

### AWARD FOR TECHNOLOGY TRAINING



## **HURRICANE NAMES FOR THE 2015 SEASON**

Have you ever wondered how hurricanes are named?

## **HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series**



Originally, hurricanes were designated by a system of latitude-longitude, which was a great way for meteorologists to track them; however, things got very confusing once the public began receiving multiple storm warnings and wanted to follow a particular storm.

Therefore, a system of names was created to help refer to the storms, making it easier to track and remember each unique storm.

In 1953, the National Weather Service picked up on the habit of Naval meteorologists naming the storms after women. In 1979, male names were inserted to alternate with the female ones.

There are actually six lists of names in use for storms in the Atlantic. These lists rotate annually. For example, the list for this year's names will not be for reused six years, one exception: storms so devastating that reusing the name would be inappropriate.

In this case, the name is permanently removed from the list and another name replaces it. There will not be another Hurricane Andrew, because Andrew has been replaced by Alex on the list.

# HAZARDOUS WASTE AND ELECTRONICS COLLECTION EVENT IN WESTON WAS A SUCCESS!



On Sunday, May 17<sup>th</sup>, 477 customers visited the **Free Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Electronics Collection** event in Weston.

This was the second HHW and Electronics Collection event this year.

#### The statistics are impressive.

- 20,729 pounds of HHW collected May 2015
- 16,058 pounds of Electronics collected May 2015

The February and May collection events produced a total of 76,542 pounds of HHW and Electronics collected!

Thanks to these two events, over 38 tons of toxic, hazardous or electronic materials were collected, recycled or disposed of properly this year alone.

# LOOK BEFORE YOU LOCK AWARENESS CAMPAIGN TO SAVE LIVES

The "Look Before You Lock" educational campaign is a collaboration of Broward County, the Children's Services Council and the Early Learning Coalition of Broward County.

## Did you know...

Under Florida law, it is illegal to leave a child younger than 6 years old unattended or unsupervised in a motor vehicle for any period of time if the motor of the vehicle is running or the health of a child is in danger. (FSS 316.6135)

In 2013, Broward County passed an ordinance requiring all child care centers and family child care homes to install vehicles safetv alarms in carrying six or more passengers.

"Look Before You Lock," is an alert to people who transport children and run the risk of leaving them locked inside a vehicle for any length of time.

Heatstroke in vehicles is the leading cause of all non-crash-related fatalities involving children age 14 and younger. Especially vulnerable, are children age four and under because their bodies overheat more quickly.

Florida ranks 4th in the U.S. in the number of hyperthermia deaths of children in vehicles. Not surprising: even with a window rolled down a few inches, if the outside temperature is in the low 80s, as is often the case in Florida, the temperature inside a vehicle can reach deadly levels in as little as 10 minutes.

# 4<sup>th</sup> OF JULY PET SAFETY Pet owners are advised to be cautious during holiday activities



'Bombs bursting in air' make for great fun and a patriotic feeling for people, but not your pet. Your pet will likely be frightened and try to escape. The upcoming Fourth of July weekend are some of the busiest days of the year for lost pets.

It's natural to want to include your pet in activities, but the best celebration will be one where your pet is comfortable and safe.

## Five 4<sup>th</sup> of July Safety Tips for Pets:

- 1. Don't take your dogs to places where there may be fireworks; keep all pets inside the house away from fireworks and loud noises. Do not leave them out in the yard.
- 2. Keep your pet safely away from hot grills, charcoal and lighter fluid. Sunscreen, insect repellant, citronella candles and oil are also harmful to your pet.

3. Do not feed your pet "people food" or alcohol.



- 4. If your pet ingests a poisonous substance, contact your veterinarian right away or the Animal Poison Control Center at 1-888-426-4435.
- 5. Make sure your dog or cat has a Broward County Pet Registration Tag and that it wears this identification at all times. If your pet has a micro chip, make sure the chip is registered to your current address and phone number.

# FANTASTIC FIREWORKS VIEWING VENUE FOR THE 4<sup>TH</sup> AT A BROWARD COUNTY PARK!

Looking for a prime spot to enjoy the Fourth of July fireworks with your family? Look no farther than Broward County's Vista View Park in Davie.



Last year more than a thousand people did just that, taking advantage of the hilly park's status as one of the highest elevations in South Florida.

This year, fireworks viewing will be offered all evening, and depending upon weather conditions, visitors may be able to see displays from Davie, Miramar, Pembroke Pines, Plantation, Sunrise, and possibly even Fort Lauderdale and Hollywood. Most of these shows are scheduled to begin at 9PM, but you're welcome to bring lawn chairs or blankets and come early to get a good spot.

The park opens at 8AM, and the entry fee is good for admission all day; present your receipt for reentry. Admission before 7:30PM will be the park's regular weekend and holiday gate entrance fee of \$1.50/person (children 5 and under free); admission will be \$2/person at 7:30PM.

You are welcome to bring your own refreshments, although no hard liquor and no glass containers are allowed.

Parking is on a first-come, first-served basis, and no fireworks (including sparklers), grilling, or horses will be permitted in the park for this special event.

The park's shelters and playgrounds will close at 7:30PM.
