When selling items online, keep in mind that not all buyers are legitimate. Whenever possible, consider meeting strangers in a safe place. Starting immediately, BSO's Weston district office's parking lot will serve as a safe haven for the City's online buyers and sellers to meet.



Weston's Police Chief, Kevin Butler, said the City has experienced at least one case where a person was ripped off by a buyer when trying to sell something off Craigslist. The potential buyer met up with the seller and then snatched the item for sale from their hands and ran, police said.

Chief Butler said the premise is to conduct business in a relatively safe environment which would deter both sellers from ripping off potential customers and potential customers stealing from the sellers. The Police Department exchange is a growing trend nationwide.

The new and improved Home Damage Assessment tool is designed to help first responders know where the hardest hit areas of the County are and who needs the most help.

If disaster strikes, residents are urged to wait until after the emergency passes, and once it's safe to go outside, to perform an assessment of their home and report any damaged property to the County.

The Home Damage Assessment tool is very EASY to use. All Broward County residents are encouraged to go online now to bookmark the new tool created for easy reporting following disasters.

Home damage can also be reported by calling Broward County Call Center at 311 or 954-831-4000.

Filing a report does not constitute a request for individual assistance, nor does it replace the normal grid-by-grid damage assessments performed by the County.

TAX FREE WEEKEND

GET READY FOR BACK TO SCHOOL Friday, August 1st – Sunday, August 3rd



Florida's tax free weekend will take place from August 1st – August 3rd, which is perfect for parents who need to pick up school supplies, clothing, shoes, and other back-to-school shopping items.

Florida's Tax Free Weekend Applies to:

- Clothing and footwear (\$100 or less)
- School supplies (\$15 or less)
- Personal computers and certain related accessories for personal use (\$750 or less)
- Books are not tax exempt

Smart Shopping Strategies:

Being a sensible shopper is the best way to save even more during tax free weekend. For example, compare prices ahead of time at several stores, which you can do online, and plan on using coupons when you can.

In addition, don't buy anything you don't really need. Since the regular sales tax rate in Broward County is 6% that is the amount of money you'll save by shopping during the sales tax holiday. You might find that you can actually save more money by shopping at competitive sales either before or after the tax free weekend, along with using coupons or taking advantage of special promotions.

Keep in mind, too, that some items will still be taxed during Florida's tax free weekend. For example, many sporting goods are not tax exempt in Florida, such as football pads and protective helmets, but cleats and spiked shoes are. COMMITMENT 2040

BROWARD COUNTY'S METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (MPO)

The Long Range Transportation Plan for Broward



move people · create jobs · strengthen communities

Commitment 2040 is an investment plan that allocates available federal, state and local funds to maintain and improve our transportation system over the next 26 years.

By federal law, the plan must be "financially feasible," meaning only

revenues that can be reasonably expected, such as existing gas taxes, can be considered in funding the recommendations documented within Commitment 2040.

Beginning July 21st, a list of recommended projects will be made available to the public for review and input before the Broward County's MPO adopts Commitment 2040. Providing feedback on proposed transportation improvements will help shape the future for Broward County.

New MPO Programs

Commitment 2040 consolidates eligible classes of non-major capital projects into one (1) program with (4) primary classifications: Complete Streets, Safety and Security, Sustainability Initiatives, and Technology Advancement. This program is intended to "fast track" delivery of projects that typically qualify as categorical exclusions (CE) or 4(f) conditions under the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA). A periodic (annual or biannual) process will evaluate and fund these projects based on consistency with the plan's goals and objectives.

Enabling Legislation: 23 USC § 134 (j)(3)(B)(ii) and 23 USC § 134 (i)

Funding Source(s): Approximately \$571.6 million (\$27.2 million/yearly) of discretionary Federal and State funds allocated to the Broward MPO.

Examples of Candidate Projects

- Complete Streets: Bicycle, pedestrian, transit facilities and amenities, etc.
- <u>Safety and Security:</u> Education, traffic calming, safe routes to schools, etc. <u>Sustainability Initiatives:</u> Mobility hubs, greenways, quiet zones, etc. <u>Technology Advancement:</u> Signalization, Transit Signal Priority (TSP), etc.

Match Requirement: None

Eligible Uses: Planning, design, right-of-way, construction

Eligible Recipients: Local governments, regional transportation authorities, transit agencies, natural resource or public land agencies, school districts, local education agencies, schools and tribal governments
