## PROPOSED WESTON CHARTER AMENDMENTS

**NOVEMBER 4, 2014** 

Weston residents have important choices to make in the upcoming General Election that impact your city government.

On the ballot will be seven (7) proposed City Charter Amendments. Only a majority vote by the electorate can enact a change to the City Charter.



#### SUMMARY OF PROPOSED WESTON AMENDMENTS

**Proposed Amendment #1. Delete Obsolete Language** – would give the City permission to remove references in the City Charter that are no longer relevant.

**Proposed Amendment #2. Holding of Special Elections** – would extend the time frame for special elections, such as filling of vacancies or approval of charter amendments, to up to 180 days.

**Proposed Amendment #3. City Commission Procedures Relating to Quorum and Voting** – would allow unanimous approval when less than three members of the commission are eligible to vote due to vacancy or conflicts of interest. The current City Charter requires affirmative votes of at least three members of the Commission to take action.

**Proposed Amendment #4. Initiative and Referendum** – would add exceptions to the Charter on how electors may propose ordinances to the City Commission. Consistent with state law, the proposed amendment would add the following exceptions: ordinances regarding development orders, comprehensive plan amendments or map amendments.

Proposed Amendment #5. Criteria for, and Limitations on, City Charitable Contributions – would increase the total amount of City charitable contributions from \$25,000 to \$50,000 per year.

**Proposed Amendment #6. Charter Review Board Members** – would provide that the Mayor's appointee to the Charter Review Board live in Weston. It also eliminates the requirement that a majority of the City Commission approve each appointment.

**Proposed Amendment #7. Limitation on Economic Development Incentives** – would provide that the City shall not grant economic development incentives to any person or entity unless it is part of a federal, state or county program. In addition, it must ensure that the City will recoup at least the full amount of its portion of the incentive within seven years.



## SCHOOL BOARD GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND NOVEMBER 4, 2014 GENERAL ELECTION



The School Board of Broward County approved Resolution 14-88, which has placed an \$800 Million General Obligation Bond on the November 4th ballot.

The proceeds of this bond will be utilized for capital improvements and to purchase technology for teachers and students. SMART stands for: Safety, Music & Arts, Athletics, Renovation and Technology.

To fully understand all of the complexities involved, such as what is a General Obligation Bond; what are the reasons for the bond; what will be improved; and what schools will get what improvements – the School Board has designed a website that can answer these and other questions.

### WESTON UNIVERSITY'S October FIRST CLASS AT CITY HALL WAS A SUCCESS



### **HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series**

**Cellular phones can be our best ally during a hurricane**. Yet, because wireless calls travel over airwaves to another phone, like radios, they can be obstructed by bad weather.

Residents can maximize their wireless service during an emergency situation by being prepared and following a few simple tips.

- Program all of your emergency contact numbers in your cell phone, including the police department, fire station, hospital and family members.
- Make sure everyone who needs your wireless number has it.
- Keep your wireless phone and back-up batteries charged at all times. Have an alternate plan to recharge your batteries in case of power outages. For example, you can charge with a car charger, or use a disposable cell phone battery.
- Keep extra phones and accessories in a sealed plastic bag to avoid water damage.
- If your cellular phone has a camera, utilize that feature to take and store photos of your property before and after the storm.

In addition to your household phone, make sure your cellular phone is enrolled in **CodeRED**. CodeRED is a system used by the City of Weston that allows you to receive critical in case of an emergency situation that requires immediate action. You can even opt for text message and/or email alerts to be sent straight to your cell phone!

### TURN YOUR CLOCKS BACK ONE HOUR BEFORE BED ON SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 1<sup>st</sup>

### **FALL DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME**

Don't forget that at **2** a.m. on Sunday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, you will turn your clocks back one hour, marking the end of <u>Daylight Saving Time (DST)</u>.

BSO Fire Rescue also recommends changing the batteries in your smoke alarms/detectors and carbon monoxide detectors at the same time. When those items are in working order – they save lives!

Any elderly or disabled residents who need assistance changing their smoke alarm batteries can call the Fire Department for this free service at 954-389-2015.

### **History of Daylight Saving Time**

Daylight Saving Time was instituted in the United States during World War I in order to save energy for war production by taking advantage of the later hours of daylight between April and October.

Daylight Saving Time is four weeks longer since 2007 due to the passage of the Energy Policy Act in 2005. The Act extended Daylight Saving Time by four weeks from the second Sunday of March to the first Sunday of November, with the hope that it would save 10,000 barrels of oil each day through reduced use of power by businesses during daylight hours. Unfortunately, it is exceedingly difficult to determine energy savings from Daylight Saving Time and based on a variety of factors, it is possible that little or no energy is saved by Daylight Saving Time.


