LEADERS SPEAK AT WESTON SYMPOSIUM

METEOROLOGY AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

On Wednesday evening, May 7th, Weston hosted its second Disaster Preparedness Symposium in the heart of the Bonaventure community at the Bonaventure Town Center. Residents received first hand information from three top leaders in their fields. Mr. Stacv Stewart, Senior Hurricane Specialist at the National Hurricane Center in Miami; Charles Lanza, former Director of the Broward County Emergency Management Division, and John R. Weston City Manager, who moderated by Weston Fire Chief Harris Bouchillon. The event was sponsored by the City and the Weston Community Emergency Response Team (CERT).

The two hour presentation covered an array of preparedness, disaster, and response information for residents and businesses.

Mr. Stewart, also a Weston resident, provided a review of Hurricane Wilma and its impacts. One of many interesting facts was the recorded data of wind speeds in Weston. The 3-second wind gust rate was at 105 mph, the 1-second rate as high as 112 mph, and an hour of sustained winds at 100 mph, recorded on equipment located at US 27 & I-75. He also displayed historic data graphs on hurricane patterns.

His prediction: If you look at history, this should not be a below average year for storms.



Prompted by an audience question, he also spoke on micro-bursts, a localized column of air caused by a small, intense downdraft within a thunderstorm. He noted that they can be very damaging and that mid-May to the middle of June in our area is conducive to their formation.

He stressed that storm surge, one of the four major hazards from a hurricane, would not be an impact to Weston, however heavy rainfall and inland freshwater flooding is a serious threat. The best drainage system in the world can only handle so much water at one time.

Mr. Lanza, a seasoned south Florida veteran of Emergency Management as well as a former Fire Chief encouraged non-complacency and preparedness. "Without the hit of a hurricane since 2005, people get complacent" stated Lanza. You have seen and heard it a hundred times, but it can't be stressed enough – **prepare early.**

Shopping: Hurricane preparedness lists are readily available including on the Weston website, but the shopping should be done now, not later. It is significantly easier to grab supplies now than when everyone is in line and supplies may run out.



Evacuation Zone: If you reside in Weston you are not in an evacuation zone. However, it is likely you know someone who is. Mr. Lanza encouraged everyone to offer your home now to a friend or relative as a known location to evacuate too.

Lanza stressed that those with special medical needs should register **now** to receive assistance in a disaster, by calling 954-357-6385. Also, residents with any questions can always call **3-1-1** and be directed to the right location.

Weston City Manager John Flint provided an overview of how the City responds to a disaster, the policies, structures and funding that is in place, and ensured the public that everyone would be taken care of. A caveat to that, particularly in the sense of disaster debris collection, is that someone will be first and someone will be last. All main roadways will be cleared first. As for residential debris, the areas receiving attention first will be dependent upon access, the size of equipment that first responds and other factors all of which will determine the most effective and efficient response.

Mr. Flint asked attendees to take an "Adopt-A-Catch Basin" philosophy. Stressed also by Mr. Stewart, clogged catch basins can cause extensive flooding in neighborhoods. Know where the nearest one is to your home and ensure there is nothing blocking it. Storm drains within gated communities are the responsibility of the Homeowners Association but residents are encouraged to act proactively in the event of a storm and remove any debris.

Many of us know or have heard about someone that was underage and under the influence of drugs or alcohol after attending their prom, then getting behind the wheel of a vehicle and the results not ending positive.

Sagemont Upper School, Weston Crime Prevention Specialists, Deputy Pallotto and Deputy Barnes, Life Safety Educator Melanie Oren and Weston Police Chief Butler along with Helen Witty from MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Drivers) organized Prom Promise so that no parents sadly lose a child due to preventable situations that involved alcohol

during the season before, during and after prom.

Approximately 90 students and parents were gathered in the Sagemont Upper School gym on Tuesday, May 6th to attend an educational seminar to remind the students to not to engage in activities that could result in long term consequences or possible death on their prom night.

At the end of the seminar, with teary eyes from almost everyone attending, the students were asked to sign a paper called the "Prom Promise."

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE AND ELECTRONICS COLLECTION EVENT IN WESTON

Sunday, May 18, 2014 8AM-3PM



Put aside items that cannot be placed into the trash or put out for bulk pickup, and bring them to the annual **FREE Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Collection** event and they will be recycled or disposed of properly without harming the environment.



On Sunday, May 18th, simply drive up and drop off your household hazardous waste and electronic items at the Weston Public Works Services Center, 2599 South Post Road, between 8:00am and 3:00pm. Crews will remove items from your vehicle.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) refers to used or leftover contents of consumer products that contain chemicals with one of the four characteristics: *Toxic, Ignitable, Corrosive, or Reactive* as defined by the Environmental Protection Agency.



<u>What items are accepted?</u> Oil and latex paints and thinners, used motor oil, auto fluids and gasoline solvents, pesticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals, drain cleaners, tires, mercury, rechargeable & automobile batteries and electronics such as computers and televisions will be accepted.
