DISTRACTED DRIVING EDUCATION

BSO Fire Rescue launched the first presentation of *Just Drive* at Cypress Bay High School on Tuesday, May 21st. *Just Drive* is a distracted driving education program designed to educate teenagers about the dangers and consequences of distracted driving.

The BSO's Weston Crime Prevention Van set up in the main courtyard of Cypress Bay with TV's playing a



student-developed PSA on the dangers of distracted driving. Students participated in a driving simulation and were able to visualize the impact of a crash while texting. Additionally, students had an activity where they could visualize the impairment of a person driving under the influence of alcohol.



The main display was an actual wrecked automobile from a texting accident. Students saw firsthand the impact distracted driving can have and learned about the impact it can make on drivers, passengers, and pedestrians on the road.

At 2:00pm, Commission Toby Feuer welcomed over 600 Cypress

students and spoke about her personal story of a near accident with a distracted driver. BSO Fire Chief Harris Bouchillon then introduced Fire Rescue Life Safety Educator, Melanie Oren. Melanie, who created the *Just Drive* program, presented the program, along with videos of personal stories from people whose lives were forever changed as the result of distracted driving incidents.





Afterwards, the students stood to take the *Just Drive* pledge and make a commitment to do their part to end distracted driving.

Plaques, certificates and memory books were presented to the 23 graduating program students at the May 20th City Commission meeting, also attended by State Representative Richard Stark and Broward County School Board Members Robin Bartleman and Laurie Rich Levinson. The program class is made up of students from Cypress Bay, Western and Sagemont High Schools.

Weston initiated the Weston University program in October 2002, to give select high school students an in-depth education on the functions of local government. The seven-month program is designed to provide a unique civic education. Students met once a month for a full-day class that highlighted a different civic discipline:

- Local Government Administration
- Planning/Zoning & Engineering
- Law Enforcement Services
- Parks/Public Works/Landscaping

- Fire & E.M.S. Services/Fire Marshal
- Finance & Simulation Preparation
- Trip to Washington, D.C.
- City Commission Simulation Exercise

The City will initiate application for the next class through each high school in September 2013.

ORDINARY PEOPLE EXTRAORDINARY HEROES

On the morning of Sunday, April 28, 2013 an adult pickup game of soccer was underway in the Weston Regional Park, just like hundreds of other carefree mornings out in the park. What happened next changed the life of one man and showed us how ordinary people can be extraordinary heroes.

A 65-year old gentleman playing soccer suddenly collapsed. He had a massive heart attack and had no pulse or signs of life. Four bystanders rushed to his side, recognized that he was in cardiac arrest and began CPR while another called 9-1-1. The four men, Brian Tillinghast, Dr. Daniel Perez, Dr. George Gounakis and Dr. Luis Cardenas continued CPR until firefighters and paramedics arrived. Fire Rescue defibrillated the patient, established an advanced airway and provided other life support measures, transporting him to Cleveland Clinic where he was rushed to the cardiac lab and doctors removed a significant blockage in one of his main coronary arteries. He is expected to make a full recovery.

The CPR provided immediately following his cardiac arrest was key to his survival. On average, only 8% of patients experiencing a cardiac arrest outside of a hospital setting will survive.



On May 20, 2013, Fire Chief Harris Bouchillon and the City Commission honored and thanked these heroes for their willingness to take immediate and continued lifesaving efforts, as well as the responding rescue crew: Captain Cynthia Kelley, Lt. Phil Kalarovich, Driver/Engineer Aileen O'Neill, Firefighter (FF)/Paramedic Gisela Bass, FF/Paramedic Carl King and FF/Paramedic Daniel Cook. Chief Bouchillon presented Mr. Tillinghast, Dr. Gounakis and Dr. Cardenas with the BSO Citizen Life Saver Award (Dr. Perez was unable to attend.)

Both Mayor Stermer and Chief Bouchillon stressed the importance of knowing CPR. It can truly save lives.

On Monday, June 3rd at 10:00am, the YMCA of Broward County will host a kick-off for their Water Safety Awareness Campaign focused on saving lives.

The kick off will be held at the Pembroke Pines YMCA Aquatic Center, at 1361 N.W. 129th Ave., Pembroke Pines. Various Mayors and officials from the cities around Broward County, along with the Broward County Swim Central, Broward Sheriff's Office, Broward Health Department, Children's Services Council and Drowning



Prevention Task Force of Broward will join pre-school kids, community leaders and the Y to raise awareness of drowning prevention efforts this summer.

Alarming Facts: (Drowning Prevention Task Force statistics)

- Drowning is the leading cause of death for children between the ages of 1-4 in Florida.
- In 2012 there were 9 drowning deaths in Broward County for children ages 4 and under.
- For every fatal drowning there are an estimated 10 -15 near-fatal drowning.
- Broward County has 130,000 backyard pools.
- The majority of children who drown in swimming pools were last seen in the home, had been missing from sight for less than 5 minutes, and were in the care of one or both parents at the time of the drowning.

RECEIVE EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS SIGN UP FOR CODERED TODAY



Hurricane season officially begins on **Saturday**, **June 1**st. Sign up for **CodeRED** to stay informed and educated about local emergencies.

<u>WHAT IT IS</u>: **CodeRED** is a high-speed telephone communication service for emergency <u>only</u> notifications. This system allows the City to send critical communications in an emergency situation that requires immediate action.

Capable of dialing the entire City within minutes, **CodeRED** delivers a message from the City Manager's office describing the emergency and instructions for action. You can also opt to receive texts and/or email alerts.

HOW TO REGISTER:

Visit the City web site at www.westonfl.org and click on the CodeRED icon.



Register both your HOME and CELL phones.



<u>ALREADY SIGNED UP</u>? To opt for the text message and/or email alerts, or to add or change a phone number including cell phones, please revisit the **CodeRED** registration page and enter your information.

<u>PRIVACY:</u> CodeRED is used for emergency communications ONLY. Your contact information is private, exempt from public records laws, and cannot be shared, requested or sold.

The system will only be used for emergency & life safety purposes such as: Drinking water contamination extended utility outages, evacuation notices, missing person, fires, floods, hurricanes, bomb threats, hostage situations, chemical spills or gas leaks, and other incidents where rapid and accurate notification is essential for life safety.

SCHOOL IS (ALMOST) OUT SAFETY REMINDERS

With the upcoming end of school combined with longer daylight hours, it is time for parents and community members to be mindful of safety precautions. Children will soon be spending more time outdoors and on-the-go.



Among the suggested precautions are:



- Model safe driving practices and teach children how to be safe when crossing streets.
- Make sure everyone wears a helmet when biking.
- Make sure you know where your child is going when they leave the house to play

with friends.



- Plan a specific time for your child to be home.
- Remind children that, even though it seems light outside, dusk brings a new darkness to drivers.
- To avoid heat exhaustion, make sure to dress children properly. Children should be dressed in lightweight, light-colored clothing, and a hat.



- Make sure to stay hydrated. Children should try to drink water often, especially during extremely hot days.
- Always apply sunscreen and keep the bug repellent handy!
