HURRICANE SEASON UNDERWAY TAKE STEPS NOW TO BE PREPARED

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series

REGISTER NOW SPECIAL NEEDS OR VULNERABLE POPULATION

Pre-registration is required in advance for the elderly, the vulnerable, those with special needs and those who need pet shelters.

Call 3-1-1 for any hurricane registration needs.

At the 2015 Weston Disaster Preparedness Symposium on May 28th, residents received first hand information from three top leaders in their fields.

Mr. Stacy Stewart, Senior Hurricane Specialist at the National Hurricane Center in Miami: Craig Setzer, Chief Meteorologist, CBS 4, Miami and John R. Flint, Weston City Manager, who were moderated bv Emergency Response Team (CERT).

The presentation covered an array of preparedness, disaster, and response information for residents and businesses.

Mr. Stewart and Mr. Setzer are both Weston residents who were very happy to see the community interest in emergency preparedness. Both came arrived from the National Hurricane Center in Miami where President Obama had been briefed on the official forecast earlier in the day.

The good news: The 2015 Atlantic hurricane season will likely be below-normal.

The bad news: There is a 20 percent chance of an above-normal season.

The constant news: It only takes one.

The prediction provides a 70 percent likelihood of 6-11 named storms; 3-6 of which could become hurricanes; including 0-2 major hurricanes.

Supplies: Mayor Daniel Stermer mentioned to attendees that hurricane preparedness lists are readily available, including on the Weston website, but the shopping should be done now, not later. It is significantly easier to grab supplies now than when everyone is in line and supplies may run out. The first 72 is up to you – unless you have a medical emergency, you need to be prepared to be self sufficient for 72 hours.

Another suggestion was the win-win situation of donating hurricane food supplies in November to

the local Harvest Drive if we get so lucky as not to have a storm.

Weston City Manager John Flint provided an overview of how the City responds to a disaster, the policies, structures and funding that is in place, and ensured the public that everyone would be taken care of. A caveat to that, particularly in the sense of disaster debris collection, is that someone will be first and someone will be last. All main roadways will be cleared first. As for residential debris, the areas receiving attention first will be dependent upon access, the size of equipment that first responds and other factors all of which will determine the most effective and efficient response.

Mr. Flint asked attendees to take an "Adopt-A-Catch Basin" philosophy. Stressed also by Mr. Stewart, clogged catch basins can cause extensive flooding in neighborhoods. Locate the nearest one to your home and ensure there is nothing blocking it. Storm drains within gated communities are the responsibility of the Homeowners Association, but residents are encouraged to act proactively in the event of a storm and remove any debris.

WESTON CERT HOSTS REGIONAL DISASTER DRILL

preparation for the Hurricane season, Sheriff's Office Fire Broward Rescue Emergency Services (BSO) and Weston Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Regional Drill at the Weston hosted а Community Center on May 9, 2015. Members of CERT are your neighbors – ordinary men and women who have completed training, provided free of charge by BSO Fire Rescue, on disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations.





representing CERT programs from eleven different municipalities. The attendees participated in interactive presentations and drills that covered topics such as crowd control and traffic management, mass casualty incidents, and patient packaging.

The event drew over 75 participants,

During the drill, approximately a dozen "victims" presented injuries and vitals to CERT members who practiced their skills in assessing medical need levels, providing disaster first aid and transporting victims out of harm's way.

WESTON'S PARKS FIELD RENOVATIONS

Summer in Weston brings the end of the school year, final games in youth athletic leagues, and an increase in maintenance activity in City parks. Crews are preparing for a number of off season projects meant to improve park facilities for visitors.

Tequesta Trace Park is first on the list with drainage improvements on the stadium field. Built in the 1980's, Tequesta did not have the benefit of today's more sophisticated field construction design.



Crews are installing under field drain lines known as *MultiFlow*. These lines will channel water off of the field to waiting catch basins, providing for quicker drying times. **This will increase playing times while decreasing the damage done on a wet field.** This drainage system has been used with great results at Regional Park and it is a favorite of golf course superintendents.



Additional projects in the parks are coming in the months ahead:

Two soccer fields at

Weston Regional Park will be completely rebuilt with improved drainage. This is in addition to the annual summer maintenance program during which all of the soccer and football fields are re-sodded in preparation for the fall sports season.

Make sure your children get some rest this summer, because Weston parks will be ready for them to hit the fields again in September.

WESTON'S PARKS RESTROOM RENOVATIONS

A makeover in the works!

This is one of the most eagerly anticipated capital improvement projects. The renovation work should begin in mid-June. First to receive a rehab will be two of the restroom buildings in Weston Regional Park and the restroom building at Gator Run Park. Gator Run is being done over the summer to be ready for school use in August.

Weston parks are known for their top quality athletic fields, pristine maintenance and lushly landscaped beauty. Soon, the restroom facilities will match! Heavy use over many years has taken its toll. Well, help is on the way.

The inside of each building is being stripped down to the concrete block walls and completely made over with new floor and wall tiles, stall partitions, toilets and sinks, hand dryers and LED lighting fixtures. Two contemporary color palettes were selected that will be disbursed between the different restroom buildings within our city parks.

Over the next 10-12 months, the other park restrooms will receive the same treatment.

While the size of the facilities will remain the same, the transformation will be dramatic.

FULL NIGHTTIME CLOSURES ON I-75 AT MIRAMAR PARKWAY

JUNE 6TH - 8TH AND JUNE 13TH - JUNE 15TH

Due to the Phase I Demolition of the Miramar Parkway bridge over I-75, a full closure of the southbound and northbound lanes will be implemented. Traffic will be redirected through the on-off ramps of Miramar Parkway/I-75 and through the Pines Boulevards/I-75 on-off ramps and neighboring streets. Please note that the schedule may change due to inclement weather or other unexpected conditions.



Southbound Closure of I-75 (6/6 - 6/8)

- All lanes of I-75 southbound at Miramar Parkway will be closed from 11pm Saturday, June 6 to 8am Sunday, June 7. Motorists will be detoured to take the exit ramp at Miramar Parkway West, at the top of the ramp cross over Miramar Parkway, and re-enter I-75 southbound using the Miramar Parkway on-ramp.
- All lanes of I-75 southbound at Pines Boulevard will be closed from 8am Sunday, June 7 to 5am Monday, June 8. Motorists will be detoured to take the exit ramp at Pines Boulevard West, continue westbound to Dykes Road, then south on Dykes Road to Miramar Parkway and eastbound on Miramar Parkway to re-enter southbound I-75.

Northbound Closure of I-75 (6/13 - 6/15)

- All lanes of I-75 northbound at Miramar Parkway will be closed from 11pm Saturday, June 13 to 8am Sunday, June 14. Motorists will be detoured to take the exit ramp at Miramar Parkway East, at the top of the ramp cross over Miramar Parkway, and re-enter I-75 northbound using the Miramar Parkway on-ramp.
- All lanes of I-75 northbound and Miramar Parkway will be closed from 8am Sunday, June 14 to 5am Monday, June 15. Motorists will be detoured to take the exit ramp at Miramar Parkway East, continue eastbound to SW 145 Avenue, then north on SW 145 Avenue to Pines Boulevard and westbound on Pines Boulevard to re-enter northbound I-75.
