ROUNDABOUT PROJECT: LAKEVIEW DRIVE AND SADDLE CLUB ROAD

A project Open House will be held in the City Commission Chambers in Weston City Hall, to provide an overview of the proposed improvements to the intersection of Lakeview Drive and Saddle Club Road. The City is planning to convert this intersection from the current four-way stop to a roundabout.

In addition to improving safety, roundabouts have been shown to significantly reduce congestion, delay, fuel use and greenhouse gas emissions.

The City has been awarded a grant from the Florida Department of Transportation for construction of the roundabout.

The City Traffic Engineer and Project Manager will be on-hand to answer questions. Please stop in anytime between 12 noon and 2pm.

Weston City Hall is located at 17200 Royal Palm Boulevard, Weston, FL 33326



A roundabout is a circular intersection at which traffic is slowed down and enters a one-way stream around a central island.

Statistically, roundabouts are safer for drivers and pedestrians than both traffic circles and traditional intersections.

Millage Rate to Remain the Same

The Fiscal Year 2013 Adopted Budgets for the City of Weston, the Bonaventure Development District, and the Indian Trace Development District are available for viewing on the City website.

The recommended budget is based on an ad valorem millage rate of 2.0000 mils for the third consecutive year. This is the lowest millage rate in Broward County.

- The construction of a roundabout at the Lakeview Drive/Saddle Club Road intersection
- Stable assessments in the Bonaventure Development District
- Stable assessments in the Indian Trace Development District
- Fourth year of the traffic signage rehabilitation program
- Phase II of the lift station maintenance program
- Sewer line repair and maintenance program

Richard Schwartz, who is known by literally thousands of parents and kids within our community was nominated by Weston's Parks & Recreation Director Don Decker, and was awarded the 2012 Voluntary Service Award by the Florida Recreation & Park Association (FRPA).

This annual, state-wide award recognizes individuals whose voluntary contributions of time and efforts over a period of time, have improved the quality and quantity of leisure opportunities through parks, recreation and leisure service programs and projects. Contributions must be made over a minimum of three years and must have resulted in a heightened awareness of the benefits of parks and recreation.

Rich is currently the President of the Sports Alliance (and has been for 8 years now) and is Commissioner of AYSO Region 644. In 2006, under his leadership, the league started the AYSO Select developmental program to train and develop players to go on to State and National Games. So that no children are left out, he emphasizes the importance of the VIP program for emotionally and physically challenged individuals. As if not enough, he encourages the soccer community to give back, including holding food and clothing drives, and participating in numerous charitable organizations.

At the September 24, 2012 Weston City Commission meeting, Rich was recognized and thanked for his invaluable commitment and untold hours of community service. The Mayor presented him with a small gift of appreciation that he can hopefully use in his "spare" time.

COUNTRY ISLES ELEMENTARY PTA

AWARDED A \$54,780 ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION GRANT

On October 1st the Country Isles Elementary School PTA handed a huge check, both literally and figuratively. \$54,780 grant was awarded to the school PTA for Environmental Education Enrichment by the State Farm Youth Advisory Board. Country Isles PTA is one of 68 community organizations across the US and Canada that were selected, of which 11 were in Florida and Country Isles being the only elementary school.

The grant funding was approved to enhance the current school curriculum by creating a special science laboratory that all classes will utilize, to install an outdoor gardening space for 3rd graders and establish an Environmental Club. This very "green" program will provide students with hands-on science experience and according to Principal Mindy Morgan "will teach them the importance of taking care of the environment for future generations, which is invaluable." Principal Morgan advised those in attendance that the Lab will ___ be up and operational this coming December.

NEW 595 EXPRESS SERVICE FROM WESTON ROAD

Broward County Transit and the Florida Department of Transportation launched a new 595 Express Bus service to Miami beginning on October 1st. Complimentary rides will be offered during the first week of service.

- Southbound morning service will depart the Westgate Square Park-and-Ride to Miami Civic Center from 5:20AM up to 8:10AM, every 30 minutes.
- Northbound afternoon buses to Westgate Square (from NW 19 Street & NW 10 Ave., Miami) begin at 3:10PM up to 7:40PM, every 30 minutes.

THE BUSES

The 595 Express Bus fleet are new hybrid buses equipped with free WiFi, hi-back seats and 12-volt power outlets for charging electronics.

COST

\$2.35 for a one-way adult fare or a Premium 31-Day Bus Pass for \$85 which includes Express and regular bus service. A Premium 10-Ride Pass is \$23.50.




DOLPHIN TALE October 13th at 8:00pm

BICYCLES ARE VEHICLES...A Continuing Series Safety Equipment Do's & Don'ts

Helmets

Nearly 75% of all bicycle-related deaths are the result of head injuries. The use of helmets would prevent many of these deaths. Some tests suggest that a hard-shell helmet lined with polyester is more effective than other types in preventing head injury.





Upon purchase, a knowledgeable professional should assist you with selection and proper fit. Make sure that the helmet meets the "Consumer Product Safety Commission 1999" helmet safety standard.

Wearing A Helmet

A bicycle rider or passenger who is under 16 years of age must wear a bicycle helmet that is properly fitted and is fastened securely upon the passenger's head by a strap, and meets the federal safety standard for bicycle helmets. The term "passenger" includes a child who is riding in a trailer or semitrailer attached to a bicycle.

Gloves

Gloves provide protection for hands in case of a fall & better grip for handlebars.





Headsets

A bicyclist must not wear a headset, headphone, or other listening device (other than a hearing aid) when riding. Wearing a headset blocks out important audio cues needed to detect the presence of other traffic.

HURRICANE NAMES 2012

Have you ever wondered how hurricanes are named?

Originally, hurricanes were designated by a system of latitude-longitude, which was a great way for meteorologists to track them. However, things got very confusing once the public began receiving multiple storm warnings and wanted to follow a particular storm. Therefore, a system of names was created to help refer to them, easier

tracking and remembrance purposes.

In 1953, the National Weather Service picked up on the habit of Naval meteorologists naming the storms after women. In 1979, male names were inserted to alternate with the female ones.



There are actually six lists of names in use for storms in the Atlantic. These lists rotate, one each year; the list of this year's names will not be reused for six years. The names get recycled each time the list comes up, with one exception: storms so devastating that reusing the name is inappropriate. In this case, the name is taken off the list and another name is used to replace it; there will not be another Hurricane Andrew, because Andrew has been replaced by Alex on the list.


