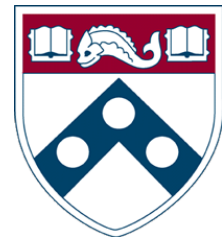
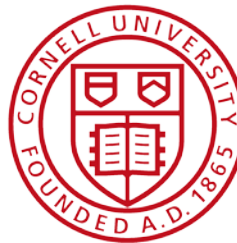
In total, the eight colleges in the Ivy League collected more than 200,000 applications from the nation's (and the world's) top-performing high school students -- and only sent acceptance letters to 11.9 percent of them. That's what we call selective.

According to U.S. News & World Report, there are five Ivy League schools among the top 10 universities in the United States. The other three Ivy league schools make the top 20. Harvard, Yale and Princeton are the perennial powerhouses, regularly swapping the top three spots in the national rankings.

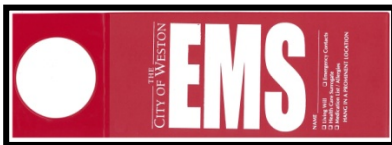


SAFE SELLING LOCATION FOR POTENTIAL ONLINE BUYERS/SELLERS
