ADVANCED CABLE CONVERTING TO DIGITAL WHAT THIS MEANS TO YOU AND WHAT YOU NEED TO DO

Advanced Cable will be implementing a network upgrade to an all-digital delivery platform

Some residents will need to get a FREE digital transport adapter (DTA) to continue to receive basic cable service on older model TV sets (generally prior to 2005). Advanced Cable customers will be receiving a letter from the company explaining all of this information.

Why: It will provide more bandwidth for new programming, more HD channels and enhanced services.

When: You should act by 10/15/12 to start enjoying enhanced picture and sound quality and to avoid the possibility of losing any channels as the upgrade is completed.

Is Your TV Ready:

- If your TV is currently connected to an Advanced Cable digital converter box there is nothing you need to do.
- If your TV has a built-in Digital QAM tuner there is nothing you need to do. *To find out if your TV has this QAM tuner*, using your TV set's remote, see if you can tune to Channel #64.1. If you can see this test channel there is nothing you need to do.

However, if you don't see this test screen at first, use the auto program/auto tune function of your TV set. This process will have your tuner scan for all available channels. You can usually find auto tune or auto program in the MENU of your TV. Select auto tune or auto program and follow the onscreen prompts. If you still don't see the test screen, your TV does not have the proper digital QAM tuner and you will need a DTA.

How To Get the Free Digital Adapter: Order online, call or pickup in person.

AFTER THE STORM HAS SAFELY PASSED...

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS - A Continuing Series

Here are a few important tips for after the storm has safely passed:



- Stay tuned to local media and/or NOAA radio.
- Return to your home or venture outdoors only after local officials tell you it is safe to do so.
- Inspect your home for damage. If your home is unsafe or badly damaged, locate other accommodations. To assist BSO with emergency response priorities, participate in the Snapshot Damage Assessment Program.
- Beware of fallen power lines. While electricity may be out, service can be restored at any time and lines may become "hot."
- If you have no power, use flashlights for illumination. Never use candles or lanterns because of the risk of fire. Cook outdoors using charcoal or propane grills/stoves. Do not cook over open fires, especially if debris is in the area.
- Avoid driving as much as possible. If you must be on the roads, remember that many traffic signals may be inoperative. Treat all intersections as though they are a 4-way stop.

Water treatment safety tips to follow if your water source become contaminated:

- 1. Begin by filtering water with a coffee filter to remove any solid materials that may be floating in the water.
- 2. Bring the water to a rolling boil for one minute, then allow the water to cool for 30 minutes.
- 3. Add 16 drops of chlorine bleach per gallon of water, or 8 drops per 2-liter bottle. The only active ingredient in the bleach should be hypochlorite of a concentration of 5.25% to 6%. Make sure the bleach does not contain any perfumes or soaps.
- 4. Let water remain standing for thirty minutes.
- 5. Use the water only if it smells of chlorine. If it doesn't, add another round of drops (16 per gallon and 8 per 2-liter bottle). If you still don't smell chlorine, discard the water and find another source.

CHILD CAR SEAT REQUIREMENTS

Florida law requires children less than 5 years of age to be properly restrained no matter where they are seated in a vehicle. Children through age 3 must be secured in a separate carrier (child safety seat) or in a vehicle manufacturer's integrated child safety seat. For children ages 4 - 5, a separate carrier, an integrated child safety seat, or a safety belt may be used. If a safety belt does not fit the child correctly, a booster set should be used to correctly position the lap and shoulder belts once they outgrow forward facing child safety seats (generally at about 40 pounds and 4 years old). Children from approximately 40-80 pounds and under 4'9" in height should ride in a booster seat.

Infants must ride rear-facing until they are at least one year old *and* weigh 20 pounds or more. Rear-facing, the infant should be semi-upright at an angle or no more than 45 degrees. A forward-facing older child should ride sitting upright







Never place a child in a child safety seat in the front seat of a vehicle equipped with a passenger air bag. Always use the back seat.

Violation of the child restraint law carries a fine of \$60 and 3 points on the driving record.
