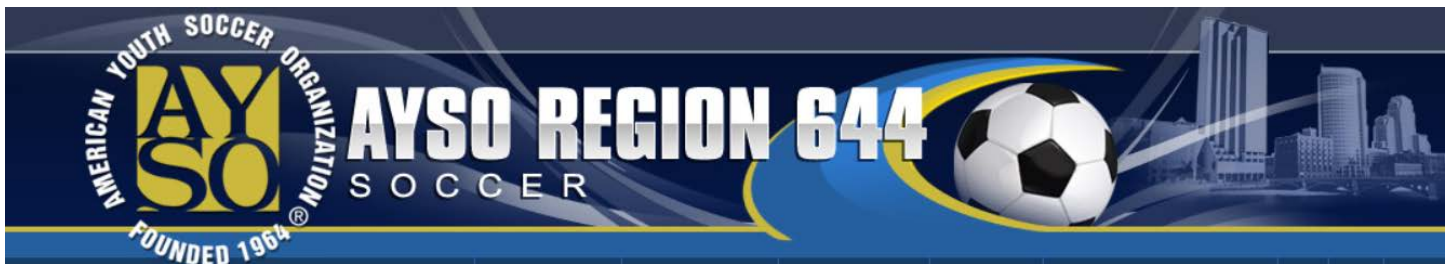

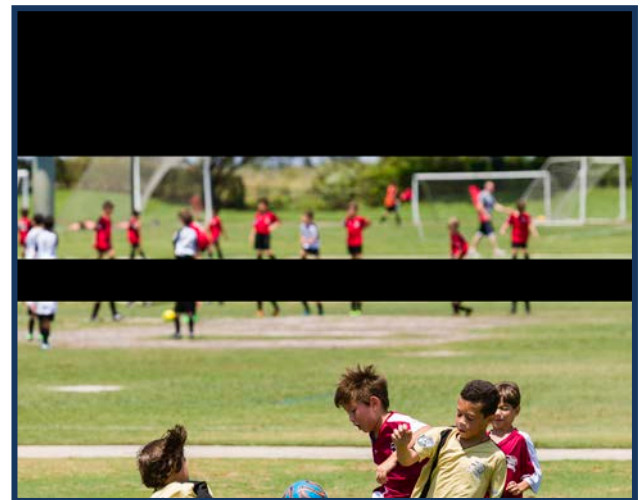

BROWARD SHERIFF'S OFFICE CRIME STOPPERS UNIT NEEDS YOUR HELP



Do you have information regarding a crime? You can receive up to \$1,000 in reward money and remain anonymous. If you have information regarding possible terrorist activity, up to a \$15,000 reward could be received if the information provided leads to an arrest.

Crime Stoppers also offers a reward for information leading the arrest of delinquent parents (parents who fail to make court-ordered child support payments) with outstanding arrest warrants for non-payment.

Broward County citizens have helped make BSO's Crime Stoppers Unit consistently one of the nation's top performers. That means with the help of the community, more cases are solved, arrests are made, and property is recovered.

If you have information regarding a crime, call Crime Stoppers at the number above or go to <https://www.tipsubmit.com/WebTips.aspx?AgencyID=157>. You'll be given a code number, and if your information leads to an arrest, that code number gets you the reward.

Since its 1981 inception in Broward County through May 2013, Crime Stoppers has cleared 20,792 cases and has resulted in 12,161 arrests. More than \$37 million of property and cash has been recovered and illegal drugs with street values of more than \$329 million have been seized. Crime Stoppers has paid more than \$1.6 million in reward money to area citizens who phoned with tips.

“THE COURAGE TO REMEMBER” HOLOCAUST EXHIBIT

**The exhibit will be on display
at the Broward County Main Library,
100 S. Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale
through December 29, 2014**

Broward County Commissioner Dale V.C. Holness led the ribbon cutting ceremony for “The Courage to Remember”, a historical exhibit of the Holocaust on October 30th at the Broward County Main Library.

The exhibit is being presented by the Simon Wiesenthal Center (SNCF), The French National Railway Corporation and the Foundation for California.

The exhibit features more than 200 exclusive photographs that cannot be seen anywhere else in the world, offering amazing insight into the Holocaust through four distinct themes:

1. Nazi Germany, 1933-1938
2. Moving Toward the “Final Solution,” 1939-1941
3. Annihilation in Nazi-occupied Europe, 1941-1945; and
4. Liberation, Building New Lives.

What a fun FREE thing to experience when you are out east..the Riverwalk Water Trolley!

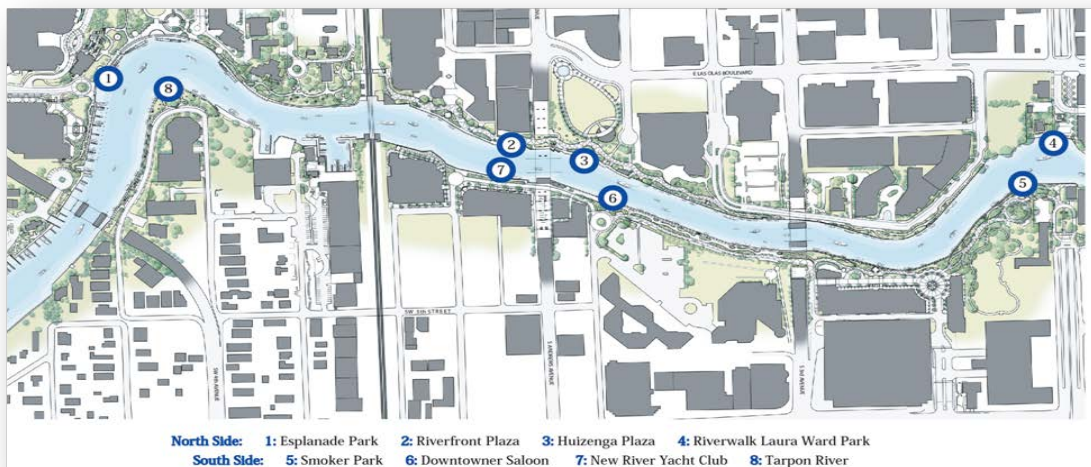
The Downtown Fort Lauderdale Transportation Management Association (DFLTMA), in partnership with the City of Fort Lauderdale and Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale, began operating the free Riverwalk Water Trolley in October.

The one-year Riverwalk Water Trolley pilot program offers residents, working professionals and tourists free connectivity across the New River.

The Riverwalk Water Trolley, with seating for 48 passengers, is wheelchair accessible, offers bike stows and operates on an environmentally-friendly diesel electric engine. The Water Trolley is estimated to stop at each location every 20 to 30 minutes and will maintain a zig-zag route making it possible to cross the river in less than five minutes. BROWARD COUNTY ANIMAL CARE AND ADOPTION Vaccinations and County Pet Registration



Keep your furry friend healthy and happy by keeping the vaccinations including rabies and pet registration up to date with your veterinarian and Broward County.

Rabies is a viral disease that causes acute inflammation of the brain in humans and other warm-blooded animals.

This disease is responsible for approximately 26,000 to 55,000 deaths in animals worldwide per year.

Every year, dogs and cats should be revaccinated regardless if they are indoor or outdoor pets.



The cost for one-year rabies vaccination and Broward County Registration Tag is \$25 for dogs and cats that are spayed/neutered; and \$35 for pets that are not spayed or neutered.

You must be a Broward County resident to participate in any upcoming vaccination/registration clinics.

Remember, there is now a \$600 fine for pets that are not vaccinated against rabies and registered with the county.

TAKE 3 STEPS TO FIGHT THE FLU

Officials at the Florida Department of Health in Broward County are advising the public to take precautionary measures against influenza (flu). The flu is a contagious disease, caused by the influenza virus, and spreads to others when infected persons cough, sneeze or talk.

TAKE 3 Steps to FIGHT the FLU

1 Get vaccinated
A yearly seasonal flu vaccine is an important step in protecting against seasonal flu.

2 Take everyday actions
Wash your hands often
with soap and water or use alcohol-based hand cleaners.
Cover your cough or sneeze into your sleeve or a tissue.
Toss the tissue in the trash after you use it.
Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
Germs spread this way.
Avoid contact with sick people.

3 Take antiviral medicine, if recommended
Stay at home if you are sick and take antiviral medicine if recommended by your health care provider.

Common symptoms of the flu include: Fever (usually high), headache, extreme tiredness, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea, (much more common among children than adults).

With Thanksgiving and the winter holiday travel season upon us, Broward Sheriff's Office would like to remind all travelers of a few very valuable safety tips, which if followed, will ensure all a healthy, and hassle free voyage, be it by air, land or sea.

When traveling by air:



- Call ahead of time to confirm your flight is on time.
- Arrive at the

airport at least two hours before your departure time and allow extra time for shuttle and transportation.

- For a complete list of prohibited items visit the Transportation Security Administration website at www.tsa.dot.gov. Also remember to leave all gifts unwrapped for proper inspection.
- Have your boarding pass or ticket confirmation information along with a government-issued photo ID ready to show at all security checks.

Attention all road warriors:

- Avoid driver fatigue by getting the proper rest before departing on a long road trip.
- Buckle up. It's the law, and it saves lives. Children should also be properly restrained in a car seat or booster.
- The holidays are a time to indulge. Never drive while impaired, appoint a designated driver.



For those venturing off to sea:

- Make sure your passport hasn't expired. Check it well in advance of your departure date.
- Arrive early and expect crowded parking lots.
