

BIKE LIGHTING REQUIREMENTS



Nearly 60% of all adult fatal bicycle accidents in Florida occur during twilight and night hours.

Florida Statute 316.2065

As of January 2013, every bicycle has to meet lighting equipment standards or is subject to warnings/fines issued by law enforcement.

Every bicycle in use between sunset and sunrise shall be equipped with a lamp on the front exhibiting a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front and a lamp along with a reflector on the rear each exhibiting a red light visible from a distance of 600 feet to the rear. A bicycle or its rider may be equipped with lights or reflectors in addition to those required by this section.

A Law Enforcement Officer may issue a bicycle safety brochure and a verbal warning to a bicycle rider who violates this subsection or may issue a citation and assess a fine for pedestrian violation. The court shall dismiss the charge against a bicycle rider for a first violation of this subsection upon proof of purchase and installation of the proper lighting equipment.

DEEP FRYING A THANKSGIVING TURKEYSAFETY TIPS FROM BSO & THE CITY OF WESTON

A popular item that is used at holiday time is the propane gas turkey fryer. These are readily available and inexpensive but can be unsafe. The National Fire Protection Association discourages the use of turkey fryers except by properly trained professionals. There is a similar outdoor unit available that does not use oil and is a good alternative to the oil-containing fryers.



Since deep fried turkey is a longtime favorite food, people will continue to use the deep fryers. Consumer-grade turkey fryers

use a substantial quantity of cooking oil at high temperatures and pose a significant danger that hot oil will be released at some point during the cooking process. BSO echoes the NFPA suggestion that those who prefer a deep-fried turkey simply purchase one prepared from a grocer, food retailer or restaurant that prepares them using professional equipment.

Dangers:

- 1. Units can easily tip over, spilling boiling hot oil over a large area.
- 2. An overfilled cooking pot will cause cooking oil to spill.
- 3. A small amount of oil coming in contact with the burner can cause a large fire.
- 4. Deep fryers have the potential to overheat the oil to the point of combustion.
- 5. The sides of the pot, lid and handles can get dangerously hot, causing severe burns.

If You Do Fry a Turkey

- Fryers should <u>always</u> be used outdoors, on a solid level surface a safe distance from buildings and flammable materials.
- Never use a fryer on a wooden deck, under a patio cover, or in a garage.
- Do not overfill the fryer.
- Never leave the fryer unattended; the oil will continue to heat until it catches fire.
- Never let children or pets near the fryer when in use/after use.
- Use well-insulated potholders/oven mitts and wear long sleeves and safety goggles.
- Make sure the turkey is completely thawed before it is placed in a fryer.
- Keep all-purpose fire extinguishers nearby and immediately call 9-1-1 if fryer catches fire.

We remind residents that Thanksgiving is the top day for cooking fires.

C-SPAN'S 2014 STUDENTCAM NATIONAL DOCUMENTARY CONTEST ANNOUNCED



This Year's Theme: A Message to the U.S. Congress

\$100,000 in prizes to be awarded

In partnership with Advanced Cable Communications, C-SPAN is calling for entries in its **2014 StudentCam** competition. Now in its tenth year, C-SPAN's national contest invites all middle school students and high school students to produce a five- to seven-minute video documentary using C-SPAN programming.

This year, students will have the opportunity to produce a documentary that focuses on "A Message to the U.S. Congress: What's the most important issue Congress should consider in 2014?"

C-SPAN has doubled the number of prizes and amount of prize money for the 2014 contest. The C-SPAN Education Foundation supports the contest by awarding 150 student and 53 teacher awards, totaling \$100,000 in cash prizes. The grand prize winner with the best overall entry will be awarded \$5,000, with multiple cash prize awards of \$3,000, \$1,500, \$750, \$500, and \$250 to students in both middle and high school categories.

Additionally, this year high school students will be competing on a regional level with the U.S. divided into three regions. Middle school students will continue to be judged on a national basis. The grand prize winner will be chosen nationally between all middle and high school entries. The specific breakdown of regions and rules can be found at www.studentcam.org.

Weston had three local students take home a Third Prize designation in 2013! The winners were Brian Bosem, Camily Tussie and Jacob Wilentz, all 8th grade students from Falcon Cove Middle School.

The deadline for entries is Monday, January 20, 2014. Winners will be announced in March 2014, with the top winning videos to air on C-SPAN in April 2014. Complete competition details and the entry form are available at the competition's website, www.studentcam.org.

BASIC CAR SEAT SAFETY FOR INFANTS – YOUNG CHILDREN

Florida law requires children to be properly restrained no matter where they are seated in a vehicle. Following the guidelines below will keep your child safe and sound in the car.

REAR-FACING CAR SEAT; Infants under age 1 AND weighs less than 20 pounds

- Car seat is always in the back seat, rear facing and never in front of an air bag
- Straps are snug on the baby and car seat is buckled tightly into the seat and doesn't move more than 1 inch when pulled on



FORWARD-FACING CAR SEAT; Toddlers over age 1 AND weighs 20 to 40 pounds

- Car seat is always in the back seat and never in front of an air bag
- Always rides in a car seat made for kids the correct size and age
- Snug straps and car seat doesn't move more than 1 inch when pulled on



BOOSTER SEAT; Children under 4 feet 9 inches tall AND weighs more than 40 pounds

- Rides in the back seat and never in front of an air bag
- Always rides in a booster seat using a seat belt with lap and shoulder straps
- Shoulder belt is on the shoulder, not on neck, under arm or behind back
- Seat belt is snug, flat and comfortable



SEAT BELTS; Children over 4 feet 9 inches tall AND weighs more than 80 pounds

- Rides in the back seat and never in front of an air bag
- Always uses a seat belt with lap and shoulder straps that sits low on hips
- Child's back is firmly against the seat back, knees bend at the front edge of the seat, and the belt is snug.



November is National Adoption Month, but anytime is a great time to give a child a forever home.

The Adopt Florida website can answer all of your questions about adoption and you can view videos

and photos of children. Log on to www.adoptflorida.org.

Through public education, expanded partnerships and social media, Explore Adoption invites Floridians to learn more about the children immediately available for adoption in their home state and community.

The initiative puts a new face on public adoption by telling the stories of families who have enriched their lives by adopting Florida's children. Florida will never give up on finding an adoptive family for a child.

On any given day there are approximately 750 children are available for adoption from foster care without an identified family. Florida's children come into foster care through no fault of their own. Some enter care because they were abused, neglected or abandoned or because their parents were unable to care for them due to the parent's drug abuse, imprisonment or other impairment. In some cases, children enter care because they have medical needs or disabilities their birth parents cannot cope with. They come from varied backgrounds, circumstances, races and ethnicities. While some have specific medical, physical or emotional issues that require special care, many do not.

Their life histories are shared with prospective adoptive parents. When Florida's children in foster care are available for adoption, the legal rights of their biological parents have been terminated, and the children will never be returned to their birth parents.
