



RAISE YOUR VOICE, NOT YOUR HANDS July 16, 2013 BROWARD SHERIFF'S OFFICE MESSAGE TO YOU



The Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO), working closely with the Sanford Police Department and other local law enforcement agencies, has coordinated a response plan in light of the verdict of the George Zimmerman trial.

Freedom of expression is a constitutional right. While raising your voice is encouraged, using your hands is not. BSO has created a public service announcement with the help of kids from the Jason Taylor Foundation, H.A.N.D.Y. (Helping Abused, Neglected, Disadvantaged Youth) and basketball star James Jones of the championship Miami Heat team urging young people not to let their emotions get the best of them.

"We don't have information about any specific event that might take place, but we encourage everyone to keep any protests peaceful," Sheriff Scott Israel said.

Members of the BSO Strategic Investigation Division have been monitoring the pulse of the situation, maintaining open lines of communication with community leaders, civic activists, members of the clergy, as well as local, state and federal agencies.

EMERGENCY VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Volunteer opportunities abound in Broward County, and at no time is the need for volunteers greater than during a recovery from a hurricane or other emergency. Broward County Emergency Management Division encourages residents who are interested in becoming a volunteer in the aftermath of a storm or other emergency, to contact one of these County emergency response partners. Please click on the blue underlined link for more information.



The Community Emergency Response Team (offered by the City of Weston and the BSO's Division of Fire Rescue, is a training program which educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards, such as fire safety, light search and rescue and disaster medical operations.



The mission of 2-1-1 Broward is to provide 24-hour comprehensive helpline and support services for individuals seeking crisis intervention assistance and/or information about health and human services.



The Aging and Disability Resource Center serves senior residents age 60 or older, and is a one-stop source of information regarding services for seniors, persons with mental illness, their families and caregivers.



The American Red Cross Broward County Chapter needs volunteers for the hurricane evacuation centers. Volunteers must be at least 18 years old and must submit to a background check.



The mission of the Center for Independent Living Broward is to offer assistance to people with disabilities in fulfilling goals of independence and self-sufficiency. Volunteers will help before, during and after a storm.



Citizen Corps is the FEMA grassroots strategy to bring together government and community leaders to involve citizens in all-hazards emergency preparedness and resilience.



The Cooperative Feeding Program provides 1.2 million meals annually to families and individuals who have fallen into economic hardship, including the homeless, nearly homeless, those with disabilities, the elderly, and persons with mental illness.

<u>Crisis Housing Solutions</u> provides temporary and permanent housing solutions for those made homeless by natural, manmade or economic disasters. The ultimate goal is to return these families to a sustainable situation and to self-sufficiency.



Neighbors to the Rescue <u>Neighbors to the Rescue</u> "virtual warehouses" are community-based, community-controlled vehicles

for helping people recover from disasters. This organization helps communities keep track of surplus items and pro bono services and match them up with people in the same geographical area who have lost everything.



The <u>Salvation Army's</u> Disaster Services In case of a countywide emergency such as a hurricane, volunteers would deliver relief supplies and offer support to those in need.



<u>SKYWARN</u> is a nationwide volunteer network of weather spotters who report observations of significant weather and resulting damage from severe weather events to the National Weather Service. SKYWARN offers free training classes to interested volunteers, who include amateur radio operators, Red Cross volunteers, firefighters, students and others who want to serve.



<u>United Way of Broward County</u> is a volunteer driven, community-based, organization with a mission to improve the lives of individuals and families. They bring together people from all across the community—government, business, labor, faith groups, nonprofits, academic institutions, and residents—to tackle the issues that matter most.



Hands On Broward (formerly Volunteer Broward) connects people who want to help with volunteer opportunities that make a difference in the community. FIVE WAYS TO STAY (RELATIVELY) WATERPROOF DURING FLORIDA'S RAINY SEASON

It's no secret that the South Florida's wet season has begun. However, the water puddles in shoes and the hassles of walking across a parking lot in the pouring rain no longer have to be a problem if you follow these simple steps:



- Wear waterproof shoes— wet shoes are always the last part of the outfit to dry and can become highly uncomfortable. Investing in some inexpensive rain boots, or for further affordability, simply spraying your favorite pair of shoes with a waterproof coating spray will assure dry socks and warm feet.
- 2. Check the weather forecasts- a trip to the beach with an 80% chance of thunderstorms might not be the best idea. Download some weather apps to your phone and have all storms under your radar.





- 3. Poncho preparedness- before heading out grab a poncho for each member of the family. A bulky rain jacket won't work as well as lightweight plastic in the Florida heat. Tourist locations will always have overpriced ponchos for those who came unprepared.
- 4. Avoid the "wet dog" look- the fear of exposing freshly done hair to the pouring rain doesn't have to hold you back anymore. Look into owning a "rain scarf" which is fashionably water repellant and can be wrapped around hair easily, protecting it from the water.





5. Protect your phone- there are many measures to protect your electronics. Techniques can be as fancy as a lifeproof case or as simple as a ziplock bag, but just assure your phone isn't in your pocket while you run through the rain. Note: If any of your electronics do happen to get wet- put them in rice overnight, the grains absorb the water that seeped through.

SMART IRRIGATION MONTH SAVE MONEY AND WATER DURING SUMMER'S HOTTEST!

Broward Water Partnership encourages residents to conserve water outside their homes during the hottest month! Yes, that's right; July is traditionally the month of peak demand for irrigating lawns, gardens and landscapes in the United States.

Broward County Natural Resources Planning and Management are encouraging residents to be aware of the numerous ways they could be wasting water outside their homes.

The following are some tips from the **Irrigation Association**:

- **Plant right**. Choose grass or plants that have low water requirements and that will thrive in Florida climate.
- Mulch well around plants, bushes and trees. Using 2 to 4 inches of mulch reduces evaporation, moderates soil temperatures, improves water penetration and helps control weeds that compete for water.
- Maintain your yard regularly. A well-maintained yard requires less water.
- **Don't send water down the drain**. Set sprinklers to water plants, not your driveway or sidewalk.
- Water only when needed. Saturate root zones and let the soil dry.
- Check your irrigation system monthly. Check for leaks, broken or clogged sprinkler heads and other problems.



You can also save outdoors by following the County's permanent irrigation measures. All homes and businesses are limited to irrigating twice per week.



BROWARD COUNTY ANIMAL CARE AND ADOPTION

Announces New Price Structure for Pet Registration Tags

Broward County Animal Care and Adoption has adjusted its pet registration fees for dogs and cats, effective July 1st. All dogs and cats that are at least 4 months old must be vaccinated against rabies and registered with the County as follows:

Dog Pet Registration Tag:

Spay/neutered (fixed) dog: \$25

Not spayed/neutered (not fixed) dog: \$55

Cat Pet Registration Tag:

Spay/neutered (fixed) cat: \$15

Not spayed/neutered (not fixed) cat: \$30



A three-year pet registration tag is no longer available. Animal Care offers several ways to purchase pet tags. While dogs and cats can continue to receive a three-year rabies vaccination, the pet registration must be renewed each year on the anniversary the rabies vaccination was received. A \$10 late fee will be added if the pet

registration tag is not purchased within 30 days of the rabies vaccination.



Previously, pet registration fees were based only on whether a pet was fixed (spayed/neutered). Now the fees will also reflect whether the pet is a dog or cat. Residents who get their pet fixed will continue to pay a lower registration fee. In addition, the pet registration tag must be purchased even if the pet is microchipped, tattooed or has a personal name tag.

"A pet registration tag worn on a secure collar acts as your pet's cell phone number," said Lisa Mendheim, public education coordinator, Broward County Animal Care. Each year, the center receives thousands of pets who do not have their tag. Not only does the registration tag confirm ownership of the pet, but it also provides the owners contact information.
