QUARTERLY BULK TRASH PICKUP IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD - <u>JULY</u>

FREE Bulk Pickup takes place on your *regularly scheduled garbage collection day* and items should be curbside by 7:00am on that day.

Single Family Homes: Wednesday July 23rd

Thursday July 24th

Friday July 25th

Multi-family units

Saturday July 26th

OCTOBER 2014:

October 22nd – October 25th

Bulk items include but are not limited to:

- Furniture, mattresses, carpets and other large household items.
- Large and small appliances, such as dishwashers, laundry machines and stoves.
- Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.
- Mirrors, glass, glass top tables, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container to facilitate safe collection.

NOT COLLECTED: Bulk items DO NOT include contractor-generated material, or vegetative waste (landscape materials) or household hazardous waste (HHW). There will be a HHW collection event on May 18th in Weston at the Public Works Center. Vegetative/Landscape waste is collected with your regular garbage collection.

BEFORE YOU THROW – CONSIDER DONATING:

Help those in need, keep items out of the waste stream, *and* get a tax deduction. Several national organizations will even pick-up directly from your residence – you don't have to wait for bulk pick-up day! There are many local, well-established charitable organizations that readily accept donated items.

CREATE ASSET INVENTORY LISTS

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series

Don't wait for a hurricane to ensure your valuables are recorded and securely stored.

Prior to a storm, inventory your home possessions and videotape or photograph items of value inside/outside your home. Once you have your inventory list, video and/or photographs, place them in an airtight fire proof storage container to ensure that water cannot permeate through. This information is an important tool to have if you have any damage done during a storm and need to report it to your insurance company.





Also, be sure to review your insurance policies now to ensure you have adequate coverage during the storm season.

Once a hurricane watch has been issued, insurers WILL NOT issue new or allow you to purchase additional coverage.

When photographing an electronic, be sure to take a picture of the serial number panel on the back. This will give you all the information necessary to file it on a claim. Make sure to take the picture close enough so you can read the numbers for the most accurate information.

You should have two pictures for each item, one to depict the item itself and one for the serial number panel. It also doesn't hurt to put the information down in a spreadsheet in case the photos get ruined or lost.


FT. LAUDERDALE AIRPORT UPDATES

South Runway Nearing Completion

Pretty much all of us use or visit the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport at some time so we have provided updates on the expansion since it began back in 2013.



Construction on Terminal 4 has progressed to its second level.



Work on the South Runway is nearing completion as crews complete life safety system within the structures. Over 95% of the retaining wall and embankment are in place and paving and lighting are being done seven days a week. The old Hilton Hotel structure has been demolished and crews are recycling concrete and removing debris. As for getting to the airport, work is almost complete on the airport exit ramp to US 1 northbound and to I-595/Port from northbound US 1.

INTERESTING FACTS ON THE RUNWAY STRUCTURE

- There are six runway structures and six taxiway structures.
- Each Runway Structure is 810 feet long; the Taxiway Structures are 440 feet long.
 - o The average height clearance is 24 feet in each structure.
 - The Runway Structure is composed of four individual evacuation and ventilation systems.
 - o There are 134 fluorescent and 290-1,000 watt metal halide lights in the walls of the Runway Structure.
 - 94 fluorescent and 269-1,000 watt metal halide lights were installed in the walls of the Taxiway Structure.
- In September 2013, a concrete plant was assembled on-site due to the volume of concrete needed for this project.



Substantial completion is anticipated for September 2014 of this \$791 million project.

KEEPING CRITTERS COOL Summer Pet Safety Reminders

Summertime is finally here! While you're out enjoying the sun and surf, please remember your pet's summer needs. The summer months not only involve fun in the sun, warm weather, and beaches for you and your furry friend, but hazards that could arise from such activities.

HEAT STRESS: One summer hazard to keep in consideration is that South Florida subtropical temperatures can be very dangerous to your pet. Never take a pet with you in the car if it will be unattended for any length of time. Also, supply your pet with extra water and shade throughout the day for comfortable leisure time and to escape direct sun and heat exposure.

In addition, the best times to walk Fido would be early morning or after sundown so the pads of their paws are protected from smoldering asphalt or concrete.

SHELTER FROM THE SUN: Your pet might enjoy a little sunbathing, but she ultimately needs a cool, shady spot to relax. Prolonged sun exposure not only leads to heat exhaustion, it can also cause sunburn. The best thing is to offer your pet is shaded shelter.





COOL TREATS
FOR "HOT DOGS": There are many ways you can help keep your dog (or other type of pet) cool in the hot weather. Chilled or frozen dog treats are a great surprise for your dog. Not only will they help cool her off, they can also help relieve boredom when she is cooped up inside.

SWIMMING AND WATER ACTIVITIES:

Take your pet to the lake, get a baby

swimming pool or spray them with a hose and watch the fun begin! Just be sure to keep an eye on your pet while they are playing in water.
