WESTON ADOPTS LOWEST MILLAGE RATE IN BROWARD COUNTY FOR 19TH YEAR IN A ROW

Since its incorporation on September 3, 1996, the City of Weston has operated as a top-level municipal corporation, with an operational budget that is funded by the lowest millage rate in Broward County. Last month, the City Commission adopted a rate of 2.3900 mills for Fiscal Year 2016 (FY2016), October 1, 2015 – September 30, 2016. This year's millage rate is the same rate as last fiscal year. This means Weston property owners will pay \$239 for every \$100,000 of taxable value. Additionally, no assessment increases were made in the Bonaventure Development District and the Indian Trace Development District. For more details on the millage rate, click here. What Does this Mean for Weston Residents?

This year's theme for Fiscal Year 2016 is "Prepared to be Even Better". With the adoption of the millage rate and FY2016 operational budgets, the City is able to implement the following:

- Provide stability in the ad valorem millage rate for the next two years
- Maintain the current level of service for Public Safety and Fire Rescue Services
- Maintain the current level of service for Arts, Cultural and Recreation programs
- Provide for field renovations at Heron Park, Regional Park, and Tequesta Trace Park
- Install concrete walkways at Country Isles Park and Indian Trace Park
- Play equipment replacement at Emerald Estates Park
- Artificial athletic field turf installation at Regional Park and Tequesta Trace Park
- Parking lot addition at Peace Mound Park

Some of the goals for Fiscal Year 2016 are:

- Establish the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) into a fully-functioning yearround facility to manage emergency incidents and for ongoing training
- Implementation of the 2022 Strategic Value and Business Plan
- Efficient transition into the new Administrative Services Center, which now houses the Building and Code Departments, Technology Services and the EOC.
- Support the long-term goal to maintain our AAA credit rating from Moody's and Standard and Poor's, which is valuable in obtaining the most favorable interest rates and terms for the City.

AFTER THE STORM

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS - A Continuing Series

- Tune in to local media for ongoing updates and instructions.
- Check-in with family and friends by texting or using social media if phone service is down.
- Return home only when authorities indicate it is safe.
- Do not drive unless it is an emergency. Watch out for debris and downed Traffic lines. intersections power without working signals should be treated as a 4-way stop.



Yard debris may not all be picked up right away, but if properly piled, it will eventually be removed. If trash suspended, collection is regular household waste will be collected first, prior to piles of debris.

• Do what you can to prevent further damage to your property, (e.g., putting a tarp on a damaged roof), as insurance may not cover additional damage that occurs after the storm.



- Avoid walking or driving through flood waters. Just six inches of moving water can knock you down, and fast-moving water can sweep your vehicle away. Flood water may also be electrically charged from underground or downed power lines.
- Follow safely. Use generators manufacturer instructions and operate in an open area.
- Photograph the damage to your property in order to assist in filing an insurance claim. Report damage to **Broward County at**



WESTON'S BULK TRASH PICKUP SCHEDULE OCTOBER 2015

FREE Bulk Pickup occurs quarterly throughout the year. Pickup takes place on your *regularly scheduled garbage collection* day.

October 2015:

Single Family Homes and Multi-Family Units with curbside collection

On the day of your regularly scheduled garbage collection: Wednesday, October 21st; Thursday, October 22nd, or Friday, October 23rd

Multi-family units with dumpsters Saturday, October 24th

FUTURE DATES:

January 20th – 23rd

Bulk items include but are not limited to:

- Furniture, mattresses, carpets and other large household items
- Large and small appliances, such as dishwashers, laundry machines and stoves.
- Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.
- Mirrors, glass, glass top tables, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container.



NOT COLLECTED: Bulk items DO NOT include contractor-generated material, or vegetative waste (landscape materials) or household hazardous waste.

THINK BEFORE YOU TRASH – CONSIDER DONATING ITEMS:

Help those in need, keep items out of the waste stream, **and** get a tax deduction. Several national organizations will even pick-up directly from your residence.


