The building, which will be named the *Egil and Pauline Braathen Facility*, will house the expanded Pauline Braathen Neurological Center and Cleveland Clinic Florida's Cancer Center.

FAKE ATM CARD READER UNCOVERED IN WESTON DON'T LET OTHERS SKIM OFF YOUR ACCOUNT

A "skimming" scam was uncovered at the outside ATM machine of a local bank in Weston. "Skimming" is when a card skimmer is applied overtop of the real card reader where you insert your ATM or credit card. Unfortunately it is a common crime not only in South Florida, but around the globe, and the technology is only getting better.

This incident was uncovered at the Sun Trust Bank at 1200 Weston Road by an astute bank employee, who noticed that the row of little lights under the card reader could barely be seen. The employee explored further, noticing that the card reader would move slightly when pulled on. This is the classic indication that a skimmer has been installed over the existing reader.

What happens is there are micro chips and a mini camera within the fake unit. It will capture the card number, the user's full name and the camera catches the input of your passcode.

Fortunately in this instance, the thieves will never get access to the information as the reader is safely in the hands of the Broward Sheriff's Office who is investigating this crime.

Chief Kevin Butler wants residents to be aware that this type of crime takes place all over the country. A skimmer can be attached to a card reader at any location, common ones are ATM machines and gas pumps.


<u>How you can protect yourself:</u> Take a good look before using a card reader **and tug on it**, trying to pull it or move it from side-to-side. If it moves, don't use it and contact the store/service personnel.

Many of these skimmers look identical to the card reader that they cover so just visually viewing it won't work. The photo below shows the real card reader as well as the skimmer held up to it – they are nearly identical.

With the holiday shopping season upon us, don't let a skimmer sour your spirit or siphon your funds...
