On Saturday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) held its Shred-A-Thon and Operation Medicine Cabinet event at the Weston District Office.

## HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

*Enjoy this fun this night while staying safe!*

Superheroes, princesses and ghouls will soon take to our streets to begin their quest for tricks or treats! Whether dressing up and trick-or-treating or attending a celebration, autumn events like Halloween can be a fun time for children and their families.

***Unfortunately, these events can also present us with numerous dangers. Here are some important safety tips:***

- ▶ According to the National Fire Protection Association, decorations are the first thing to ignite in more than 1,000 reported home fires each year. ***Make sure children know how to stop, drop and roll.***
- ▶ Provide children with flashlights to carry or incorporate glow sticks as part of their costume. When driving, drive slowly through neighborhoods and pay special attention for pedestrians.
- ▶ Make sure a trusted adult or older child accompanies younger children when trick-or-treating. Never let young children trick-or-treat alone.
- ▶ Tell children to only approach homes that are well lit, both inside and out.

- ▶ Consider organizing or attending a party at home, a school, or community center as a good alternative to trick-or-treating.
- ▶ Parents should carefully scrutinize the candy and treats children receive. Be on the lookout for choking hazards and tampering. Allow children to eat only factory wrapped treats.

By taking the time to review these safety tips with your children, Halloween will be ***spooktacularly*** safe and an enjoyable event!





## HALLOWEEN SAFETY FOR PETS IT CAN BE A SCARY TIME...

1. **No tricks, No treats:** That bowl of candy is for trick-or-treaters, not for Scruffy or Fluffy! Chocolate in all forms-especially dark or baking chocolate can be **VERY** dangerous for dogs and cats.
2. Popular Halloween plants such as pumpkins and decorative corn are considered to be relatively nontoxic, but can produce stomach upset.
3. Wires & cords from electric lights or decorations should be kept out of reach of pets.
4. Exercise caution if you chose to add a candle to your carved pumpkin. Pets can easily knock the pumpkin over.
5. Don't put your pet in a costume unless they love it - wearing one may cause undue stress. Costumes shouldn't constrict movement, hearing or impede the ability to breathe, bark or meow.
6. **All but the most social dogs/cats should be kept in a separate room away from front door during peak Halloween hours.** Too many strangers can be scary & stressful for pets. This will help with not wanting your pet to dart outside.
7. Always make sure your pet has proper identification! If your pet darts out, he or she will have ID that shows where they reside and can be returned. [Register](#) your pet today – it's the law.

## TURN YOUR CLOCKS BACK ONE HOUR BEFORE BED ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 31<sup>ST</sup>

### FALL BACK AS DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME ENDS



Hours after the ghouls and goblins are done trick or treating, it's time to set the clocks back one hour, marking the end of Daylight Saving Time.

**Before going to bed on Saturday night, turn the clocks back one hour, as the official time change happens at 2 am on Sunday, November 1<sup>st</sup>.**

Although some devices automatically adjust for the time change, don't forget to manually adjust timepieces that do not do so automatically.

This time of year, it is also recommended by BSO Fire Rescue to change the batteries in your smoke alarms/detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. When those items are in working order – they save lives!

### History of Daylight Saving Time

Daylight Saving Time was instituted in the United States during World War I in order to save energy for war production by taking advantage of the later hours of daylight between April and October.

Daylight Saving Time is four weeks longer since 2007 due to the passage of the Energy Policy Act in 2005. The Act extended Daylight Saving Time to a total of 34 weeks, from the second Sunday of March to the first Sunday of November, with the hope that it would save 10,000 barrels of oil each day through reduced use of power by businesses during daylight hours. Unfortunately, it is exceedingly difficult to determine energy savings from Daylight Saving Time.

The races are part of the accompanying Get Fit Fest, a free community event featuring dozens of fitness, health and wellness providers and more that offer information, prizes, wellness checks, demonstrations, entertainment and more. The Get Fit Fest will take place from 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM at Cypress Bay High School. You do not need to participate in a race to attend.
