

WESTON CRIME RATE LOWEST IN COUNTY

THE GREAT NEWS

The just released Florida Department of Law Enforcement Uniform Crime Report County and Municipal Offense Data for January-December 2011 places the Weston crime rate per 100,000 persons at 1,250.8; the lowest in Broward County. The crime rate change from 2010 to 2011 is a drop of 2.6%.

Congratulations are in order to Chief Kevin Butler, all of the deputies and the support staff, who come to work in Weston each and every day and make Weston the safest place in Broward County.

THE GOOD NEWS

Residents can help that rate decline even further. Crime reports in Weston show that the city's largest crime is theft from unlocked vehicles.

The Broward Sheriff's office urges residents to LOCK YOUR CARS and report any suspicious persons or activity.

Just last week, two suspects breaking into vehicles in the Tequesta Lake community were tracked and arrested after an alert neighbor called 9-1-1. The individuals arrested are residents.

BSO OFFERS SUMMER PROGRAM – Weston residents, ages 11-17, have the opportunity to be a part of a program initiated by the Broward Sheriff's Office-Weston: *The Weston University – Broward Sheriff's Office Police Services Academy*.



In its fifth year, the academy provides youth the opportunity to explore law enforcement services on an in-depth basis with hands-on exercises, education and safety training, and exposes students to a variety of career paths. The eight week, once a week academy, takes place June 18th thru August 6th. This free program is enriching, educational and FUN. Tied into the city's

Weston University Program, the academy offers an extension of civics education to students wanting something a little different than the average summer fare.

STROKE AWARENESS Continuing Information

May is Stroke Awareness Month and an excellent time to set about increasing our community's knowledge on stroke

What is my risk for stroke? Your risk of stroke depends on several factors.

- **Age.** Nearly three-quarters of all strokes occur in people aged 65 years or older, with the chances of having a stroke doubling each decade after the age of 55, according to the CDC. Even so, stroke can occur at any age, with nearly 25% occurring in people younger than 27.
- **Gender.** Each year, about 55,000 more women than men have strokes, according to the National Stroke Association, although incidence at younger ages is higher in men than women.
- **Race.** Stroke death rates are twice as high for African Americans than for whites, even at younger ages, according to the CDC. Pacific Islander and Hispanic populations also are at higher risk of stroke than whites.
- Family history of stroke. Every family member of someone who has had a stroke is at increased risk of stroke.
- *High blood pressure*. Several studies have found hypertension to be the most prevalent and modifiable risk factor for stroke.
- Elevated cholesterol.
- Lifestyle. This includes smoking, alcohol use, exercise and diet.
- *Diabetes*. The risk for stroke is 2 to 4 times higher among people with diabetes. In 2004, stroke was noted on 16% of diabetes-related death certificates among people aged 65 years or older.
- Atrial fibrillation (irregular heartbeat). Atrial fibrillation is responsible for 15% to 20% of ischemic strokes. Atrial fibrillation increases one's risk of suffering an ischemic stroke by five times, according to a report from the American Heart Association.
- **Myocardial infarction** (heart attack). The incidence of ischemic stroke is approximately 1% to 2% per year after MI, with the greatest risk occurring in the first month after the MI, according to reports cited in <u>guidelines</u> from the National Stroke Association.

Keep in mind stroke risk can change as you age. Risk for stroke as a young or middle-aged adult may be low, but may become very high. For example, researchers found that 45-year-old men who have all risk factors well controlled have less than a 2% risk of having a heart attack or stroke in their lifetime. Add one or two more risk factors, and the risk jumps to 50%. A 45-year-old woman with low risk factors has a 4% chance of having a heart attack stroke, but add one or two risk factors, her chances increase 31%.





SHELTER RENTALS FOR YOUR SPRING FLING!

The City of Weston has picnic shelters available for rent within the Weston Regional Park and Emerald Estates Park. These shelters are covered with an aluminum roof and have 4 picnic tables on a concrete pad. Shelter amenities also include electric (110V) and water as well as a grill. By reserving and renting a shelter at one of these two parks, park personnel will ensure that it is available for only your use on the reserved day.

Shelters or gazeboes in all other parks are first come-first serve and do not have a fee.

Fee for Shelter Rental:

Weekdays \$60 (entire day), plus applicable tax

Weekends and Holidays \$80 (entire day), plus applicable tax

Bounce houses (without water) are permitted near the picnic shelters, provided the company provides the City with proof of insurance naming the City of Weston as "Additional Insured".

Animals are not permitted in Weston Regional Park and alcohol is not permitted in any city park.



Those interested in renting a picnic shelter must fill out a **Reservation Agreement with payment**, at the Weston Community Center.



SCHOOL BOARD REDISTRICTING PROJECT

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IS SOUGHT



The School Board of Broward County, Florida has initiated the process for preparing a new School Board district map based on the 2010 Census data. Redistricting is the process of redrawing the lines of districts from which public officials are elected to balance the populations of the districts and ensure residents have equal representation on the School Board.

It is important to know that the map revision will not change which schools students attend, nor will it change bus stops or the availability of transportation to schools.

The 2011-2013 redistricting project, currently underway, provides for extensive public participation

through a series of public hearings – one in each of the seven districts throughout the county – to inform the public about the process and requirements for drawing new School Board district map alternatives and receive input.

The School board invitation letter and flyers for the mapping workshops and public hearings, translated in multiple languages, have been posted on the Weston website on the SCHOOLS page at http://www.westonfl.org/Residents/Schools/SchoolsHome.aspx - scroll to the bottom of the page.

The next mapping workshop will occur on Saturday, May 5, 2012 at Dillard High School, 2501 NW 11 Street, Fort Lauderdale, FL beginning at 10 am.

The next public hearing will be occur in District 3 on Thursday, May 9, 2012 at the City of Pembroke Pines Senior Center, 301 NW 103 Avenue, Pembroke Pines, FL beginning at 6 pm.
