#### **APOLLO HAS TAKEN OFF!**

After 12 years of honorable and dedicated service to the citizens of Broward County, Apollo, an 18-year-old Belgian Draft horse, is retiring. As a member of the Broward Sheriff's Office Mounted Unit, Apollo patrolled the streets of Broward County, helped with crowd control and took part in numerous parades. The past two years have been spent mainly in the City of Weston, where he is a familiar face to the many students he has met during countless career days.

On Tuesday, September 18<sup>th</sup>, Apollo and his partner, Dave Smith, worked side-by-side at their last career day at Imagine Charter School in Weston.





The schools' kindergarten and first-graders had an opportunity to hear about Apollo's BSO duties, watch him gallop, pet him and even present him with a farewell carrot-shaped cake!

After hanging up his horse shoes, Apollo will be living at Mill Creek Farm in Alachua, Florida. There he will join other retired law enforcement horses to share stories and gallop freely around the 265-acre farm. #### **BICYCLES ARE VEHICLES**

In Florida a bicycle is legally defined as a vehicle. Bicyclists have rights to the roadway with exceptions, and must obey the same traffic laws as other vehicles. The laws include: stopping for stop signs and red lights, right with the flow of traffic, using lights at night, and yielding to right-of-way when entering a roadway.

#### **Bicycle Regulations FSS 316.2065**

- Must obey all traffic controls and signals.
- Must use a fixed, regular seat for riding.
- May not be used to carry for more than the number it is designed or equipped for.
- Rider must carry any passenger who is a child under 4 years of age, weighs less than 40 lbs in a seat or carrier designed to carry and protect the child from moving parts of the bicycle.



- Riders must keep at least one hand on the handlebars while riding.
- Every bicycle must be equipped with a brake or brakes that allow the rider to stop within 25 feet from a speed of 10 miles per hour on dry level, clean pavement.
- Parents and guardians must not knowingly allow a minor ward to violate any provisions of this section.



### **Bicycle Registration**

The Broward Sheriff's Office has developed the Bike Tracking Registration System to help reduce the number of bicycle thefts in Broward County and to support law enforcement officers in their efforts to recover lost or stolen bicycles.

# PROCESS OF HOW A STORM BECOMES A CATEGORY HURRICANE

The National Hurricane Center has declared, June 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup> as "The Atlantic Ocean hurricane season." When determining the severity of the storm, the National Weather Service uses the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale; used only to describe hurricanes formed in the Atlantic Ocean and Northern Pacific Ocean.

A storm that is classified as a hurricane must first be recognized as a Tropical Cyclone. A tropical cyclone is a rotating, organized system of clouds and thunderstorms that originates counterclockwise over tropical or subtropical waters. They are classified as follows:

**Tropical Depression**: A tropical cyclone with maximum sustained winds of 38 mph or less.



**Tropical Storm**: A tropical cyclone with maximum

sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph.

#### **Categories Sustained Winds**

1	74-95 mph
2	96-119 mph
3	111-129 mph
4	130-156 mph
5	157 mph or higher

(Once winds exceed 73 mph, they are classified hurricanes and based on wind severity are catorgorized from a **1-5**. The classifications can provide some indication of potential damage and flooding caused upon landfall.) **Category 3 or higher** are considered "major" hurricanes; Their potential is significant for loss of life and damage.

Healthy Eating for All: Participants will learn about plant-based

nutrition (fruits, vegetables and grains) and the role they play in health, fitness and performance, as well as how to use a meal plate to guide healthful eating.

<u>Miranda Rights: What You Need to Know/Police Interaction Seminar</u>: A brief history of Miranda Rights will be presented along with other information including how Miranda Rights are triggered, what they mean, why they are important and how they are used by law enforcement officials.

<u>Brain Gym for Parents:</u> Participants will learn a series of 26 movements that can improve concentration and focus, memory, academics and test-taking ability, physical coordination, relationships, self-responsibility, organization and attitude.

#### PET VACCINATIONS FOR DOGS AND CATS

Special clinic events help prepare pets for the remainder of hurricane season

In celebration of World Rabies Day next week, and to help residents prepare for the remainder of hurricane season, Broward County Animal Care and Adoption is offering several opportunities for residents to have their pet vaccinated through September 30.

With a little more than two months left in the 2012 hurricane season, Broward pet owners are reminded that they have more options available to them in the event of an evacuation when their pet is vaccinated and registered. The County's pet-friendly shelter, boarding kennels and most pet-friendly hotels require proof of vaccination and registration.



## Pet owners will be able to take advantage of two upcoming neighborhood Wellness Clinics:

- Saturday, September 29, 10 a.m. 1:30 p.m., Miramar Library, 2050 Civic Center Place
- Saturday, September 22, 1 4 p.m., Collins Community Center, 3900 N.E. 3rd Ave., Oakland Park



Services include rabies vaccination, Broward County pet registration tag, parvo/distemper vaccine for dogs and FVRCP vaccine for cats. **Cost is \$20 (cash only) per pet**.

No appointment is necessary and pets will be vaccinated on a first-come, first-served basis. You must be a Broward County resident to attend. All dogs must be on leashes and all cats must be in carriers.

In addition, cat owners can bring their felines to the following local location for vaccinations:

• Discount Pet Clinic, 6902 Stirling Road, Davie. Vaccinations are available Monday through Friday from 8:30 to noon and 2 to 5 p.m. Sunday from 2 to 4:30 p.m.

Cats will receive a rabies and FVRCP vaccine. In addition, a Broward County pet registration tag will be issued. **The cost per pet is \$20 (cash only)**. You must be a Broward County resident to attend. All cats must be in carriers.

# K9 WATER FESTIVALS

All dogs must be sociable, well behaved, proof of current rabies vaccination, county tag required and dogs must be at least 4 months of age to participate.
