

SHOULD YOU EVACUATE?

Who needs to evacuate in Broward County?

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series

Although the City of Weston is <u>not</u> in an evacuation zone; it is important to be informed of the areas that do need to evacuate and the plans in place to do so effectively.

Who needs to evacuate in Broward County?

Plan A (typically for a Category 1-2 hurricane): all residents in the area east of the Intracoastal Waterway should evacuate. Plan A evacuation zone residents may experience a storm surge 4-7 feet above sea level and winds from 74-110 miles per hour.

Plan B (typically a Category 3, 4, or 5 hurricane): all residents in the area east of U.S. 1/Federal Highway should evacuate. Plan B evacuation zone residents may experience a storm surge 7-11 feet above sea level and winds of 111 miles per hour or greater. NOTE: If you know someone living in these areas, consider offering your home as an evacuation destination.

Also, persons located in low lying areas or adjacent to tidal bodies of water should seek shelter elsewhere. All mobile home residents MUST evacuate in both Plan A and Plan B scenarios.

If you plan to evacuate outside of Broward County, leave early while the weather is still nice and be aware that roadways may be jammed and traffic slow moving.

Red Cross Hurricane Shelters typically open 4 hours after an evacuation is ordered.



Decide on a specific place-either a family or friend's home outside the evacuation area, a hotel or a shelter. **Call (866) 438-4636 for the nearest Red Cross Emergency Shelter.**

If you have a pet, take it with you. If you go to a shelter, you must be pre-registered for a pet friendly shelter for your pet to join you. Call the Humane Society of Broward County at (954) 989-3977 for more information.

SKYWARN Storm Spotters are a nationwide network of volunteers who report observations of significant weather and damage resulting from severe weather to the National Weather Service.

SKYWARN STORM SPOTTER TRAINING CLASS

The Broward County Emergency Management Division is hosting a **SKYWARN Storm Spotters** training class on Saturday, October 17th, at the Broward Emergency Operations Center (EOC), 201 NW 84 Ave., Plantation, from 10 AM to 2:30 PM.

The class is intended for those interested in becoming a Storm Spotter, or current spotters who want to sharpen their skills. Spotters play an integral role of alerting the National Weather Service and the public, to real-time severe weather.

Interested persons should be at least 18 years old and preregister by Thursday, October 15th, by emailing Robin Terrell, Broward County SKYWARN Coordinator. Attendees need to make their own lunch arrangements.

Training is required in order to become a recognized Storm Spotter. **SKYWARN** classes are ideal for amateur radio operators, Red Cross volunteers, firefighters, students or anyone who's interested and wants to serve. Classes for beginners and advanced Storm Spotters will be taught in a combined class by a meteorologist with the National Weather Service.

Storm Spotters assist in providing information to The National Weather Service that is used to send alerts to the public via television, radio, marine and weather radios, public safety agencies and other information sources that severe weather is approaching or has been sighted.

OCTOBER HEALTHY LIVING TIP

Breast Cancer Awareness Month

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. While most people are aware of breast cancer, many forget to take the steps necessary to detect the disease in its early stages. Think of this: why not invest a little bit of time beforehand, rather than having to pay with your life after the fact? Although this disease is not 100% preventable, it is best treated when detected early on.

Detection Tips from Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center

- **1.** If you are over 40, get a mammogram. Early detection of breast cancer offers the best chance for a cure.
- **2. Go digital**. Many studies show that doctors who specialize in mammography are more accurate at interpreting the images when compared to physicians with less experience. Digital scans can do a better job of detecting cancer in these women than traditional film mammography.
- 3. Know how your breasts feel normally. Your health care provider can show you how to do breast self-exams. If you notice a change in your breasts, such as a lump or swelling, skin irritation or dimpling, talk to your health care provider.
- **4. Know your risk**. If you have family members who have had breast cancer before reaching menopause, tell your doctor, as your own risk of cancer may be higher than average.

- **5. Try an online risk calculator**. The Breast Cancer Risk Assessment Tool, designed by the National Cancer Institute, is a questionnaire to help women determine their chances of developing invasive breast cancer.
- **6. Don't put off screening because of discomfort**. A mammogram should never be painful. Fear that the exam will be uncomfortable is one reason women put off scheduling a mammogram.

To reduce discomfort, try to schedule the exam after your monthly menstruation, when breast tissue is less sensitive. You may benefit by taking an over-the-counter anti-inflammatory such as ibuprofen or acetaminophen before your mammogram.

Above all, tell the mammography technologist about any discomfort you may be experiencing. They can work with you to make the experience more comfortable.

Candidates for the class should have average to above average cognitive abilities, as classes focus on teaching students skills such as perspective, self-awareness/self-regulation, problem-solving, reading non-verbal cues, understanding emotions, and conversation skills.
