At the City Commission meeting on Monday, October 15, 2012, Mayor Eric Hersh and Commissioner Mercedes Henriksson will be honored for their service to the community during a Term of Office Ceremony. The October 15th meeting will be the final regular City Commission meeting that they will each preside over, yet they will remain in office until after the election and the new members are sworn in on November 19th.

The dedication and selfless devotion of both Mayor Hersh and Commissioner Henriksson will be extolled as well as the vast accomplishments completed while in office. As public servants whose positions are part-time, they have each maintained full time professional employment and raised families, all the while making personal sacrifices of time and family to ensure that Weston's development was skillfully shaped and the city's finances remained strong. Weston's AAA credit ratings, and recognition as one of *America's Best Places to Live*, without a doubt are an embodiment of their efforts. Weston is their home and their passion and we will be forever grateful for all they have done to make it absolutely the best place to live.

Mayor Hersh is the longest serving member of the City Commission. Before Weston's incorporation, he was Vice Chair of the Indian Trace Development District from November 1993 until September 1996. After the vote on incorporation, Hersh was elected to the first City Commission from September 1996 to March 2001. Hersh ran successfully for Mayor in 2001 and has held that position ever since. His term of office now comes to a close due to term limits that he himself spearheaded for adoption while in office.

BIKES ARE VEHICLES

Night Riding & Lighting

Nearly 60% of all adult fatal bicycle accidents in Florida occur during twilight and night hours.

Many factors play a role on why riding at night is dangerous, such as:

- Motorists driving under the influence of alcohol
- Motorists abilities to see what is ahead is limited to the area illuminated by headlights
- Visibility is further reduced by the glare from lights of oncoming cars
- Roadways with motor vehicles speeds above 40 mph pose extreme risk at night
- Red reflectors on the rear of the bicycle may be mistaken for reflectors on mail boxes

New Florida Statute 316.2065

As of January 1, 2013- Every bicycle has to meet lighting equipment standards or is subject to warnings/fines issued by Law Enforcement. The act was approved by the Governor on April 27, 2012.

Every bicycle in use between sunset and sunrise shall be equipped with a lamp on the front exhibiting a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front and a lamp along with a reflector on the rear each exhibiting a red light visible from a distance of 600 feet to the rear. A bicycle or its rider may be equipped with lights or reflectors in addition to those required by this section.

A Law Enforcement Officer may issue a bicycle safety brochure and a verbal warning to a bicycle rider who violates this subsection or may issue a citation and assess a fine for pedestrian violation. The court shall dismiss the charge against a bicycle rider for a first violation of this subsection upon proof of purchase and installation of the proper lighting equipment.

No parent of any minor child and no guardian of any minor ward may authorize or knowingly permit any such minor child or ward to violate any of the provisions of this section.

ADVANCED CABLE CONVERTING TO DIGITAL

Digital Platform Begins October 29th

Customers Need To Take Action To Avoid Losing Channels

Some residents will need to get a FREE digital transport adapter (DTA) to continue to receive basic cable service on older model TV sets (generally prior to 2005). Advanced Cable customers will be receiving a letter from the company explaining all of this information.

Why: It will provide more bandwidth for new programming, more HD channels and enhanced services.

When: You should act by 10/15/12 to start enjoying enhanced picture and sound quality and to avoid the possibility of losing any channels as the upgrade is completed.

Is Your TV Ready:

- If your TV is currently connected to an Advanced Cable digital converter box there is nothing you need to do.
- If your TV has a built-in Digital QAM tuner there is nothing you need to do. *To find out if your TV has this QAM tuner*, using your TV set's remote, see if you can tune to Channel #64.1. If you can see this test channel there is nothing you need to do.

However, if you don't see this test screen at first, use the auto program/auto tune function of your TV set. This process will have your tuner scan for all available channels. You can usually find auto tune or auto program in the MENU of your TV. Select auto tune or auto program and follow the onscreen prompts. If you still don't see the test screen, your TV does not have the proper digital QAM tuner and you will need a DTA.

Florida's seniors are inundated with investment offers and requests for charitable contributions and are being exposed to targeted fraud opportunities. RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING A SUCCESS IN BROWARD COUNTY

Recycling in Broward County is up to 13 percent over 2011, thanks to the increased efforts of residents. The County is now on its way toward meeting Florida's 75 percent recycling goal as residents recycle as much as they can of paper, cardboard, plastic bottles, metal, and glass containers.



Residential recycling has increased steadily over the years, from 58,917 tons in 2006, to more than 65,590 tons last year, an increase of 11 percent, not including this year's rise.

Most Broward County cities including Weston, use the "All-in-One" recycling system (single-stream recycling), in which recyclable items don't have to be sorted from one another. Instead of placing items into two separate containers, recyclable

items can all be placed in the same container.

Environmental benefits of recycling include energy savings, a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions linked to climate change, and sustainability of resources.




