WESTON WELCOMES TWO NEW CITY COMMISSIONERS

City Hall was filled to standing room only on Monday, November 19, 2012. The event was the swearing in ceremony for Weston's new Mayor, Daniel J. Stermer, and two City Commissioners, Angel M. Gomez (Seat 1) and Thomas M. Kallman (Seat 2).

The Broward Sheriff's Office Honor Guard performed the official salute and then joined in the Pledge of Allegiance that was led by students from Indian Trace Elementary School.

Commissioner Kallman was administered the oath of office by long-time friend, former State Representative and now newly elected County Commissioner Martin Kiar. Tom's daughter was in the audience to proudly watch her father take the dais after speaking of his long standing belief of giving back to the community.

Next Commissioner Gomez was administered his oath of office for a second term in office, by outgoing City Commissioner and friend, Mercedes Henriksson. He stood with his wife and children before thanking his family, many of whom traveled from Mexico to be with him, and the Weston community for supporting him in a second term.

Last to be sworn in was Weston's Mayor Daniel Stermer. Having served as a Commissioner from 2002 – 2010, the Mayor is no stranger to Weston or serving his community. The Honorable Congresswoman Debbie Wasserman Schultz proudly administered the oath of office as Mayor Stermer stood with his wife and son (two children are away at school.) Mayor Stermer addressed the legacy that he takes over from Mayor Eric Hersh, who was in the audience to congratulate him, and Weston's first Mayor Harry Rosen. He poignantly spoke, stating that "There is no 'I' in Weston, but there is 'We', and that the evening represents the orderly transition of our elected representatives and the mission, drive and reason why those that have had the honor to serve and those of us that do now, do so".



In its 20th year, "Children Helping Children" remained the theme of the Harvest Drive where children throughout Broward County schools assisted in the efforts of collecting food and necessities for a Thanksgiving meal and a week's worth of food for those in need.



This year Cypress Bay joined the list of distribution sites bringing the participating schools in the county to 170. The Harvest Fest was started in 1992 by Renee Herman and the original distribution site was Country Isles Elementary School in Weston. Renee has attracted a dedicated volunteer group of "worker bees" which grows each and every year. Renee has an enthusiasm, dedication, warmth and infectious spirit that lifts all who meet her. You're hooked and you help. But for Renee everything is about helping to feed those in need AND teaching children to give back and share, providing them with the joy she knows one feels after helping others.

Over 2000 families were served this year and non-perishables were also provided to the E.A.S.E. organization in Davie whose building had burnt down; E.A.S.E also assists families in need.

At Cypress Bay alone, 52 families were served. Each and every family is provided with 6-10 bags of food and necessities for the week and a gift card to purchase the non-perishables such as the turkey and pie for Thanksgiving dinner. At Western High School, a clothing boutique was also established for participants to "shop" for what they need.

Families are referred by Broward County social workers and social service agencies and include many right in our own backyard. Family names remain anonymous to volunteers.

CYBER SAFETY TIPS FOR CHILDREN FROM THE BROWARD SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Think B4 UPost



Technology today has turned many of us into publishers of information, pictures and videos. When used appropriately, these technologies provide tremendous opportunity for creativity. However, some children and young people are hiding behind their screens to *gossip* and *bully* their classmates.

There is nothing funny about it!

Posting inappropriate messages about people, or sending disturbing text messages or e-mails can be considered a crime. Bullying via text or e-mail is still bullying!

What can parents do?

Remind your children that the choice to hit send it theirs. Ask them – is this message really important? How would they feel it someone said something negative about them?

Have your kids ask themselves these 5 questions before you post anything!

- Would your grandma want to see that?
- 2. Do you really think that's private?
- 3. Would you say that to someone's face?
- 4. Is that your work to publish?
- 5. What is someone published a photo like that of you?

Remind children that they are responsible for their own actions!
