REMEMBERING 9/11 A DAY OF REFLECTION, REMEMBRANCE AND SERVICE

Each year, on the anniversary of the September 11th attacks, Americans unite across the United States to reflect on the tragic events and to participate in service-oriented activities to memorialize the lives lost on that fateful day by giving back to their communities.

Remember

It has been fourteen years since the attacks of 9/11. To put time in perspective, high school students do not have first-hand remembrance of this day, in fact, most of this year's 9th graders were under one year of age on that day. Many of us remember where we were when we learned of the attacks, and recall the uncertainty and shock as the morning unfolded. The attacks



caused extensive death and destruction of the iconic World Trade Center (commonly known as the Twin Towers) in New York City and damage to the Pentagon in Washington DC. Over 3,000 lives were lost on that day, including more than 400 first responders – law enforcement and fire rescue personnel.

Reflect

The City of Weston will pay tribute to 9/11 with a moment of silence and a presentation of colors by BSO Explorers at the Commission meeting on Friday, September 11th. The meeting begins at 5:05 PM.



Volunteer

Since 2002, family members and support groups of 9/11 victims and survivors held events to honor the memory of those lost through commemorative events and service projects. In 2009, Congress established the National Day of Service and Remembrance to rekindle the spirit of patriotism and unity that followed the tragedy. WESTON UNIVERSITY HIGH SCHOOL CIVICS HAS NEVER BEEN SO MUCH FUN

IF YOU ARE AN EXCEPTIONAL JUNIOR OR SENIOR AT CYPRESS BAY, WESTERN HIGH OR SAGEMONT UPPER AND INTERESTED IN PARTICIPATING, KEEP READING.

The City's unique Weston University Program is starting its 13th year of providing select high school students with an in-depth and personalized civics education. Established in 2002, approximately 22 students, (juniors, seniors and sometime sophomores) are selected from Cypress Bay, Sagemont and Western High Schools to participate each year.

The program is a combination of classroom instruction and conversations by senior city staff; appointed and elected officials including the City Manager, City Attorney, the Mayor and other guest speakers; and hands-on exercises and field trips.

Students meet once monthly for seven months, for a full school day. Each monthly program day is at a different city department, exposing students to the operations of their municipal government and career paths in both public and private services.

CLEVELAND CLINIC FLORIDA ANNOUNCES \$302 MILLION EXPANSION

Cleveland Clinic has announced a \$302 million expansion plan for Cleveland Clinic



Florida that will include capital improvements to the Weston campus and a new clinic and ambulatory surgery center in Coral Springs.

The expansion to the main campus in Weston will include the addition of three operating suites, additional inpatient hospital beds, imaging and laboratory facilities and an expanded Emergency Department over the next three years. Additionally, general renovations will be made throughout the existing facility and additional parking will be added.

"As a destination for critical care, Cleveland Clinic Florida provides an advanced level of care for the highest acuity patients including individuals facing cancer, cardiac and neurological conditions, and those in need of organ transplant services, among others," said Wael Barsoum, MD, President of Cleveland Clinic Florida "These capital improvements support our ability to serve the growing number of patients who seek highly specialized services."

Cleveland Clinic Florida a not-for-profit, multi-specialty, academic medical center that integrates clinical and hospital care with research and education. Staffed with over 240 physicians with an expertise in 35 specialties, the medical campus is fully integrated and includes diagnostic centers, outpatient surgery and a 24-hour emergency department located in the state-of-the-art hospital. Cleveland Clinic Florida ranked third among the 66 best hospitals in the Miami-Fort Lauderdale metro area and ninth in Florida in *US News & World Report's* 2015-2016 ranking of *Best Hospitals* metro area rankings.



BACK TO SCHOOL TIPS WHAT PARENTS SHOULD KNOW ABOUT BULLYING



Bullying among children and teens is aggressive behavior that is intentional and involves an imbalance of power or strength. Usually bullying is repeated over time. Bullying can take many forms such as physical, verbal, emotional and cyber bullying.

Broward County School's Anti-Bullying Policy

The Broward County School District has a zero tolerance Anti-Bullying Policy that prohibits bullying of or by any district student or employee. It is important that parents become familiar with the policy. For more information, please contact your child's school or the Broward County School Board at 754-321-0000.

What to do if you suspect your child is being bullied:

Talk with your child. Be supportive and gather information about the situation. Report suspected bullying to your child's school. Anonymous reports can also occur by calling the school district's emergency hotline at 754-321-0911.

What parents should know about cyber bullying:

Cyber bullying occurs when children or teens use the internet, cell phones or other devices to send or post text or images intended to hurt or embarrass other children or teens. Children and teens can cyber bully each other through e-mails, social media, instant messaging, text messages, web pages, blogs or chat rooms.

Tips to help prevent cyber bullying:

- Keep your computer in easily viewable places
- Talk regularly with your child about on-line activities that he or she is involved in
- Review your child's on-line communications and monitor smart phone use including (Apps, texts, etc.)

Tips for dealing with cyber bullying that your child has experienced:

- Strongly encourage your child *not* to respond to the cyber bullying
- Do not erase the messages
- Try to identify the individual doing the cyber bullying
- Contact the police if cyber bullying involves acts such as threats of violence or harassment.


