## **OFFICERS HONORED**

Three dedicated law enforcement officers were honored and recognized by the City Commission and Broward Sheriff's Office on October 21, 2013 for their actions that attempted to save the life of an innocent victim while they were exposed to a suspect's line of fire.

Sergeant John Kelly and Deputy John Rodriguez from Weston's BSO District VIII, and Miami-Dade Police Officer Jonathan Dweck were named BSO Employees of the Month for their actions on scene after a U.S. 27 cross-county pursuit on September 18<sup>th</sup>.

In Miami, officers had responded to a multiple shooting where the two victims died and the armed suspect fled the scene. Multiple agencies responded, following the dangerous suspect north on US 27, who reached speeds in excess of 120 MPH as he traveled into Broward County in a deliberate and reckless manner. As the suspect approached the intersection of US 27 & Griffin Road he failed to yield to the red light, violently striking a vehicle in the intersection which caused the innocent driver to be ejected from her vehicle.

Arriving at the scene, Officer Dweck and Deputy Rodriguez rushed to the victim to render first aid and initiated CPR. As other officers approached the suspects vehicle just yards away, the suspect opened fire on officers causing them to retreat. Officer Dweck and Deputy Rodriguez remained with the victim continuing CPR despite being exposed to the suspects' line of fire.

Sgt. Kelly drove his vehicle to the victim's location, shielding the victim and officers from gunfire. They worked in unison to place the victim into the police car, continuing CPR and transporting her out the way of further harm. Unfortunately, the victim died from her injuries.


Sgt. Kelly returned to the intersection to coordinate and direct numerous responding deputies to perimeter positions and instilled a sense of order to a very chaotic scene unfolding. After a standoff and then an approach by three SWAT teams, the suspect, with no chance to escape, took his own life with a self-inflicted gunshot.

Sergeant Kelly, Deputy Rodriguez and Officer Dweck chose to remain and assist a victim without hesitation or concern for their own safety. Chief Kevin Butler presented each the BSO Employee of the Month award for their valor, heroic efforts, professionalism and willingness to sacrifice themselves to render aid and protect a citizen.

At the time of the Commission recognition, Mayor Daniel Stermer noted that the evenings presentation highlighted how multiple agencies and jurisdictions effectively and seamlessly work together to protect and serve the community.

We thank every first responder for the jobs that they do each and every day.

On Tuesday, October 22, 2013, Sgt. Kelly and Deputy Rodriguez were presented the BSO Medal of Honor by Broward County Sheriff Scott Israel; Miami-Dade Officer Dweck was presented with the Sheriff's Special Recognition.




The City's unique Weston University Program kicked off at Weston City Hall with 21 eager students from Cypress Bay, Sagemont and Western High Schools.

# TURN YOUR CLOCKS BACK ONE HOUR BEFORE BED ON SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 2<sup>nd</sup>!

### **FALL DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME**

Don't forget that at 2 a.m. on Sunday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, you will need to turn your clocks back one hour, marking the end of <u>Daylight Saving Time (DST)</u>.

BSO Fire Rescue also recommends changing the batteries in your smoke alarms/detectors and carbon monoxide detectors at the same time. When those items are in working order – they save lives!

Any elderly or disabled residents who need assistance changing their smoke alarm batteries can call the Fire Department for this free service at 954-389-2015.

### **History of Daylight Saving Time**

Daylight Saving Time was instituted in the United States during World War I in order to save energy for war production by taking advantage of the later hours of daylight between April and October.

Daylight Saving Time is four weeks longer since 2007 due to the passage of the Energy Policy Act in 2005. The Act extended Daylight Saving Time by four weeks from the second Sunday of March to the first Sunday of November, with the hope that it would save 10,000 barrels of oil each day through reduced use of power by businesses during daylight hours. Unfortunately, it is exceedingly difficult to determine energy savings from Daylight Saving Time and based on a variety of factors, it is possible that little or no energy is saved by Daylight Saving Time.





# **HOWL-O-WEEN**Halloween Safety Tips for Pets

Be sure to keep your pets safe and happy this Halloween!

- 1. No trick, no treats: That bowl of candy is for trick-or-treaters, not for Scruffy or Fluffy! Chocolate in all forms-especially dark or baking chocolate can be **VERY** dangerous for dogs and cats.
- 2. Popular Halloween plants such as pumpkins and decorative corn are considered to be relatively nontoxic but can produce stomach upset.
- 3. Wires & cords from electric lights or decorations should be kept out of reach of pets.
- 4. Exercise caution if you chose to add a candle to your carved pumpkin. Pets can easily knock the pumpkin over.
- 5. Don't put your pet in a costume unless they love it because wearing one may cause undue stress. Costumes shouldn't constrict movement, hearing or impede the ability to breathe, bark or meow.
- 6. All but the most social dogs/cats should be kept in a separate room away from front door during peak Halloween hours. Too many strangers can be scary & stressful for pets. This will help with not wanting your pet to dart outside.
- 7. Always make sure your pet has proper identification!
