Weston Fire Chief Promoted To Countywide Position Chief Harris Bouchillon

On June 13th, Weston District Fire Chief Harris Bouchillon assumed a new position within the Broward Sheriff's Office Department of Fire Rescue, being promoted to Assistant Chief of Operations for the department.

Chief Bouchillon's leadership has enabled Weston's Fire Rescue services to rise as a model among its peers. Chief Bouchillon directed the operations of three fire stations and over 120 professional firefighters. During his tenure, Chief Bouchillon was responsible for the City's acquisition of state-of-the-art fire and EMS vehicles, the implementation of the latest medical protocols, obtaining a coveted ISO Class 1 rating, building the CERT training program and having all of Weston's multi-family and commercial structure meet their annual fire inspection requirements. Protecting Weston's 65,734 residents, its 11 public schools in addition to private and religious schools, 11 houses of worship, 3 million square feet of commercial structures, and a 150+ bed acute care hospital and healthcare campus is a huge responsibility. Chief Bouchillon excelled at that responsibility with the greatest of expertise and professionalism, along with a great sense of humor and compassion for all whom he met.



Chief Bouchillon has also been a committed member of the community. He is a member of the Rotary Club of Weston, a Guardian Ad Litem and authored a continuing series of articles for local publications on Fire Safety and Prevention.

Weston residents have the great fortune of having Weston Assistant Chief Bruce Angier promoted to Weston District Chief to continue the tradition of excellence. While Chief Bouchillon will be greatly missed within our boundaries, all of the residents of Broward County will now benefit from his expertise and vision. Chief Bouchillon will be honored by the City Commission at the July 5, 2016 City Commission Meeting held at 7:00 p.m. at Weston City Hall.

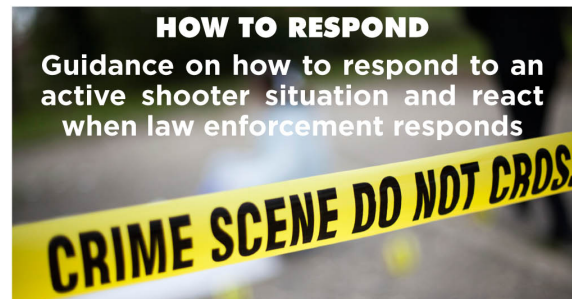

Hurricane Preparedness – A Continuing Series

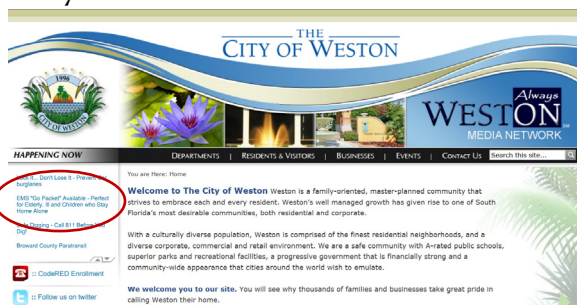
With the arrival of Hurricane Season, the City of Weston reminds residents and businesses to sign up for CodeRED to receive important emergency alerts.

What is CodeRED?

CodeRED is a high-speed telephone communication service for emergency notifications. The system allows the City to send critical communications, to all subscribers or targeted areas, for situations that require immediate action.

Registration is simple and takes only a few minutes. Visit



Westonfl.org and click on CodeRed Enrollment (circled below) and follow the prompts to input the required contact information.

Don't have a computer?

Call the Weston Communications Department at 954-385-2000.

How does CodeRED work?

CodeRED delivers a recorded message from the City of Weston describing the emergency situation and any instructions for immediate or future action. The number will display on Caller ID as **866-419-5000**. To hear the last message delivered, simply dial the number back. If you opt-in for text message or email alerts, those will also be sent simultaneously.

Already enrolled? Be sure to verify your registration. Make it part of your annual hurricane preparedness plan to log on to **CodeRED** to update phone numbers, opt in to receive text message or email alerts.

PRIVACY: Your contact information remains private and is only used for critical communications.

THIS SYSTEM WILL ONLY BE USED FOR EMERGENCY AND LIFE SAFETY PURPOSES.

The CodeRED system is used by the City of Weston to send out alerts such as drinking water contamination, extended utility outages, evacuation notice and route, missing person, fires, floods, bomb threat, hostage situation, chemical spill or gas leak, hurricane response and cleanup and other incidents where rapid and accurate notification is essential.

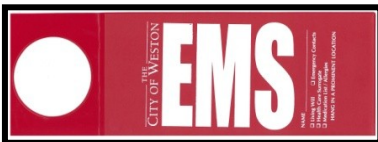
