WESTON THANKS MAYOR HERSH AND COMMISSIONER HENRIKSSON FOR SERVICE TO COMMUNITY



At the City Commission meeting of October 15, 2012, Mayor Eric Hersh and Commissioner Mercedes Henriksson were honored for their years of dedicated service to our community.

The Mayor was the longest serving member of the City Commission and with his service on the Indian Trace Development District prior to Weston's incorporation, he has given 19 consecutive years of public service to the residents of Weston. Commissioner Henriksson served two consecutive four-year terms in office, the maximum currently allowable under the City's Charter. The dedication and selfless devotion of both individuals was recognized and applauded as a full house looked on in appreciation of their vast accomplishments while in office.

In his speech praising Commissioner Henriksson, Mayor Hersh detailed the legacy she leaves behind – one of enormous proportion - along with an unmatched personality, professional ability, and sensibility that will be greatly missed, and recognized for her personal sacrifices of time and family. 

For the integrity that he arrived with and departs with.


Given this 15th day of October 2012 by the City Commission, City Manager, and the people of Weston

October 15, 2012 was the last regular City Commission meeting that Mayor Hersh and Commissioner Henriksson would preside over, as sitting members of the Weston City Commission.

On November 19, 2012, the Mayor will call the meeting to order and Weston's new Mayor and two Commissioners will be sworn into office. The Weston municipal election will be held during the General Election on Tuesday, November 6, 2012 with City Commission Seat One on the ballot for voters. The seat of Mayor and Commission Seat Two was unopposed.

That evening Daniel J. Stermer will be sworn in as Mayor and Thomas M. Kallman as Commissioner, along with the winner of the election for Commission Seat One.

In Weston, the Mayor and Commissioners are elected at large for four-year terms, meaning that all voters can vote for the Mayor and/or each Commission Seat up for election. They are elected by a plurality, meaning that the candidate receiving the highest number of votes is elected.

Early Voting

<u>Seventeen Early Voting Sites</u> are open Saturday, October 27th through Saturday, November 3rd from 7:00am – 7:00pm, for the 2012 General Election. All registered voters are eligible to vote.

The Weston Branch Library is the Weston Early Voting Site, located at 4205 Bonaventure Boulevard, Weston, Florida. Click on the list of sites above to find other convenient locations.

Voting an Absentee Ballot

The voter must personally vote the ballot (unless assistance is required due to blindness, disability or inability to read or write). The voter must sign the return envelope. Voted absentee ballots must be received by the Supervisor of Elections office no later than 7p.m. on Election Day. A voted ballot cannot be accepted at a polling place. It must be mailed with \$1.50 in postage or dropped off at an Absentee Ballot location.

BICYCLES ARE VEHICLES

Left Turns, Signaling Turns & Failure to Yield

As a bicyclist, it's very important to know and demonstrate the proper maneuvers for making left turns, signaling turns, and when to yield. These maneuvers are set in place purposely to help in avoiding accidents and injuries to both the bicyclist and motorist.

Left Turns

A bicyclist intending to make a left turn is entitled to full use of the lane from which the turn is made. After scanning, signaling and moving to the center of the lane, the bicyclist must check the signal, and then proceed when it is green and safe to do so. In addition to the normal left turn, a bicyclist may proceed through the right-most portion of the intersection and turn as close the curb or edge as possible at the far side. After complying with any official traffic control device, the bicyclist may proceed in the new direction of travel.

A bicyclist is to dismount and walk through the intersection in the crosswalk like a pedestrian.

Signaling Turns

A signal of intention to turn must be given by the bicyclist during the last 100 feet traveling before turning. If the bicyclist needs both hands for control, the signal need not be given continuously. A bicyclist may signal intent to turn right either by extending the left hand and arm upward or by extending the right hand and arm horizontally to the right side of the bicycle.



Failure to Yield



A crash may be caused by failure on the part of the bicyclist or motorist to yield the right-of-way at driveways and intersections. Making eye contact with a motorist will help. Bicyclists can help prevent accidents by yielding the right-of-way when required to, stopping for red lights and stop signs, are scanning to make sure the way clear before turning left.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

Candy Safety

Halloween is right around the corner! Kids are now counting down the days for the one night out of the year they get to dress up spooky and collect as much candy as possible! Some safety tips should be considered before allowing your child to consume any candy obtained:

- 1. Instruct children not to open their candy until they return home.
- 2. Inspect all candy for tampering before allowing them to start eating.
- 3. Accept only wrapped and packaged candy.
- 4. Do not eat candy that has been unwrapped or opened.
- 5. Never eat fruit or other unwrapped items from strangers.
- 6. Prevent a tummy ache by limiting 2- 3 small pieces of candy at a time
- 7. Throw away any candy or food that is not wrapped tightly by the candy company.
- 8. If you should find an object in the candy or find anything unusual about it, call the police department.
- 9. Do not give homemade or unwrapped treats to children.
- 10. Remember, some children have to follow certain dietary restrictions which prohibit them from eating the traditional treats we offer on Halloween.
- 11. Avoid giving choking hazards such as gum, peanuts, hard candies, or small toys as treats to young children.
 - 12. Give children an early meal before they head out to discourage snacking.13. Watch for signs of tampering, such as small pinholes in wrappers and torn or loose packages.
 - 14. Accept and give out candy that isn't easily unwrapped. Candies such as Tootsie Rolls, hard candies and certain bubble gums with twist-type wrappings can be tampered with more easily than those that are sealed.


