# TRAGIC LOSS OF LIFE PRAYERS FOR FAMILY AND APPRECIATION TO COMMUNITY

It was with great sadness that Sheriff Scott Israel announced at noon on November 2, 2015 that the search for a missing 18 month old child, Vihaan Pullamsetti, came to a tragic end when his body was discovered in a nearby canal.

A massive deployment of deputies, bloodhounds, aviation units, dive rescue, mounted units, Weston CERT and hundreds of community volunteers searched the area since the boy was discovered missing from 417 Lakeview Drive in Weston at approximately 4:00 PM on November 1, 2015. Every available resource was deployed. The family was visiting friends at the time.

At the press briefing, Mayor Stermer thanked the community for their outpouring of support in the search efforts for young Vihaan. On behalf of the entire Weston community, we extend our thoughts and prayers to the family at this time.

This tragic loss is a sobering reminder that drowning is the leading cause of death for children ages 1 to 4 in Broward County. In South Florida we are surrounded by waterways, pools and other bodies of water that can easily draw the curiosity of young ones and result in tragedy.

# WESTON UNIVERSITY KICKS OFF 14<sup>TH</sup> YEAR FIRST DAY FOR CLASS OF 2016 A SUCCESS



The 14<sup>th</sup> annual Weston University Program kicked off during Florida City Government week, with 21 eager students from Cypress Bay, Sagemont and Western High Schools. The program combines classroom and hands-on sessions that give students the opportunity to learn about local governmental operations by spending one day a month submersed within the various City departments.



The first session was held at Weston City Hall on Wednesday, October 21<sup>st</sup>. The day began with an overview of the City of Weston's history and operations by City Manager, John Flint.

Next, City Attorney, Jamie Alan Cole, provided an education on ethics rules, Florida's Sunshine Law and information on the responsibilities of a City Attorney.



# WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN A WEATHER RADIO

When shopping for a NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) weather radio, look for either of the following logos:

PublicAlert ™ Devices or the NOAA All Hazards Logo



There are many brands of weather radios. It is recommended to find a receiver with one of the above logos to ensure that it meets the recommended technical standards and comes with features such as Emergency tone alerts, Specific Alert Message Encoding (SAME) technology to be able to program an area of interest for alerts, etc.




