The City of Weston is pleased to once again announce receipt of the **Distinguished Budget Presentation Award**. The award is for the Fiscal Year 2015 Budget beginning October 1, 2014, and granted by the Government Finance Officers Association of the U.S. and Canada (GFOA).

This is the thirteenth consecutive year that the City has received award recognition. Congratulations to Budget Director, Bryan Cahen, Assistant City Manager/CFO David Keller and their team who prepared the annual budget pursuant to the GFOA guidelines and requirements and made the submittal on behalf of the City of Weston.


The Distinguished Budget Presentation Award is the highest form of recognition in governmental budgeting.

In order to achieve the award, the submitting entity must publish a budget document that meets the following program criteria, and the fourteen mandatory criteria within those categories:

- ✓ It must serve as a Policy Document
- ✓ It must serve as a Financial Plan
- √ It must serve as an Operations Guide
- ✓ It must serve as a Communications Device

GFOA is a non-profit profession association serving over 18,000 government finance professionals throughout North America. The GFOA's Distinguished Budget Presentation Awards Program is the only national awards program in governmental budgeting.

THE DANGERS OF FLAKKA AND OTHER SYNTHETIC DRUGS

In response to the growing epidemic of Flakka and other synthetic drugs, the Broward Sheriff's Office, in conjunction with the City of Weston, is hosting this important forum regarding the dangers of synthetic drug usage on the rise in



South Florida.

Flakka is a synthetic, highly addictive and inexpensive drug that is lethal. The drug produces symptoms that include excited delirium, agitation and paranoia.

These drugs are challenging our schools, law enforcement and the healthcare system. Over 16 deaths have been attributed to Flakka since September 2014 and it is by far the most dangerous and deadly drug in the bath salt category thus far.

Bath salts is the name given to a family of drugs that have one or more manmade chemicals related to the amphetamine-like stimulate Cathinone.

Not knowing can be deadly. Be informed.


MID-2015 EDITION OF THE WESTON VISITORS GUIDE NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE

BSO OFFERS FREE HOME WATCH PROGRAM REGISTER ONLINE TODAY

Planning a vacation or business trip this summer? The Broward Sheriff's Office offers a FREE Home Watch Program in all of its patrol areas in Weston. A BSO deputy, CSA (Community Service Aid) or COP (Citizens on Patrol volunteer) will check on your home daily for signs of break-in or suspicious activity while you are out of town.

When you are away be sure to take the following precautions:

- Let trusted friends and neighbors know that you'll be away.
- Make your home appear occupied. Attach timers to lights and television sets and set them to turn on and off at different times.
- Have your newspaper and mail held, or picked up by a friend or neighbor.
- Disconnect automatic garage door openers.
- Open some of the drapes or blinds on your windows. During daytime hours, it gives the appearance that someone is home,

and during the evening, lights inside the house are more visible.

Since inception in 2002, Christmas in July has served more than 7,500 children in Broward County. In addition to clothing, school aged children also receive school supplies for the upcoming year. Christmas in July activities culminate with a day filled with entertainment, games, food and gifts that provide homeless children, with new clothing, socks, shoes and underwear.

Please remember that only **NEW** items should be donated for a boy or girl ranging in age from **infants to 19 years old**.

Looking for a cool thing to do with your family on a hot summer night? Plan to attend the night time star gazing at the Fox Observatory inside Markham Park.



Public Viewing at the Fox Observatory

Find out what is going on in the South Florida night sky at the public viewing events hosted by the South Florida Amateur Astronomers Assocation (SFAAA) at the Fox Astronomical Observatory inside Broward County's Markham Park.

Every Saturday evening from dusk until midnight, SFAAA members will assist the public to star gaze through the observatory's high powered telescopes. The public is also welcome to bring their own, and some members do.

About the SFAAA

This nonprofit organization, which dates back to the mid-1960s, staffs the Fox Astronomical Observatory and hosts public events. Group members assist the public in how to use their own telescopes as well. The SFAAA regularly meets at the Fox Observatory on the first Tuesday of every month at 7:30 p.m. Membership is \$20 per year and new members are always welcome.
