

BSO Lt. Col. J. Polan provided a powerful key note speech leading up to the presentation of the awards. The top 5 in each category received awards. The pinnacle is the "Overall" Top Team trophy that is presented to a post for one year, with their post and year engraved on it. The award is then up for grabs at the next years' competition.

BSO Explorer Post 44 under the leadership of Deputy Kevin Maccagli, Senior Explorer Advisor, and Deputy Kari Pallotto took home the *Overall Top Team Trophy* along with 11 individual placement trophies/medals. It is quite an accomplishment for a Post that just recently began competing.

Deputies Maccagli and Pallotto are also to be commended on setting the bar in terms of hosting a competition. Each year the South Florida Council Learning For Life Law Enforcement Explorer Conference rotates between Miami-Dade and Broward County. This year's competition was hosted by BSO Weston at Cypress Bay High School during Spring Break – setting a new standard of excellence as host for the competition.

With 20 teams, scenarios are constantly underway while other teams drill or participate in team building activities. All of this takes intense coordination and cooperation of multiple agencies. This coordinated effort included the participation of Cypress Bay High School which allowed use of their facilities and 17 drama students who participated throughout the competition, utilized as "role players" in all of the various scenarios.

During the conference, the following agencies provided displays or presentations: FHP (crash cart), Florida Fish & Wildlife Commission (truck, airboat & alligator), South Miami Police Department (Field Force Equipment and demonstration of techniques), Miami-Dade Police Department (helicopter), ICE – Homeland Security-Customs & Border Patrol (Command Post, surveillance vehicle & SRT vehicle and members), recruiting units from the US Marine Corps and Miami-Dade Police Department, BSO Fire Rescue Weston, the Drug Enforcement Administration and numerous others.

The City of Weston has a very strict Tree Preservation Ordinance in place to ensure the preservation of Weston's landscaped environment and to maintain the lush tree canopy throughout the City.

# Should it stay or should it go?

Many residents are unsure if they can or cannot remove trees on their own property. City Ordinance, Chapter 122 outlines the permitting process for tree removal on private property. The Ordinance was adopted to perpetuate the protection, preservation, and conservation of existing trees, natural areas, and landscaped open space as an effective means of conserving energy and to preserve trees to improve the aesthetic quality of the City.

# PEDESTRIANS AND BICYCLISTS ALERT TONIGHT, ALIVE TOMORROW

Aimed at increasing awareness of pedestrians and bicyclists on roadways during the dark hours of dawn, dusk and at night, the Florida Department of Transportation encourages pedestrians, bicyclists and motors to be *Alert Tonight, Alive Tomorrow*. The campaign seeks to engage the public through social media and educational outreach. #AlertTonightFlorida and #CanYouSeeMeNow are popular social media hashtags meant to increase the conversation about safe practices for nighttime walkers, joggers, runners and bicyclists.

# IF YOU RIDE OR WALK IN THE DARK, REMEMBER:

- Wear bright, reflective colors.
- Carry or wear a clip-on light.
- Be visible. Use well-lit paths or routes when possible.
- Be predictable. Assume that drivers do not see you so always be aware of your surroundings.
- Bicyclists are required to use lights while riding in the dark. Turn on your front white light and red taillight and be sure your reflectors are in place (white in the front, red in the back.)
- Bicyclists should wear a helmet, (required for ages 16 and under.)

#### MOTORISTS MUST REMEMBER TO:

- Be alert. Pedestrians and bicyclists are not easily seen and may be in your blind spot.
- Avoid distractions. Focus on the road.
- Always stop on red and watch for pedestrians before making a right turn.
- Bicyclists are legal vehicles. Move over when passing.

Join AYSO 644 for the 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Weston Blast 3v3 Soccer Tournament at Weston Regional Park


