgrass Mills Mall. Service will operate approximately every 30 minutes on weekdays during morning and afternoon peak traffic hours.

Southbound morning buses to downtown Miami/Brickell Avenue will depart at 5:20 a.m. up to 7:40 a.m. every 30 minutes and afternoon northbound buses to Sunrise will depart at 3:35 p.m. up to 6:05 p.m. every 30 minutes.

Eastbound morning buses to downtown Fort Lauderdale will depart at 6:05 a.m. up to 8:30 a.m. every 30 minutes and afternoon westbound buses to Sunrise will depart at 3:30 p.m. up to 6:05 p.m. every 30 minutes.


