WESTON TO BE AWARDED CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT FOR EXCELLENCE IN FINANCIAL REPORTING


For the 14TH consecutive year, the City of Weston, through Treasurer Darrel Thomas, has been notified that it will be awarded the **Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting** (CAFR) for its comprehensive annual financial report for the Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2011. The award, presented by the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) of the U.S. and Canada, is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting.

Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Program (CAFR Program)

The GFOA established the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Program in 1945 to encourage and assist state and local governments to go beyond the minimum requirements of generally accepted accounting principles, to prepare comprehensive annual financial reports that evidence the spirit of transparency and full disclosure and then to recognize individual governments that succeed in achieving that goal.



Judging process - The CAFR has been judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program including demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the CAFR.

2012 BROWARD COUNTY PROPERTY TAX BILLS HAVE BEEN MAILED TAXES ARE DUE BEGINNING NOVEMBER 1, 2012



Broward County Records, Taxes and Treasury Division has mailed the property tax bills for 2012, which must be paid no later than March 31, 2013 to avoid penalties and delinquency fees.

Property taxes may be paid early to take advantage of discounts: taxes paid in November 2012 receive a 4% discount; December 2012 receive a 3% discount; January 2013 receive a 2% discount; February 2013 receive a 1% discount.

Property owners without mortgages, or those who do not make use of an escrow arrangement, may pay their taxes in a variety of ways:

- Online Credit Card/Debit Card: Visit <u>broward.county-taxes.com</u>. There is an additional non-refundable fee for this service.
- Online Electronic Check: Visit <u>broward.county-taxes.com</u>. There is no fee for this service.
- Mail: Use the envelope enclosed with your tax bill or mail payment to Broward County Tax Collector, Processing Center, P.O. Box 11905, Newark, NJ. The postmark date will be used to determine the applicable discount amount.
- In Person:
 - Broward County Records, Taxes & Treasury Division, Tax & License Section,
 115 S. Andrews Ave., Room A-100, Fort Lauderdale, 8:30 a.m. 5 p.m.
 - At any one of the <u>77 Wells Fargo Bank Branches</u> in Broward County, until March 31, checks only.
- Partial Payments: Current taxes may be paid in up to five partial payments. A \$10 processing fee applies to each payment. Each of the first four payments must be a minimum of \$100. No discount is allowed. The final payment must be paid in full by March 31, or the balance due will be subject to penalties and interest.

BICYCLES ARE VEHICLES

Avoiding Accidents

As a bicyclist, the key to avoiding accidents is to always stay aware of your surroundings, use caution at all times, and to know/practice the Bicycle Laws and Safety Tips correctly.

Opening Car Doors/Parked Cars

Some crashes are the result of a motorist opening the door of a parked car in front of an overtaking bike. Avoid this by riding no closer than three feet to a parked car. Also, be sure to watch for signs that a motorist wants to move into traffic. Be prepared to use the "Panic Stop."



Overtaking Cars

Statistically, this is not a big problem during the daylight hours. It usually occurs at night on rural roads and involves an unlighted bicyclist and a motorist. Many bicyclists worry about what is behind them (this is why some ride against traffic). Becoming proficient at scanning (See Scanning Tips) to occasionally check traffic to the rear will ease worries about involvement in this type of accident.



Scanning Tips

Like most riding skills, scanning to the rear takes practice. If you have trouble looking over your shoulder without swerving, try the following:

- Get a friend to hold your handlebars while you sit on the bike. Look over your left shoulder keeping both hands on the handlebars, and notice what your hands, arms, and shoulders are doing. Your left side is probably pulling back on the handlebar.
- After a little practice at moving only your head, find an empty parking lot and try it while riding in a straight line. Then try dropping your left hand and resting it on your thigh while looking over your left shoulder and coasting for a while.

Communicating With Others

Always signal your intentions and needs. If a motorist gives delay temporarily while you are maneuvering, give a friendly wave of thanks. Being courteous promotes a safer riding environment and reduces incidents of road rage or aggressive driving.

TRAVEL SAFETY TIPS

The holidays are approaching fast and many Broward County residents will be taking vacations or leaving town to visit with family and friends. The Broward Sheriff's Office reminds everyone that there are certain security-minded steps to take before leaving town. Knowing your home is protected will put your mind at ease while being out of town; The Broward Sheriff Office offers the Free Home Watch Program.

What is the Home Watch Program?

Once you have signed up for the Home Watch Program, a deputy, community service aide or BSO volunteer will check on your home regularly while you are out of town. An exterior check of the home will be conducted to make sure there have been no unlawful entries and that no other obvious problems have occurred outside of your home.

Additional Home Security Tips

- 1. Make sure home appears occupied. Consider placing lights on a timer.
- 2. Disconnect automatic opener to garage.
- 3. Let a trusted neighbor know you are leaving, provide spare key and to call 911 for anyone not authorized on property.
- 4. Install good locks on all doors and windows.
- 5. **NEVER** leave a message on telephone answering machine stating you are out of town!
- 6. Leave window blinds as you normally would if you were home.
- 7. Invite your neighbor to park car in your driveway.
