

CRITICAL EMS INFORMATION PROGRAM

Broward Emergency Critical Care Assistance (BECCA)

The BSO Fire Rescue and Emergency Services is participating in an innovative program that helps EMS (Emergency Medical Service) in Broward County respond to children with chronic medical conditions in a quick, timely manner.

The program provides a template of information that is responder ready, and can minimize confusion during a crisis. The BECCA form is intended to be kept on hand at home and can be provided to schools, camps, and daycares.

The BECCA program was named after Rebecca (Becca) Hyman, 7 years old, of Weston. Rebecca (Becca) Hyman was diagnosed with 1p36 Deletion Syndrome, a genetic disorder that occurs in 1 out of 5,000 children. Becca has experienced life-threatening episodes that have required numerous EMS responses by Broward Sheriff Fire Rescue.

The program was introduced locally in June, 2011 by BSO and the Hyman family to allow EMS responders quick access to critical health information for children with complex medical histories. The Hyman family is hoping to expand the program statewide.

BROWARD SHERIFF'S OFFICE UTILIZES SAFETYNET BY LOJACK

Search and Rescue System for at risk individuals

Further ensuring the safety of our residents and community, the Broward Sheriff's Office District VIII Weston utilizes the *LoJack SafetyNet* search and rescue system. *SafetyNet* is a tool for the caregivers and family members of anyone with a medical condition that may cause him or her to wander or become lost – adults or children. SafetyNet is frequently used by people afflicted with Alzheimer's and autism, but is effective for anyone with a cognitive disorder.

How Does It Work?

- The client wears a SafetyNet Bracelet.
- If a client goes missing, his or her caregiver contacts authorities.



- The law enforcement agency utilizes LoJack's Search and Rescue Receiver to track the Personal Locator Unit virtually anywhere.
- Your loved one is located, rescued and returned to you.



Unlike GPS, LoJack SafetyNet's radio frequency technology works in densely wooded areas, wetlands, buildings, concrete structures or any other hidden location. Weston law enforcement agents have undergone extensive training with LoJack's time tested electronic tracking and rescue equipment. The average time to find a person who has wandered off is less than 30 minutes utilizing only two to three officers.



AUTHOR BOOK TALK LATIN AMERICA IN THE POST-CHAVEZ ERA Monday, September 30th



Hugo Chávez passed away in March 2013 after a two-year battle with cancer, prompting much speculation about the impact of his death. What will a post-Chávez future look like, not only in Venezuela but also in the region? In *Latin America in the Post-Chávez Era*, Luis Fleischman examines Chávez's highly controversial Bolivarian revolution, which has expanded beyond Venezuela to other countries in South America and whose sphere of influence also extends to Central America and the Caribbean. In this context, the author systematically shows how an emerging authoritarianism in the region plays an important role in defining the geo-political context of the region.


