

PROPOSED WESTON CHARTER AMENDMENTS

NOVEMBER 4, 2014

Weston residents have important choices to make in the upcoming General Election that impact your city government.

On the ballot will be seven (7) proposed City Charter Amendments. Only a majority vote by the electorate can enact a change to the City Charter.



SUMMARY OF PROPOSED WESTON AMENDMENTS

Proposed Amendment #1. Delete Obsolete Language – would give the City permission to remove references in the City Charter that are no longer relevant.

Proposed Amendment #2. Holding of Special Elections – would extend the time frame for special elections, such as filling of vacancies or approval of charter amendments, to up to 180 days.

Proposed Amendment #3. City Commission Procedures Relating to Quorum and Voting – would allow unanimous approval when less than three members of the commission are eligible to vote due to vacancy or conflicts of interest. The current City Charter requires affirmative votes of at least three members of the Commission to take action.

Proposed Amendment #4. Initiative and Referendum – would add exceptions to the Charter on how electors may propose ordinances to the City Commission. Consistent with state law, the proposed amendment would add the following exceptions: ordinances regarding development orders, comprehensive plan amendments or map amendments.

Proposed Amendment #5. Criteria for, and Limitations on, City Charitable Contributions – would increase the total amount of City charitable contributions from \$25,000 to \$50,000 per year.

Proposed Amendment #6. Charter Review Board Members – would provide that the Mayor's appointee to the Charter Review Board live in Weston. It also eliminates the requirement that a majority of the City Commission approve each appointment.

Proposed Amendment #7. Limitation on Economic Development Incentives – would provide that the City shall not grant economic development incentives to any person or entity unless it is part of a federal, state or county program. In addition, it must ensure that the City will recoup at least the full amount of its portion of the incentive within seven years.



ELECTION 2014 SCHOOL BOARD GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND NOVEMBER 4, 2014 GENERAL ELECTION



The School Board of Broward County approved Resolution 14-88, which has placed an \$800 Million General Obligation Bond on the November 4th ballot.

The proceeds of this bond will be utilized for capital improvements and to purchase technology for teachers and students. SMART stands for: Safety, Music & Arts, Athletics, Renovation and Technology.

To fully understand all of the complexities involved, such as what is a General Obligation Bond; what are the reasons for the bond; what will be improved; and what schools will get what improvements – the School Board has designed a website that can answer these and other questions.

NEW BROWARD COUNTY FLOOD MAP REFLECTS CHANGES TO LOCAL FLOOD RISK

Residents and Businesses Encouraged to Maintain Flood Insurance Policy

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) recently announced the release of Weston's new flood maps that depict the current flood risk across the community. The new flood maps were developed after an extensive, multiyear study of Broward County that used state-of-the-art technologies and risk modeling techniques.

Many properties are now designated as moderate to low-risk flood areas, known as Non-Special Flood Hazard Areas. Residents in these areas who have a mortgage from a federally regulated or insured lender are no longer required by federal law to maintain flood insurance, though the lender still retains the right to require flood insurance as a condition of the loan.

While flood insurance becomes optional, maintaining coverage is recommended as the flood risk has only been reduced, *not removed*. Lower-cost flood insurance from the National Flood Insurance Program is available, including the Preferred Risk Policy (PRP) that starts at \$129 per year.

To locate your property on the new map click here: <u>Broward FEMA Flood Map</u>. The following flood zone designation determines whether or not flood insurance is mandated.

Zone A	Flood insurance rate zone determined by approximate methods, as no Base Flood Elevations (BFEs) are available for these areas. Mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements apply.
Zone AE	Flood insurance rate zone that corresponds with flood depths greater than 3 feet. Mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements apply.
Zone AH	Flood insurance rate zone that corresponds to areas of shallow flooding with average depths between 1 and 3 feet. Mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements apply.
Zone VE	Flood insurance rate zone that corresponds to coastal areas that have additional hazards associated with storm waves. Mandatory flood insurance requirements apply.
Zone X- Shaded 0.2 PCT Annual Chance Flood Hazard	Flood insurance rate zones that are outside the flood plain or the average flood depths of less than 1 foot. Flood insurance purchase is not mandatory.

Flooding is the most frequent and costly disaster in the country. The risk for flooding changes over time due to erosion, land use, weather events and other factors.

It can vary within the same neighborhood and even property to property. But flood risk is real, and it exists throughout the county.

TAKE STEPS NOW TO BE PREPARED

Tree Trimming

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series

Look out for that tree! One important aspect of preparedness is tree trimming. Downed branches can pose serious problems for your home, car, roadways and innocent bystanders.



Take the proper precautions to properly prune and trim trees on your property:

- Trim trees and shrubbery regularly by cutting weak branches and thinning foliage to decrease the chance that plants will be uprooted. Remove limbs resting on your roof.
- Do not attempt to trim any vegetation growing on or near overhead power lines.
 Only specially trained line-clearing professionals should work around power lines.
- Please refrain from trimming trees once a hurricane watch has been posted as the trimmings may become projectiles during the storm.
- Residents without experience using a chain saw should seek professional assistance, or the assistance of someone familiar with operation of the equipment.

Hiring a Tree Trimmer

Beware of unlicensed tree trimmers, who may be cheaper, but often deliver poor quality work, resulting in greater long-term costs.

- Get written estimates from different tree companies.
- Verify the company's license and insurance for property damage and personal liability. Call the insurance company to verify that the appropriate coverage is in effect.
- To verify a tree trimmer's license, call the Permitting, Licensing, and Consumer Affairs Division at 954-765-4400, option 2.



Trees are dynamic living things that require proper care. Hiring a certified arborist who can assist you with pre-storm inspections and post-storm repairs can help avoid the unnecessary loss of your trees.

FIRE PREVENTION SAFETY

Did you know?



October is Fire Prevention Safety Month. The goal of fire prevention is to educate the public to take precautions to prevent potentially harmful fires and steps to take if involved in a fire.

Below you will find fire prevention safety tips to keep in mind whether inside or outside your home.

Smoke detectors save lives

- Working smoke detectors reduce the chances of death in a fire by half.
- Nearly half of all fire survivors remember hearing their smoke alarm.
- The most common cause of smoke detector failure is missing or disconnected batteries.
- Change your batteries twice a year. The best time to change them would be when you set your clocks for time change.
- Disconnecting your batteries, for any reason, is dangerous and illegal.

Don't leave to do something else

- Remember to not leave stoves, ovens, toasters, clothing irons, barbeques and candles unattended.
- When cooking, don't place anything close to the burners that could possibly catch on fire
- Be careful when cooking with or heating up grease.

Don't play with fire

• Playing with fire can cause many unneccessary injuries. Keep matches, lighters, and fireworks out of reach for children and pets.

Stop, drop and roll

• If one's clothing catches on fire, the most effective method of extinguishing the fire is to stop, drop to the ground, and roll back and forth to smother the flame.

BROWARD SHERIFF'S OFFICE Realtor Safety Tips

Broward Sheriff's Office and the City of Weston have suggestions for realtors to take extra precautions when working independently especially when showing homes.

Please be aware of your surroundings at all times and report any danger signals below to 911 immediately:



- 2. **SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOR**. If you have any suspicions or uneasiness about a client, do not go to the showing alone, no matter what time of day. Ask another person to accompany you. If you are at an open house and you feel that you are in danger, leave the home and seek assistance.
- 3. CLIENT WANTS YOU TO RIDE WITH HIM/HER TO A PROPERTY. Always drive your own car to the property. Keep your car locked while driving and after you park it. If your client will not ride with you, make sure that the completed information form contains the client's vehicle description and license plate number. Once at the property, do not park your car where it can be blocked.
- 4. THE BUYER WANTS YOU TO LEAD THE WAY THROUGH THE HOME. Always follow prospects through the home and never let them get behind you. Your attention should be focused on the client, not the house.

SEEING FROZEN OR PIXILATED TV TRANSMISSION?

Satellite / Sun Interference May Be The Cause

Satellite/sun interference, also known as Sun Transit or Sun Outage, began for Fall 2014 on October 1, 2014. It generally continues for 10-12 days, which would last until approximately October 12th. Channels received from satellite will freeze/pixel for several minutes each afternoon. The interference will affect different satellites and transponders at different times, mostly in the afternoon.

Services Affected: Satellite received channels

(Local Broadcast channels are not affected)

Date: 10/1/14 - 10/12/14

Time: between 2pm-6pm

This happens twice a year, Spring and Fall. The interference is caused when the sun is in direct line with a communication satellite and the sun's radiation overwhelms the satellite signal.

A **sun outage**, **sun transit** or **sun fade** is an interruption in or <u>distortion</u> of <u>geostationary satellite</u> signals caused by interference from <u>solar radiation</u>. The effect is due to the sun's radiation overwhelming the satellite signal.

In the northern hemisphere, sun outages occur before the <u>March equinox</u> (February, March) and after the <u>September equinox</u> (September and October), and in the southern hemisphere the outages occur after the March equinox and before the September equinox. At these times, the apparent path of the sun across the sky takes it directly behind the line of sight between an <u>earth station</u> and a satellite. The sun radiates strongly across the entire spectrum, including the <u>microwave</u> frequencies used to communicate with satellites (<u>C-band</u>, <u>Ku band</u>, and <u>Ka band</u>), so the sun swamps the signal from the satellite. The effects of a sun outage range from partial degradation (increase in the error rate) to total destruction of the signal. The effect sweeps from north to south from approximately 20 February to 20 April, and from south to north from approximately 20 August to 20 October, affecting any specific location for less than 12 minutes a day for a few consecutive days.
