RECEIVE EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS SIGN UP FOR CODERED TODAY



Hurricane season officially begins on Friday, June 1st. Sign up for **CodeRED** to stay informed and educated about local emergencies.

WHAT IT IS: CodeRED is a high-speed telephone communication service for emergency <u>only</u> notifications. This system allows the City to send critical communications in an emergency situation that requires immediate action.

Capable of dialing the entire City within minutes, **CodeRED** delivers a message from the City Manager's office describing the emergency and instructions for action. You can also opt to receive texts and/or email alerts.

HOW TO REGISTER:

Visit the City web site at www.westonfl.org and click on the CodeRED icon.

Register both your HOME and CELL phones.

Click on the icon at right to take you to CodeRED



<u>ALREADY SIGNED UP</u>? To opt for the text message and/or email alerts, or to add or change a phone number including cell phones, please revisit the **CodeRED** registration page and enter your information.

PRIVACY: CodeRED is used for emergency communications ONLY.

Your contact information is private, **exempt from public records laws, and cannot be shared, requested or sold**

THIS SYSTEM WILL ONLY BE USED FOR EMERGENCY AND LIFE SAFETY PURPOSES SUCH AS: Drinking water contamination, extended utility outages, evacuation notices, missing person, fires, floods, hurricanes, bomb threats, hostage situations, chemical spills or gas leaks, and other incidents where rapid and accurate notification is essential for life safety.

WESTON'S COMMUNITY CENTER MANAGER RETURNS FROM DOWN UNDER... ROTARY INTERNATIONAL'S GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE PROGRAM



For the third year, a City of Weston staff member has had the great fortune to be selected by Rotary District 6990, which includes the Weston Rotary Club, to participate in their Group Study Exchange (GSE) program. Bryan Beard, the City of Weston's Community Center Manager, was chosen to travel to Sydney, Australia from mid-February to mid-March.

The City has a long-standing community partnership with the Rotary Club of Weston who contacted City Manager John Flint for a participant referral for this year's program. Designed for young business men and women between the ages of 25 and 40, the program provides travel grants for teams to exchange visits between areas in different countries, to observe their vocations practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships, and exchange ideas.

Bryan was one of five young professionals and a Team Leader to make the trip. He enjoyed meeting and staying with 11 different host families during his 33 day trip (as well as many native inhabitants).

GSE PROGRAM CONTINUED

During the vocational days, the main purpose of the trip, Bryan spent time with town councils and park/sports administrators discussing and viewing their youth and senior facilities, libraries, sports programs/fields, and parks. He was surprised to learn that they operate very similar to the City of Weston.



Some of the sightseeing activities during the GSE included: Climbing Sydney the Harbor Bridge, touring the Opera House, learning how to surf, paddling in a rescue surf boat, feeding kangaroos and koalas, camping in the Outback, and sapphire fossicking (mining).

Bryan joined the City of Weston's Parks and Recreation Department in October 2006. He relocated to Weston from Stafford Virginia, where he was a Sports Coordinator Stafford County Parks Recreation for 3 years. He was originally hired facility as a attendant at the Community Center, and in 2007, he was promoted to Weston Community Center Manager. Bryan volunteers his time coaching local youth sports and is a member of the Florida Parks and Recreation Association.




PLAYGROUND SAFETY IS SERIOUS WORK

As summer draws near, the playgrounds in Weston are expected to be teeming with children. Keeping those play areas safe is a high priority for the Parks and Recreation Department. This summer, two staff members will be renewing their Playground Safety Inspector Certifications in order to remain knowledgeable about all current trends in safe play equipment.



Weston playgrounds are regularly inspected, repaired and refurbished. Recently, the City replaced a slide at Emerald Estates Park and installed a replacement climber at Eagle Point Park; which will help extend



It is important to note that all City of Weston playgrounds are designed for children ages 2-12 years old. Children under 2 do not have the required physical development to safely play on the equipment. Children over 12 and adults can damage the equipment, particularly when the equipment is not used as intended.

To help your children play safely, please follow these important tips:

- Children should not play unattended. Parental supervision is the most effective strategy for preventing injury.
- Proper clothing and footwear is essential. Clothes should not have any long drawstrings or hoods that could get caught on the equipment. Shoes should be worn at all times. Children should NOT wear bicycle helmets on the playground and refrain from wearing long necklaces or other loose jewelry.
- Children should wear sunscreen to prevent sunburns and drink plenty of liquids to avoid dehydration.
- Skateboards and rollerblades are not allowed on playgrounds; women are asked to avoid wearing high heels to prevent damage to the surfacing.

The students placed 2nd Prize Overall in C-Span's National 2012 StudentCam Documentary Competition. They were presented with a check in the amount of \$1,500 for their documentary titled "Signed, Sealed and Delivered". Chad and Dustin wrote, directed and starred in this documentary which followed C-Span's 2012 theme of "The Constitution and You".
